Grand Lodge Officers

M.W. Bro. Paul Edward Todd, The Grand Master

The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.



M.W. Bro. Paul E. Todd was born in Belleville, Ontario. He grew up in Trenton, Ontario and graduated from Trenton High School.

In Ottawa, he began working as an apprentice Mechanic, obtaining his Class A license. He also joined the Ontario Provincial Police Auxiliary Unit, retiring with the rank of Corporal.

Paul joined the Township of Nepean Fire Department in 1971, which is now part of the City of Ottawa Fire Services. He was awarded The Federal Fire Service Medal for Exemplary Service, by the Governor-General of Canada. The Ontario Fire Marshall also awarded him the Ontario Fire Marshall Long Service Medal. He retired as a firefighter in 2002 after thirty-one years of service.

Paul also worked part-time for Ontario Ambulance in Carleton Place Ontario leaving this position after 10 years of service.

Paul joined Masonry on April 13, 1983 at St John's Lodge No. 63, Carleton Place, becoming Worshipful Master in 1994-1995. He was elected District Deputy Grand Master 1999-2000, of Ottawa District No. 1. He served as Worshipful Master of Luxor Daylight Lodge No. 741, Ottawa District No. 2 in 2003. He was the President of the Carleton Place Temple Corporation for five years. He also served as District Chairman of Blood Donors and Masonic Education, Ottawa District No. 1.

At Grand Lodge, Paul was appointed to the Board of General Purposes in 2001, 2003 and 2005, and was elected to the Board of General Purposes in 2007 and 2009. In 2008 he was elected to the Management Committee of Grand Lodge and in 2009 he was re-elected for a further three-year term. In 2011, Paul joined the Lodge of Instruction Team, as a presenter and served for two years.

He was a member of the Grand Lodge Masonic Education Committee, where he was the Team Leader responsible for the Masonic Education Newsletter. In addition he was the Chairman of the Grand Lodge Committee of Long Range Planning and the Grand Lodge

Committee for the Condition of Masonry. Paul was then re-appointed to the Board of General Purposes and to the Management Committee as Liaison, while acting as Chairman of Condition of Masonry. He was subsequently elected to the Management Committee for a three-year term.

In addition he has served as the Grand Lodge Representative to the Amalgamation Committees in Ottawa, Cornwall, Kingston and Bath, was a founding Director of the Masonic Chip Foundation, Co-Chair of the Local Committee on Arrangements for the Especial Communication of Grand Lodge in Ottawa and has Chaired four Grand Master Receptions Committees for the Ottawa Districts. He was appointed a Director of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario for six years as Chairman responsible for the webpage and for approval of Masonic Foundation District projects.

Paul was elected Deputy Grand Master of The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario in July of 2015 for a two year term. In 2017 was elected the Grand Master of The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario. He also became a member of the Royal Order of Scotland in the same year.



the Lodge can provide, get an application to me to forward to Grand Lodge. At Grand Lodge it will get very quick action, as the committee quickly meets by telephone. Do not sit on applications.

I again continue to stress the need to be continuously alert for potential cases for assistance, i.e., if a lodge is paying the dues for a Brother, (which they should), does this Brother need further assistance. I feel there are many situations that are never brought to the light of the lodge benevolent committee, MOSTLY BECAUSE OF FALSE PRIDE OF THOSE IN NEED. We must always be very vigilant for those in need.

All Lodges do well in taking care of those that they know need help. But all Lodges have trouble to get potential recipients to answer the very personal information required, therefore in most cases it becomes a last resort to apply to Grand Lodge. This is unfortunate, as great care is taken to protect the applicant's information; it is used by the committee at Grand Lodge to confirm the level of help required. Therefore I CONTINUE TO STRESS the need to maintain a high level of CONFIDENTIALITY when Dealing with Benevolence. I am always willing to give guidance and assistance to anyone.

- · Highlighting of news articles in the community that relate to District activities and special events


ongoing activities

Throughout the year, efforts were focused on the ongoing maintenance of the website, including changes to the Trestle Board and District and Lodge events (within both the online District calendar, as well as the Special Events section of the website), updates to Masonic publications, additions to the photo gallery, and highlighting of news/events. This year, the DDGM has also been active with social media posts that highlight ongoing activities across the District, which has received positive feedback as a way of maintaining current communications with brethren across the District. Awareness was raised this year towards the privacy implications of posting images or content on public





R.W. Bro. Brian Adams provided this summary report of his activities during Masonic Year 2017-18.

My first meeting of the new year was with the Grand Master (GM) in Napanee Ontario on August 3rd. We started out the District year with a District Meeting August 24th right after returning from Grand Lodge (GL).

In September I did 9 Fraternal visits to various Lodges in my District. In October, I attended two GL workshops in Ottawa, made a Fraternal Visit to St. Francis Lodge in Smith Falls with the GM, had my first official visit, and attended the GM Homecoming Dinner. I had two more District Deputy (DD) Nights, an event in District Two, a Pig Roast, a study circle, a visit to the Prince Hall Lodge and the presentation of a Very Worshipful apron to a new GL officer.

In November we held our District Divine Service, did a visit with the GM to Prescott, three more DD nights, Remembrance Day at the Perley Hospital, a Daughters of the Nile luncheon and a Demolay Appreciation Night.

In December there were five Christmas dinners with Lodges, a visit with the GM to Brockville for the presentation of a 60yr pin and also a presentation with the GM in Almonte for a 50yr pin.

January started out with the Mid-Term meetings in Pickering, a meeting with the Valentines Charity Ball Committee and the winter District Meeting. This was followed by a DD night, three degree nights, a Robbie Burns Dinner and a Burns Supper with the GM in Pembroke. There was also a Ontario Masons Association dinner.

In February there were two DD nights, 5 degree nights, a Robbie Burns night and the Valentine Charity Ball night (our major charity event for the District).

In March there were two DD nights, four other Lodge nights (one to District Two), a degree, a curling bonspiel and another trip to the Prince Hall Lodge. Also, a Masonic Memorial Service (MMS).

In April I had three DD nights, two MMS's, a Fraternal Visit with the GM in Renfrew, the District Divine Service for Ottawa Two, a six Lodges meeting and our Spring District Meeting.

In May there were six installations, my last DD night, three Eastern Tour nights, the Arctic Char Dinner at my Mother Lodge (Carleton Lodge, Carp), a dinner with Goodwood Lodge, a MMS and a meeting with the Masonic Board of Relief.

In June there four installations that I attended, an extra one at True Britons in Perth with the GM, the Sussex Lodge 200th dinner with the GM and the Quarry Lodge in Spencerville.

The highlight of my year was my DD night in my Mother Lodge when I had all four DD's from Eastern Ontario, a DD from the Grand Lodge of Quebec and GL officers from Prince Hall Masons. Truly an historic night!

District F2F (Friend to Friend) and Mentorship - W. Bro. Shawn Todd

Friend to Friend Program – District Chairman Report V. W. Bro. Shawn Todd

The Friend to Friend (FTF) program is a Grand Lodge of Ontario Masonic Program that is built around the premise of a Lodge holding this event to educate close friends, associates, and family about Masonry. The event is typically held on it's own, has a structure of having several speakers, invited guests, and a dedicated evening. It is not a recruitment event, and it is not a pizza night. There is a balance of showing off Lodge resources, combined with attracting new and possible good candidates for Lodge, educating them on who we are, and ultimately allowing them to make their own decision to ask further about Masonry if inclined.

The aim of this program is:

- To allow friends, relatives, co-workers, neighbours, associates and men of high quality and good morals an opportunity to learn about Freemasonry in a night where 'they' are the focus and guest.
- To create a high quality event that will show off the tenants and qualities of your Lodge involving many of the Brethren and Past Masters (Teamwork and Lodge Morale Building/Interest Rejuvenation).
- To potentially create stronger membership (Quality candidates may be interested after such an event.

Goal For This Year

The goal for this year was to build a support program, within the District, which would encourage the holding of at least five or six FTF programs. This would be an improvement in participation of this program in this District – as it has been underutilized in the past. Here are the goals I sent to R. W. Bro. Brian Adams at the beginning of my year as District Chairman;

- o To encourage the lodges to each run a FTF night according the to the Grand Lodge (GL) program.
- o To track the amount of participation and results (friends attending, new applications, etc.) to provide to GL.
- o To hold an online meeting for all of the Masters / or their FTF representatives to be able to explain the program and benefits if plugging it into their own schedule.

o To provide a copy of the GL FTF program, as well as my own comments – on what has worked, and what hasn't worked to each Lodge in the District.

Steps taken from Aug 2017 - Aug 2018

At this time we have achieved all of our pre-set goals for the year, and the majority of the time can be spent tracking, and supporting the District Lodges. Here is an outline of what has been achieved.

- Masters of the 2018 year were all contacted and provided the FTF program details.
- Masters of the 2018 year were provided a full copy of:
 - An email at could be sent out to the Lodge Officers/Brethren;
 - An example of an agenda;
 - An example of speakers that could be used;
 - Suggestions of how to hold the event and why.
 - Met with the Masters of the year along with R. W. Bro. Adam Thompson for a District Discussion on programs.
 - Held a conference call for all Masters to discuss concerns/ideas/goal setting.
 - Meeting with Masters of Ottawa 1 District re FTF setup and program questions (7 attended and 4 commitments to hold program in 2018/2019).

A majority of the ground was covered in the first half of the year – and all Lodges were informed and educated in the manner as noted above.

Some of the challenges in the last half of the year faced were:

- Some Lodges backed out of their commitment to conduct the FTF night;
- Some Lodges simply ran out of time (the year got busy);
- \bullet Some Lodges did not feel prepared to go forward and wanted to extend their interest into 2018/2019.

Out of District Interest

On July 16th, I attended Westport, Ontario and met with 12 members of Frontenac District for a 90 minute FTF seminar at a local restaurant. There were three different Lodges in attendance, armed with a variety of questions. I was given the impression that these Lodges would be attempting to hold a FTF night of their own in the coming 2018/2019 year.

Feedback from meeting:

- Enjoyed the material, and the FTF program was seen as a great way to increase membership, revitalize current members through participation, and attract better, stronger candidates.
- Some of the small Lodges in this Frontenac District experience issues as the Lodges are very small, and the population they are drawing from is smaller in comparison to city Lodges.

District 1 - Meeting with Masters

On July 30th – I attended an Ottawa 1 District Meeting – with 7 members of Ottawa District

1 (incl DDGM) and held a 90-minute seminar on FTF and on Mentor programs. There were four different lodges in attendance, and they also had a great deal of good questions. I presented a FTF and the Mentor slideshow and that went over well. Good feedback was given, and the four Lodges all agreed to hold a FTF meeting this 2018/2019 year. I brought the new Ottawa 1 District FTF/Mentor Chair with me and introduced them to W. Bro. Corey Snow (St. John's Lodge, No. 63).

Feedback from meeting:

- Members present were polled on biggest issues and threats to Lodge. Results:
 - o Declining membership;
 - o Less and less participation from senior members;
 - o Lodges need revitalizing / more energy;
- o Increasing dues.
- Enjoyed FTF and Mentor program material. All present agreed that FTF was an excellent way to solve lodge issues presented.
- Need: better communication. All agreed that getting FTF and Mentor information to them prior to September was vital in ensuring that they would use the program.
- They all agreed that they liked the format that I used / and that the relaxed presentation style was good in getting the information across.

Challenges

Some of the challenges with this program are and have been:

- (a) What is it? Many members are unaware of what this program is, how it is used, and what it is supposed to look like. Many in all areas of the Masonic network are unsure if it's just a pizza night with people coming to the lodge, or how it differs from an open house format. It is challenged by members understanding the 'why' of the program and why it is in the line up of District Programs.
- (b) Timeline. The program is challenged due to Masters taking over in the summer and the program being discussed only at that time. In some Lodges the FTF program chairman had not yet been appointed, as they may have not had one previously. In other Lodges it has taken several months to have the Lodge discuss, and potentially decide to use the FTF program. If we are lucky then we will be able to support a Lodge enough to have a program event held sometime between mid-year and end of year.

Recommendations

- Improve the understanding of what FTF night is.
- Perhaps hold a district wide solo FTF night for the purpose of educating on this valuable program.
- Collaborate with other Districts in the Province what experience they have had and how to improve.
- Ensure that any FTF programs that are held follow the program, and the 'why' is not lost.
- Lodges need to plan early and have the FTF program off the ground and in early planning stages by Oct 1 in order to have a successful event by the spring.

Steps Provided to all Lodges - to assist in getting the FTF program started

Next steps:

- a. Set a potential date for your Lodge.
- b. Ask for GL Dispensation for the event.
- c. Ensure the event is announced in the Summons.
- d. Create an email invite and a letter invite and send out.
- e. Challenge your Officers to bring one person. This is the easiest part to ensure success. Every Officer will know someone that has qualities of a good man, and lives in a 'Masonic' way. When I ran mine I set the tone early by bringing one of my friends, and the rest of the Officer team followed suit with the challenge. We had over a dozen non-masons attend.
- f. Ask three well-liked speakers of varying experience to speak about one of several topics. Three 5-10 min topics is plenty. These could be (pick three):
 - 1. History of Freemasonry;
 - 2. The Lodge Room;
 - 3. VOTSL:
 - 4. Symbols in Freemasonry;
 - 5. Famous Freemasons:
 - 6. Explanation of the Titles and Jewels in Freemasonry;
 - 7. Explanation of the Aprons.
- g. Set an agenda and print out copies for the night and email to Lodge members (to boost attendance).
- h. Start showing this event off on Social Media Use Twitter, Facebook, etc.
- i. Event night track how many attended. How many non-masons, how many Masons?
 - 1. Event night suggestions:
 - i. Invite out Past Masters to be able to meet new non-masons and talk about their experiences;
 - ii. Set up tables with Lodge paraphernalia on display;
 - iii. Ask Lodge members business casual;
 - iv. Ask Lodge members no ranks or aprons (display only);
 - v. Plan on 45-60 minutes in Lodge room or speaking area for talks, and then a casual meeting area for coffee, drinks, light snacks and discussion;
 - vi. Having more than a dozen lodge members in attendance to ensure the 'tone' is right;
 - vii. Invite out the Shrine, the York Rite members, etc. to be able to show off their paraphernalia and discuss if of interest (after the lectures) and over coffee.
- j. This FTF night will plant the seeds, which may inspire an application. Keep in mind, a successful FTF night doesn't mean an application comes the next day. It may take some time for the right person to come back and 'ask'. My experience in six years of the program running is it yields about one to three candidates a year. These are generally excellent candidates as they have come from friends and associates of the Lodge members.

In conclusion, another good year in the books for the FTF program in Ottawa District 1. With continued enthusiasm and vigor, the area continues to support growth through this

Grand Lodge of Ontario program. Continued use of this program will ensure Ottawa District 1 is strong for many years to come.

Final Report – Fraternal Visitation by Bro. Abraham R. Garcia

April 25, 2018

Duties of the District Fraternal Visitation Chairman
Article 7 Section 12 of the Ottawa District 1 By-Laws states that
the duties of the Fraternal Visiting Committee are:

a. to encourage lodges to regularly visit other lodges within the District, among neighbouring Districts and other jurisdictions.

b. to oversee the use of the "Traveling Gavel".

c. to assist individual Masters in arranging lodge visits.

Within Ottawa District 1, in coordination with the DDGM and the Masters of the year, I arranged the schedule of the Travelling

Gavel and oversaw its exchange of hands. I have announced upcoming meetings like the DDGM's Official Visit, Travelling Gavel nights and other District Events to lodges I've attended and posted some announcements via social media i.e. Facebook.

Report on the Visitation (DDGM and Travelling Gavel nights)

Visitation is alive and well within our District. Thirteen of the fifteen Lodges in Ottawa District 1 have had the official visit of the District Deputy Grand Master. The two that are still missing are Carleton Lodge (the DDGM's Mother Lodge) and Russell Lodge, which had to reschedule due to weather and a power outage. At the same time, the Travelling Gavel has exchanged hands 13 times around the District. I would like to thank V.W. Bros. Glen Simpson and Kevin Zeigler and W. Bros. Glenn Gariepy and Ivan Harris for providing me copies of the Tyler's Registry of their respective lodges.

From the numbers I was able to gather, the largest reception of the DDGM for the 2017-2018 Masonic Year was at Edinburgh Lodge on March 7, 2018. It was attended by 47 visitors. Acacia Lodge brought a delegation with perfect number and there was a number of brethren from outside our Jurisdiction. The next biggest reception of the DDGM was on February 13, 2018 at Civil Service Lodge. 44 visitors were in attendance. Doric Lodge brought a delegation of 9 members.

As for the Travelling Gavel, the greatest reception for the 2017-2018 Masonic Year was at Hazeldean Lodge on February 21, 2018. It was attended by 22 visitors. Doric Lodge delivered the gavel with a delegation of 12 members. The next biggest reception of the Travelling Gavel was a tie between St. Andrew's on November 2, 2017, where Acacia came with a delegation of 10 members; and Russell Lodge on November 20, 2017, where Goodwood also attended with a delegation of 10 brethren.

Overall, the most travelled brethren have been from Doric represented by 54 appearances, followed by Acacia with 40 visits. Edinburgh Lodge has received 60 visitors from the combined DDGM and Travelling Gavel nights followed by Civil Service Lodge with 52 guests.

This year was a good Masonic Year under the leadership of our DDGM, Rt. W. Bro. Brian Adams. He travelled extensively and conveyed a consistent message of enthusiasm for our fraternity, and showed support for all of the Lodges in our District.

Although this seems to be a very general statement, it is actually what is needed, as most Lodges are facing challenges either through financial pressures, membership decline, or officer progression.

It is quite easy to say that a Lodge should just put together a Five Year Plan will map out everything from financial expenditures and fundraising, to officer progression, membership

growth and sustainability. This said, we all face certain hurdles when the Grand Lodge Above takes a member, illness changes a life, or a professional avocation requires more of a brother's time than expected, or even a relocation of residence in life.

Some may choose to disagree with my statements, but there are strong facts that say otherwise.

Research undertaken by Rt. W. Bro. John Forster, Past District Deputy Grand Master of Ottawa District two, and current WM of St. Andrews Lodge (again) gives us the following statistics:

Membership Size of Ottawa District 1 (same number of lodges)

In 1973 - 3,017

in 1980 - 2,612

In 1990 - 2,086

In 2000 - 1,618

In 2010 - 1.291

In 2016 - 1,140

AVERAGE LODGE SIZE in 1973 was 201, in 2016 it was 76

The numbers in Ottawa 2 district show a similar decline: from 3091 in 1973 to 814 in 2016.

Ottawa 2 has 1 fewer lodges with average lodge size of 206 in 1973 and 68 in 2016. If you were to chart this out in using a line graph, it would show Freemasonry disappearing in Ottawa slightly before 2028 – only 10 years away.

I believe that the reality is that our membership will level off to a number of several hundred, instead of disappearing completely. With this notion in mind, we, as the current leaders of our Masonic community, have to do two things:

- 1) We should make all efforts to combat this declination of membership by putting extra efforts into our Lodges. This will not be the same format for every Lodge, as we all have our distinctive traditions that we like. However, I think it wise to examine alternative or other ways of doing business. There are excellent programs that Grand Lodge has created that very well could help a lodge. Simple programs and principles such as the Friend to Friend, Brother to Brother, and others, that can help stimulate a brother into remaining active and growing as a brother and in his Lodge. Brethren, we need to look at this the status quo for every Lodge –is not sustainable.
- 2) The second thing we have to prepare for is the possibility of a change in our Masonic landscape. There are some lodges that are struggling, and barely hanging on as viable Lodges. Thought should be given to the future look at whether the Lodge can regrow, or if the dynamics of the membership dictate that this is a high improbability, then maybe it is time to strengthen what we have now through measures such as amalgamation or darkness.

It might seem to be a contradiction to call amalgamating Lodges a strengthening measure, because where we have two lodges, we would now only have one. But we have to wonder if this solves the problem of finances, officer progression, etc. A renewed spirit of growth and happiness might be the result when brothers attend a regular meeting with all the offices full, and many members sitting on the side benches. We do come to these meetings to enjoy the bonds of friendship – more friends is better!

Similarly, going into darkness can be a positive, as it releases brothers to join any lodge of their choosing, and thus enjoy a fresh new start in Masonry without any of the hurdles that may arise from an amalgamated process.

My comments may seem negative, or over-reactive. Even mis-directed or uncalled for. I am not trying to disrupt or criticize any Lodge on its performances. I refer my opinions to statistics that Rt. W. Bro. Forster gathered, and like it or not, numbers do not lie.

Taking only figures from the year 2000, of our 15 Lodges left in Ottawa District 1, only three have a moderate increase in numbers, and two being very recent. These statistics do not account for members who belong to more than one lodge – this is important as it has the effect of falsely padding the overall total number.

The biggest problem for all Lodges is retention. We can, and most have, initiated new members. But sometimes we lose them within a short time. This is an issues that has to be

addressed – and this can be done through the assistance of the Grand Lodge programs that were earlier referred to, and by our own good efforts.

Our Grand Master recognizes our challenges and dilemmas. He has genuine concerns for the status of our craft, which in turn, directly relates to all of us. M. W. Bro. Todd requested that a meeting be held consisting of the current DDGMs of Ottawa Districts 1 & 2, their Secretaries, near future DDGM candidates, and Long Range Planning Chairmen. This focus of this meeting was to recognize the declination of the membership, and try to react to this in the most positive ways.

M. W. Bro. Todd stressed that any and all new initiatives must come from the Districts themselves, that Grand Lodge would not be dictating any terms or re-alignments, amalgamations, or closings. Any ideas such as this must come from the brethren – it is OUR destiny for US to shape.

There were discussions of amalgamations with lodges who were struggling. There were discussions of re-aligning the Districts – and this also included possible negotiations with neighboring Districts.

A lot of ideas were put on the table. Some for awareness. Some for discussion. It MUST be made clear at this point that NO resolutions were made at this point. NOTHING is going to be forced upon the Brethren and the individual Lodges. However, we are at a stage where we must look at the likelihood that we will have to make changes in the near future. It is simple good business practice to be proactive, and not reactive. If changes are to be made, they should be made from a position of self-authority and assurance, not from moments of desperation.

The meeting recommended that a Notice of Motion be made at both District Meetings. This motion, to be made by Rt. W. Bro. Forster, and agreed to by those in attendance, that he "will move or cause to be move that provisional plans for the possible future realignment of the Districts in Eastern Ontario".

To make this clear, this motion is to set in motion that a committee be struck consisting of members from both Ottawa Districts, Eastern, St. Laurence and Frontenac Districts to discuss any re-alignments in membership. It is recognized that this may well not be implemented for several years. The whole premise is recognizing that while we are not in a situation of desperation, we are in a time of membership decline. We need to work on salvage and growth for our Lodges immediately. And we have to recognize that we might just have to accept that there could be changes in our local Masonic Landscape.

Rt. W. Bro. Brian Adams, thank you for the opportunity to be on this committee. We have a fantastic fraternity, and I hope that the efforts of those involved in this committee, and of all the committees, will see Freemasonry survive and grow for the future. Our future, and that of our successors.

Masonic Education in District 1 for the 2017-2018 Masonic Year continued in a pattern similar to past years. This Masonic Year will end with a seminar on the Ceremony of Installation and Investiture of Officers. This seminar is to be held at the Westboro Masonic Temple, on April 28. At present the seminar will have good representation from four lodges with several others who have not confirmed but expressed an interest. The seminar will review the Ceremony of Installation and an open discussion with the emphasis on answering any questions that may arise. An information package consisting of the relevant material from the Grand Lodge website (forms, booklets, etc) will be provided to each attendee as well as

electronic copies.

As Chairman, I received occasional inquiries related to various topics such as Masonic Education, sources for masonic discussion and Masonic history. Some lodges also shared their Masonic education material for the benefit of the craft. There were no common themes to the inquiries. - Our patients, which we must remember are just children, come from various provinces across Canada, the NE USA and due to our special knowledge of OI, are now coming from around the world
- And most importantly we had some 20 patients from our Tunis jurisdiction who were treated at our hospital this past year!

- Invocation given by Bro. Christian Brydges District Chaplain.

- Invocation was given by Bro. Christian Brydges District Chaplain.
- Reading of Meeting Minutes of August 24, 2017 and July 19, 2017. The minutes were voted on and adopted as amended. Moved by W. Bro. Ivan Harris, seconded by W. Bro. Jeff Christie.
- DDGM welcoming remarks: R.W. Bro. Brian Adams welcomed all. He mentioned his recent travels to the Mid-Winter meeting in Pickering Ontario. He also talked about his upcoming travels. The official visit to Acacia Lodge, Grand Masters reception in Pembroke, Edinburgh's Robbie Burns Night and to visit Goodwood and Hazeldean lodges for degrees. And the OMA winter assembly.

- June 8th is the deadline for the special room rate at Grand Lodge and it is online registration.
- The tickets for the Grand Masters dinner on the Wednesday will be available through the DDGM or the District secretary. They are \$70.00 ea.
- **Notes from the Grand Custodian**. If a Past Master is going through again, he should be wearing his MM apron when he is sitting in the SW's chair, even if he is a past Grand Lodge Officer. You also need to reinvest a Past WM if he is going in as the IPM.
- Full memorization of the work is a requirement. Under extenuating circumstances, the deacon can whisper the words to help.
- There is no sign of Fidelity given for a moment of silence for a brother, only when we say, "let us pray".
- Nothing goes on the VOSL except the Square and Compass except another book during the Obligation.
- When there is an amalgamation of two Lodges, the warrant of the Lodge that people are moving to gets a seal to go on it from Grand Lodge. The officers will need to be re-elected and re-installed and the ceremony for such comes from the Grand Master.

General Information:

- Grand Lodge is considering changes to the Past Masters course.
- Grand Lodge is considering merging some districts. This could be a future discussion for our district as District Two is now down to 12 lodges and could even go lower. Grand Lodge will not be mandating this, it will result from discussion amongst the districts involved.
- There was a discussion of the possibility of a two year term for DDGM's. This will not likely be happening this year. Ideas to help this that were discussed were the possibility of having your successor assist doing some of the work in the second year. EG: attending Installations, Masonic services or degrees.






