

Finally, I would like to thank all the Lodge Secretaries who provided me with copies of their summonses, and in some cases, minutes and photos. This enabled me to compile a summary of individual Lodge events throughout the 2019-20 Masonic Year.

This year, I included the messages from the Worshipful Masters of each Lodge - taken from the monthly summonses. In reviewing the Masters Message each month I realized that there was considerable additional information about Lodge activities that wasn't captured from a list of events performed by the Lodge at the meetings. The Master's Message not only contained elaborated information about what the Lodge did during the meetings, but also activities that were undertaken outside the Lodge; in the community at large and within the Masonic Family. I thought this expanded upon what Freemasons do in their public and private avocations and how they try to live up to the Masonic Principles that form the basis of the Fraternity.

I would also like to mention that this summary represents only "the tip of the iceberg" with respect to the number of events which took place in Ottawa District One this Masonic Year. For additional information I would refer the readers to the Ottawa Freemasons Facebook Page (https://www.facebook.com/groups/12593948443/) which has numerous posts by individual Brethren, and individual Lodge's, regarding the activities that were undertaken between July 2019 and June 2020.



Due to an unprecedented event, the outbreak of the Coronavirus/Covid-19, in Ontario during March 2020, the Grand Master, M.W. Bro. David Cameron issued three directives to Lodges in Ontario. These directives were dated March 13th and 16th 2020 and again on May 13, 2020. In the letters to the Lodges M.W. Bro. Cameron suspended meetings, or gatherings, of Masons for an indefinite period - at least until the virus is contained or eliminated. Further updates were issued on April 2nd, 8th, 20th, and 27th, 2020 and again on May 13th, 21st and 29th, 2020 by the Grand Secretary, M.W. Bro. D. Garry Dowling.

The Grand Secretary's Update of May 29, 2020 advised and confirmed that Grand Lodge Proceedings for July 2020 were cancelled.

As a result, Lodge meetings in District One did not occur after March 16, 2020. Lodge Meetings did not recommence during this Masonic Year (2019-2020).

M.W. Bro. David James Cameron, The Grand Master

The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.



M.W. Bro. David James Cameron was born and raised in London, Ontario and attended the University of Western Ontario.

His wife, Jill, also grew up in London. They lived in Toronto for several years but when their son, James, was born they moved closer to home, settling in Waterloo, and Dr. Cameron took up a family medicine practice in New Hamburg.

M.W. Bro. Cameron was initiated into Freemasonry in Grand River Lodge No. 151 Kitchener-Waterloo in 1991. As Junior Warden he brought Masonic Education to every meeting by linking the food served to an educational topic. He became Worshipful Master in 2001. A charter member of Templum Lucis Lodge No. 747, Stratford

- the province's second Observant lodge, he has been honoured with memberships in Centennial No. 684 and St. John's No. 20, and is also a member of Heritage Lodge No. 730. M.W. Bro. Cameron is a 33° Scottish Rite Mason and a member of the Royal Arch, Allied Masonic Degrees, Royal and Select Masters, Shriners and the Royal Order of Scotland. He is a Fellow of the College of Freemasonry.

He was appointed Assistant Grand Chaplain in 2005 and elected to the Board of General Purposes in 2007. He has served as Chair of Masonic Education, Lodge Resources, and the Management Committee, and has been a Director of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario. He has spoken at Masonic events in Canada, the United States and Europe, including the 14th World Conference of Regular Masonic Grand Lodges. M.W. Bro. Cameron was installed as Grand Master in July 2019.

Was Chairman of Masonic Education and the Condition of Masonry Committees.

Appointed Custodian of the Work by the Ritual Committee on July 19, 2007. Reappointed July 2018.

Appointed Member of the Grand Lodge Awards Committee 2018.

Grand Representative to the Grand Lodge of Ireland.

Member of the Ottawa Lodge of Perfection, Murray Chapter of Rose Croix and Past Commander in Chief of Ottawa Consistory of The Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of Canada. Coroneted an Honorary Inspector General 33 degree in September, 2002.

Member of the Royal Order of Scotland.

Honorary Past First Principle, Carleton Chapter No. 16, Royal Arch Masons, Ottawa. Appointed Grand Senior Sojourner, April 2005. Member of Ottawa Chapter of Royal Arch Masons.

Has also been a long time volunteer with Queenswood Public School. Served as a volunteer leader with the Victims Services Unit of the Cumberland Detachment of the O.P.P.

M.W. Bro. Paul E. Todd was born in Belleville, Ontario. He grew up in Trenton, Ontario and graduated from Trenton High School.

In Ottawa, he began working as an apprentice Mechanic, obtaining his Class A license. He also joined the Ontario Provincial Police Auxiliary Unit, retiring with the rank of Corporal.

Paul joined the Township of Nepean Fire Department in 1971, which is now part of the City of Ottawa Fire Services. He was awarded The Federal Fire Service Medal for Exemplary Service, by the Governor-General of Canada. The Ontario Fire Marshall also awarded him the Ontario Fire Marshall Long Service Medal. He retired as a firefighter in 2002 after thirty-one years of service.

Paul also worked part-time for Ontario Ambulance in Carleton Place Ontario leaving this position after 10 years of service.

Paul joined Masonry on April 13, 1983 at St John's Lodge No. 63, Carleton Place, becoming Worshipful Master in 1994-1995. He was elected District Deputy Grand Master 1999-2000, of Ottawa District No. 1. He served as Worshipful Master of Luxor Daylight Lodge No. 741, Ottawa District No. 2 in 2003. He was the President of the Carleton Place Temple Corporation for five years. He also served as District Chairman of Blood Donors and Masonic Education, Ottawa District No. 1.

At Grand Lodge, Paul was appointed to the Board of General Purposes in 2001, 2003 and 2005, and was elected to the Board of General Purposes in 2007 and 2009. In 2008 he was elected to the Management Committee of Grand Lodge and in 2009 he was re-elected for a further three-year term. In 2011, Paul joined the Lodge of Instruction Team, as a presenter and served for two years.

He was a member of the Grand Lodge Masonic Education Committee, where he was the Team Leader responsible for the Masonic Education Newsletter. In addition he was the Chairman of the Grand Lodge Committee of Long Range Planning and the Grand Lodge Committee for the Condition of Masonry. Paul was then re-appointed to the Board of General Purposes and to the Management Committee as Liaison, while acting as Chairman

of Condition of Masonry. He was subsequently elected to the Management Committee for a three-year term.

Paul is the representative of the Grand Lodge of North Dakota, near the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario. He is also a member of the Provincial Emergency Service Degree Team. He has served in a variety of capacities including the Local Chairman of the Grand Lodge Committee for the International Plowing Match in Carleton Place, a Member of the Navan and Crosby IPM Committees and as a Member of the Grand Lodge 150th Anniversary committee. In addition he has served as the Grand Lodge Representative to the Amalgamation Committees in Ottawa, Cornwall, Kingston and Bath, was a founding Director of the Masonic Chip Foundation, Co-Chair of the Local Committee on Arrangements for the Especial Communication of Grand Lodge in Ottawa and has Chaired four Grand Master Receptions Committees for the Ottawa Districts. He was appointed a Director of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario for six years as Chairman responsible for the webpage and for approval of Masonic Foundation District projects.

Paul was elected Deputy Grand Master of The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario in July of 2015 for a two year term. In 2017 was elected the Grand Master of The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario. He also became a member of the Royal Order of Scotland in the same year.



District Deputy Grand Master's Charity for 2019-20

Greetings Brethren,

As we start 2020 and set out in the second half of our Masonic year, I ask you to take the time to read this important message.

I have the privilege and happy task of being this Masonic year's District Chair for Charity. Our DDGM, R. W. Bro. Jeff Christie, tasked me with this, and I have enthusiastically taken it on because of what it is – a fight against cancer. Although there have been several

years of fundraising to fight cancer in the past, this year is a little different because of the approach, or direction of the cancer battle.

Many of you know that R. W. Bro. Christie and his wife, Paula, have been in the midst of a cancer battle for about 9 ½ years. Paula has cancer. She has been battling cancer and succeeding. Although not yet cured, she has not succumbed. She has learned to live with cancer. And both she and R. W. Bro. Jeff have optimism for the future.

The reason that they feel this way, and in fact, why Paula has done so well for so many years, is that she has been in clinical trials with the oncology department at the General Hospital almost from the beginning of her struggle. And, in fact, she has been a part of a new way of being involved with clinical trials – this is called REaCT – which stands for Rethinking Clinical Trials. And so, my Brothers, REaCT is the name of our District charity for this season.

What is REaCT? REaCT is a new program started in Ottawa to deal with a person's fight with cancer. Clinical trials for cancer, and in fact, for many other illnesses, have been around for quite a few years. But, the process of the clinical trial, the bureaucracy involved with being a part of it, and maintaining being in it, can be a struggle for the patient, and for the doctors, nurses, and other specialists in that field to make it happen.

Many clinical trials have very strict conditions in order for a person to be a part of the trial. The trial, although many times beneficial for the patient, is actually designed to test a new drug under certain strict criteria in order to prove a drugs effectiveness, or ineffectiveness.... There is a lot of paperwork involved – often up to 20 pages worth of reading, filling in forms and questionnaires, and trying to understand what you are getting involved with. All this, and at the same time, the oncologist has referred you to the people

running the trial – both the oncologist and the trial people are doing paperwork. It is all very time consuming – time consuming when the Ottawa Hospital staff sees several thousand new oncology patients every year – around 5000 On top of this, clinical trials lose patient numbers with inconclusive results, or early trial termination.

While a clinical trial may go a long ways towards extending someone's life, or even saving it, there are many more factors that make the traditional way of doing business – of doing clinical trials, cumbersome.

From an Investigator or physicians side, there are several problems: a willingness to be involved with a trial or refer a patient (some doctors simply don't want to do the extra because they are already overburdened); lack of knowledge about which trials are available; concern regarding patient's ability to participate; negative effect of physician-patient relationship; informed consent time consuming; strict schedule to follow; inclination towards a treatment in clinical trials, lack of incentives.

From the patient side of things: Difficulty understanding legal consent forms; fear of experimentation; more frequent tests and visits – which means more travel, time, parking costs, etc..;unaware of trial availability; distrust of medical science; age – sometime makes for exclusions; lack of family or other support.

And there are institutional barriers: clinical space and time for a treatment, or handling the legal side of things; dedicated research staff; funding; availability of clinical trials.

What REaCT does is try to eliminate many of these problems, and get more people into the trials. REaCT uses a verbal consent system of getting patients into trials – this happens at a regular visit and is a simple conversation with the doctor. The discussion is recorded in the patients chart along with the patient's decision to participate. This is more patient friendly – less intimidating than a 12 page consent form, less appointments, less travel, expenses, need for support, etc... The REaCT clinical trial process attempts to address questions of practical importance to patients, their families, and healthcare providers. A REaCT trial will not necessarily test new drugs, rather, they might use existing proven drugs, but just in a different way – for example, instead of having a chemo therapy treatment every three weeks, maybe try them every 6 weeks and give the patient a better lifestyle – they have shown that this is often just as effective in battling the cancer.

REaCT gets more people into clinical trials. With ever increasing numbers of cancer patients, less than 3% of patients were able to get into a clinical trial, even with 75% of patients willing to be in one. Why such a high number wanting in? Negative results in the treatments that they were getting, and a desire to fight on with whatever there was out there that might save or extend their lives are a couple of good reasons.

Right now, there are REaCT trials across Canada at various hospitals. There have been approximately 2300 patients in 15 trials in Ottawa, with 7 trials being active right now. A trial might consist of between 60 to 450 people in it.

REaCT trials are community donor funded – grants are extremely difficult to secure especially for these types of trials. A typical REaCT trial having about 100 participants will cost about \$100K to run. A REaCt trial does, however, run at a significantly lower cost than a traditional trial. The REaCT process is designed to increase the availability of clinical trials to patients. More practical data will be collected from these trials, which will go a long way towards improving the patients quality of life and we hope extending cancer battles, or even beating those cancers.

REaCT was created to improve care and outcomes for patients. It is taking an existing system and making it more practical and patient focused.

Brethren of Ottawa District 1, I hope you can support this innovative, Ottawa-born program that has already positively impacted almost 2500 patients across the country. As I mentioned at the beginning of this letter, cancer has impacted the Christie family, and REaCT has made a positive difference in their struggle. But, cancer can affect any of our families. Please put every consideration into supporting our District Charity this year. Feel free to contact me for information on how to do this through an established Grand Lodge program.

Final Report for District Chair for Charity Ottawa District 1, 2019/20

To R.W.Bro. Jeff Christie, DDGM Ottawa District 1, And to the Brethren of Ottawa District 1,

This is the year-end report for Charity for Ottawa District 1 for the Masonic Year of 2019/20.

This year's District Charity was the support of REaCT – which stands for Rethinking Clinical Trials. REaCT is a program at the Ottawa General Hospital that deals with a new approach to treating, tracking, and processing cancer patients. It has been in existence for just a few years, and thus far has shown to be successful.

R.W. Bro. Jeff Christie chose REaCT to be the charity of choice for Ottawa District 1 as it reflects on the personal struggles in his own household. R. W. Bro. Jeff's wife Paula is a cancer patient, and has been now for over 10 years. The REaCT process is a part of the reason that she has been living with cancer for so long and maintained, for the most part, a positive quality of life while dealing with cancer.

Last fall, in the beginning months of the 2019/20 Masonic year, I presented information about REaCT to many Lodges in our District. Also, an information email was delivered to every Lodge Secretary to be read out to the memberships. To my knowledge, many of the Lodges had received this information and had discussed this amongst themselves on how they were going to formally support the District Charity.

In February, the annual Valentines Charity Ball proved to be very successful, and the Ball Committee obligated themselves to direct 1/3 of all proceeds to the Ottawa District 1 Charity – REaCT. The final monetary numbers have not been given to me from this venture, but were given to the DDGM.

Other plans were set to raise money for the Charity, such as the Annual Curling Bonspiel at Russell Lodge, which was committing \$1000 to the District Charity. Unfortunately, this, and many other Lodge efforts were thwarted due to the onset of Covid-19 in early March. At this point, it seems that most Masonic activities ground to a halt, as was directed by Grand Lodge, for our personal safety.

At this time, I have not been given a total monetary number for donations to the Charity. The District Charity has an official number with the Masonic Foundation of Ontario, and will keep this number into the next Masonic Year – 2020/21. Because of limited Masonic activities due to Covid-19, the Charitable process has lagged this year. Lodges are not able to meet to authorize donations, nor are they able to proceed with fundraising efforts. This will likely be a restricting problem for the upcoming months of the 2020/21 Masonic Year.

The District Charity for 2020/21 will again be REaCT, and some fundraising plans are now underway as a result of initiatives from R.W. Bro. Christie. It is hoped that by the end of this upcoming Masonic year, that Lodge activities will be able to resume, as well as fundraising and charitable efforts.

DDGM dealt with few problems and even less piques and quarrels. Where I sought guidance I got good help. Grand Lodge is my sure port in a storm but every Past DDGM helped when approached. It makes me look capable.

Then Covid-19 arrived. I had completed all but two Official Visits and no Installations. But I'll have another 12 months! When we recommence I'll finish those visits and maybe have some more if asked. I expect more than 15 Installations if we get started in the fall but time will tell. Masonry will look different at first. Ritual may be impossible at the start. Some won't want to go to Meetings right away. How will we work?

Let's concentrate on rebuilding fraternity. Contact members - especially the isolated. Keep Zooming and phoning. Can we help our community - what about the Food Bank or blood donations? Could we do more Charity work. Could we start these things before Lodges reopen? We can polish our Ritual and Protocol. We can help candidates prepare for upcoming degrees. The world is our oyster! Let's embrace the opportunity and get even better.

With the support of the District, the District Secretary, but more importantly from my wife and cheerleader I'm looking forward to more!

In addition to the comments above, provided by R.W. Bro. Jeff Christie, this Historical Document is a summary of the activities undertaken by our DDGM during 2019-20.

District Event Coordinator - Bro. Joe Burchill



R.W. Sir:

As the District Event Coordinator, I had the pleasure of reaching out to each lodge to determine the times for their Official Visit as well as their Installation. My other responsibility was to track the Travelling Gavel and ensure that it reached its destination with no less than a perfect number of brethren presenting it. Throughout the year I did not notice any major challenges concerning this new role added to the District Officers. The only adjustment I would make is to ensure that major event changes would also be accompanied by a notification e-mail, as well as updated on the website. This was prevalent when Doric 58's

DDGM Official Visit was changed from January to October. Including a District Event Coordinator helped increase communication throughout the district, kept lodges and their officers on task, and helped promote the website as a reliable source of information. As the year progressed, I took on additional responsibilities by determining start times and dates for more major events such as Lodge social events. This helped keep the district in the know about happenings that were not just meetings. Whether this position continues in the future or not, the communication it provided was vital to the health of a district. Providing cohesive information between lodges, and members of the district, will keep brothers more involved and minimize the amount of confusion concerning events and important evenings.

Visitation throughout the district is always extremely important to track and report on. Visitation can help a great deal in determining the overall health and activity of a district. Due to the unfortunate circumstances, there have only been a total of 13 lodges who have received the District Deputy Grand Master on their Official Visit. Both Hazeldean and Russell could not receive the DDGM due to the cancellation of all masonic events. The Travelling Gavel also did not complete its full circuit and was only passed 11 times.

At our year's end, the largest visitation of a DDGM Official Visit was Mississippi Lodge on November 21, 2019, with 45 visitors from Ottawa District 1. This included a delegation of 8 from St. John's, a delegation of 9 from Doric, and several members of Prince of Wales who provided the candidate for the evening. The second most visited was Goodwood Lodge on March 3rd, 2020, with 42 visitors, which included a delegation of 11 from Temple. St. Andrew's and Edinburgh followed, and both had 34 visitors from Ottawa District 1 at their Official Visits. Doric showed up with 7 visitors to St. Andrew's to pay respects for St. Andrew's bringing a delegation of 9 to Doric's Official Visit two months prior. The advances in visitation showed great promise throughout this year. In addition to Doric visiting Mississippi on their Official Visit, Sidney Albert Luke brought a delegation of 8 to St. John's Official Visit, and Goodwood brought 13 to Temple's Official Visit.

The Travelling Gavel has also been successful in drawing out visitation throughout the district. The largest delegation delivering the Travelling Gavel, was Acacia Lodge visiting Goodwood Lodge with 15. The next largest was Edinburgh bringing it to Acacia with 13 members, and likewise, Carleton Lodge also brought 13 members when delivering the gavel to Temple Lodge. The most travelled lodge to each of the DDGM Official Visits has been Edinburgh, with 46 appearances, followed by Goodwood with 44, and Doric with 38 visits.

The abrupt end of the year affected visitation as the winter weather only began to clear up after the cancellation of all masonic events. There were no reports on Installations concerning start time or visitation numbers due to COVID-19. Visitation in the future will suffer as the next masonic year begins as our struggle with the virus continues. Social events and celebrations are expected to be rare as the world tries to move forward into a new normal. Concerning visitation, COVID-19 will strike at the health of our district and is another storm that we, as masons, must weather.

Report of the District Chairman of Protocol, Education & Instruction,
Ottawa District 1 2019-2020

I began my year with a trip to Napanee on September 23rd, 2019, to attend a Lodge of Instruction. It was interesting and well presented. That said, I think I learned at least as much on the drive to and from this seminar as I did in the actual seminar itself, having shared the drive with my DDGM and the Grand Custodian of the Work ...:)

As regards the "traditional" roles associated with this position;

District Senior Warden Mentoring - W. Bro. Steve Elias



Senior Wardens Mentoring Final Report - 2020

After requesting and receiving input from all the Senior Wardens interested in attending the sessions (most Past Masters sitting in the Senior Warden's chair don't attend the meetings), it was agreed to meet on the second Monday of each month (every other evening seems to either be a meeting night or a GP night for at least one of the lodges). It was also agreed that the meeting location would alternate between east and west locations in our district.

Our first meeting was in October at Walkley Rd. The Chairman of the Committee spoke for about 20 minutes on what was expected of them as Masters and what they should be prepared for. A practice closing in all three

degrees was held, with each SW taking a turn in the East.

Our second meeting, (in November), was held at Carleton Lodge in Carp and our guest speaker for the evening was W. Bro Jim Bowman (who is running for DDGM next year). This gave the SWs and the probable next DDGM a chance to meet and know each other. W. Bro. Bowman spoke for about 45 minutes on his experiences as Master and what he learned from them, his plans for involving the Masters if he was elected DDGM, and the Master's role and responsibility in leading their Lodge. A practice closing in the third degree was held.

The December meeting (our third) was held at Walkley where R.W. Bro. Les Richardson was the speaker. He spoke for about 30 minutes on many of the details of being Master, including protocol and etiquette and filling out the forms. He was impressed with the turnout (over half the SWs were present). As a majority of SWs were present, the President and Secretary for the group were elected at the meeting. The SWs then practiced closing in third degree.

The fourth meeting was held in January at Mississippi Lodge. The guest speaker was R.W. Bro. Anthony St Denis. His idea, (borrowed from our current DDGM), was to answer questions the SWs might have focusing on potential awkward problems that may occur or have occurred in Lodges. An excellent discussion on several questions developed. A practice in closing in all three degrees was then held.

The fifth meeting (in February) was held at Walkley where R.W. Bro. Bryan Adams was our speaker. He focused his discussion on protocol and etiquette, specifically concerning

receiving Grand Lodge Officers and banquets. The SWs then practiced closing in third degree, but those who had step-up nights looming closed in all three degrees.

The sixth meeting (in March) was held at St John's Lodge in Carleton Place where R.W. Bro. Ivor Bailey was our speaker. He spoke about the Masonic Memorial Service, focusing on the Master's responsibilities especially his need to be prepared ahead of time. The SWs then practiced closing in third degree.

The Senior Wardens have had several Zoom meetings since then but no official mentoring.

computer resources

Throughout the 2019-2020 Masonic year, the majority of the activities for the District website have involved updating the site and back-end resources for the current year, including:

- Update of information for the DDGM and District Chairmen profiles
- · Updating information for individual Lodges (contacts, WM/SD/Sec), and the District Charity
- Ongoing updating of relevant online and calendar information from the Trestle Board, including regular Lodge activities,
 Lodge and District special events, DDGM nights, and Travelling Gavel activities
- · Highlighting of news articles that relate to District activities and special events

ongoing activities

Throughout the year, efforts were focused on the ongoing maintenance of the website, including changes to the Trestle Board and District and Lodge events (within both the online District calendar, as well as the Special Events section of the website), additions to the photo gallery, and highlighting of news/events. This year, the DDGM also requested a more focused use of the website and online events calendar to maintain and provide current details for meetings, events, and other ongoing activities across the District (as opposed to relying on a more static Trestle Board).


Ongoing analysis of website traffic and visitors through the website analytics (the details of which are presented on the following page) showed that as expected, with many District activities being put on hold as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, there was active use of the District website for the first half of the Masonic year, but a decline in usage for the second half of the year (with a 16.74% decrease in overall pageviews to the website as compared to the same period in the previous year). The concentration of website traffic remains focused on Lodge details, Trestle Board, events calendar, DDGM information, special events, and resources/links/publications. As shown on the following page, a positive trend from the first half of the Masonic year was that the areas of the website that provide information related to ongoing activities (which previously would have been provided within the Trestle Board) had seen a notable increase in traffic over the same period in 2018 (including a 66% increase in visits to the events calendar page, a 30% increase in visits to the special events page, and a 25% increase in visits to the DDGM nights page), demonstrating that the shift to provide the information from the Trestle Board in a more current and accessible way was successful.

Additional support was also provided for the 2020 Valentine's Charity Ball website, and support for virtual meetings using a District Zoom videoconferencing account, which allowed District Chairmen and Worshipful Masters to continue meeting at the request of the DDGM to remain informed during the pandemic.






detailed site traffic

Thank you to all of the corporate and private donors that contributed to the tremendous success of the silent auction, helping us raise money for this year's important charities: Roger Neilson House, REaCT-for Rethinking Clinical Trials (chosen by Ottawa District One), and Quickstart-Early Intervention for Autism (chosen by Ottawa District Two). Some of the past recipients include: The Dave Smith Youth Treatment Centre, Roger Neilson House, Ottawa Parkinson's Society, Starlight Foundation, Ottawa Regional Cancer Foundation, Canadian Cancer Society, Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario, and Prostate Cancer Research.

The success of the 2020 Event, Chaired for the second year by Mike Reiach, has resulted in a commitment to hold the event again next year, on February 13, 2020, at the same venue. Next year's event will be Chaired by David Brown. On a final note, one of the original "Founding Fathers" of the Valentine's Charity Ball, Sam Kalinowsky, retired this year after 16 years of faithful service.

Thank you as well to all of the volunteers for your time, effort, and dedication towards making this event a success. You are to be commended for your hard work in planning and executing a superb event for Masons, their families and friends.







Cover Page

Usually our summons cover proudly displays the crest of Carleton Lodge No. 465 along with the words, "116 Years Strong". This February marks the 113th anniversary of the death of our charter master, W. Bro. George Nielson Kidd - M.P.P. who passed to the Grand Lodge above from typhoid on Feb 6th 1907 at 43 years young. But his age belies his accomplishments.

George, or "Uncle Ned" as his family called him, was elected Reeve of Huntley Township at 28 and the President of the Agricultural Society at 29. The next year at 30 he ran for Provincial office as an Independent where he trounced the Conservative incumbent on a platform to, "uphold the moral, social, intellectual, political and financial situation of rural Ontarians". Three years later at 33, the Honorable Member from Carleton ran as a Conservative and won. Six years later in 1903, at the age of 39, he persuaded like minded men to create Carleton Lodge; four short years later he died.

W. Bro. Kidd left behind a strong legacy as; a farmer, businessman, land owner and pillar of the community. A young man who assisted in developing; stores, mills,

churches, a Masonic Lodge and other necessities of rural living. George Nielson Kidd; a truly remarkable man and an amazing Mason. *Kudos to W. Bro.'s Fields, Pregel and Gray for cleaning up the KIDD Maple Grove monument.





After exchanging with authors quoted, I have since replied back to author Andrew Hammer how well the evening went and that visitors from various District Lodges were present when reading from his book on goodness vs excellence - what we ought to strive for.

Special thanks to R.W. Bro. Perry McConnell for his insightful and touching education that followed, on the Shriner's Hospitals, which generated much interest. I had no idea a single dose of medication could cost so much (\$96,000)! While funding ultimately is always involved, in Canada we will do well in continuing to educate people about the environment which is about to drastically change with so many more clinics replacing hospitals for those specialized services for children care.

Last word but not least, was an inspiring Q&As by our very own DDGM, R.W. Bro. Christie's - an inspiration by being so empathetic and reachable, the example itself of "what to look for when coming to Lodge". Kudos also to our Bro. Joe Carboni for stepping up, embodying and representing us so well, and special thanks to all the Brethren who contributed material to the themes presented beforehand – you know who you are.

Looking forward, there are lots of opportunities to travel and attend special Masonic Events between now and Grand Lodge in July – look well to the Secretary's communications. In March, we will be adjourning early to travel to Goodwood (12 of them visited us in February!) for their DD night.

Let us keep up the good work and continue to make that effort where needed, in words said, (or not said), as well as in acts, to reach our next round. Let us remember that whether in the moment or not, and whether we feel we progress or not, we are the role models that someone will be impacted by. And in interactions, to remember our cardinal values, tenets and fundamental principles. And in the process, let us keep an eye and ear out for masons that do not yet know they are masons. A beautiful system of morality it is, veiled in allegory and illustrated by symbols. We can entertain much with non-masons, just not the secrets, kept as righaul rights of passage on becoming better men and Master Masons.

Regular Meeting Summons, April 1, 2020 - From the Lodge Secretary Brethren:

I'm sure you're all wondering what happens next? You have all received the two recent letters from the Grand Master. While I'm sure you have taken the time to read them, I'll sum them up here briefly.

In his letter dated March 13th, the Grand Master cancelled all Masonic events for an indefinite period. Then, in his letter dated March 16th, he declared that the Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer of each lodge be authorized to pay the bills and conduct other necessary business of the lodge until the lodge re-opens, subject of course to retroactive approval at the next regular meeting. He also stated that Committee of General Purposes meetings by video-or teleconference are allowed and encouraged.

There was, of course, lots of additional important information in these letters, both of which I encourage you to re-read and absorb.

As for the balance of the "Masonic" year:

- It seems clear that no resumption of Masonic activity will happen in April, so we will not have elections this coming month as mandated in our by-laws. Special dispensation will be required therefore as and when those are able to take place after Masonic activities resume.
- With no elections there is of course no installation. Now, there is a theoretical possibility that both elections and installation could take place prior to the summer break. As unlikely as that seems at this point, it behooves me to echo the sentiment of R.W.Bro. Cale that brethren who have agreed to play a role in the installation of the incoming WM and investiture of officers ought to remain ready to perform those roles as and when called on. That said ...
- I'm going to go out on a limb here and advise that my crystal ball indicates there will be no resumption of meetings prior to the fall.

Brethren,

First let me thank you for your diligence in taking measures to "flatten the curve" by cancelling all your Masonic events and observing social distancing.

When I ordered all lodges and lodge events to be cancelled I said we would present administrative concessions later and I will detail some now, knowing full well that the situation will change and others will be needed.

I declare that the Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer of each lodge be authorized to pay the bills and conduct other necessary business of the lodge until the lodge re-opens, subject of course to retroactive approval at the next regular meeting.

I would encourage all lodges to keep in touch with their brethren, both hale and vulnerable by telephone or electronic means. Committee of General Purposes meetings by video- or teleconference are allowed and encouraged.

Official Visits for the remainder of the year will unlikely be able to be completed in time for the Condition of Masonry Team to process the reports. Therefore I ask that any lodge with an Official Visit coming up simply fill in their L forms as best they can. As it is important for the members, and especially the officers of the lodge, to know the state of their lodge, it would be very good to do this in a virtual GP meeting if you can.

Sec. 269 of the Constitution allows a lodge to meet on its regular date without a summons having been sent out nine days in advance, however "no business shall be transacted thereat with respect to which a summons is required to be served by this Constitution or the by-laws of the lodge." This includes degrees and Installations.

An Installation must occur at the first regular meeting after the elections, therefore, if your elections are postponed, so is your Installation. Be assured that next year I will be lenient when applying Sec. 229(a) on granting past rank.

The DDGM Preparation Team is working on a virtual method of presenting their seminar so that those wishing to prepare for letting their name stand for DDGM this July may qualify themselves.

Starting today, the office staff will work remotely. You may contact the office by e-mail but responses may be delayed. Please be patient.

Thank you for your understanding. We will get through this.

Brethren,

On behalf of your Grand Lodge leadership, we felt that is was once again time to communicate to you with some details of policy decisions made, event scheduling, etc. as a result of the continuing Covid-19 crisis.

First, let us express a wish that you and all your families remain healthy and strong during this period of lockdown and social isolation.

Cancellations:

You are aware that all masonic meetings and events in the Province have been cancelled until further notice. Formally, we are now announcing that this cancellation period will extend until AT LEAST June 01 2020. Please follow any local governmental ordinance that extends this further.

Based on the above it will not be necessary to send out any cancellation notices via the Grand Lodge Events Digest for specific events occurring prior to June 01.

Virtual Meetings:

Many of you have been asking about holding virtual meetings. The present policy regarding virtual meetings is to be followed:

No virtual Lodge meetings are to be held (tyled meetings - regular or emergent)

Committee of General Purposes meetings can be held virtually under the following conditions:

- No ritual is performed (including openings and closings)
- No dispensation is required unless specified in the lodge bylaws
- Minutes must be kept
- All business discussed and approved at a Committee of General Purposes must subsequently be presented to the Lodge for ratification
- Every effort must be made to allow any member wishing to participate in the Committee of General Purposes to attend the virtual meeting

Naturally, social gatherings and check-ins by virtual means are of course encouraged (and no minutes are required). Education discussions on any masonic topic could be presented.

Annual Communication:

At the present time all plans are moving ahead to hold our Annual Communication in July at the Fairmont Royal York Hotel. We are however busy preparing alternate plans should the situation deem necessary. Further communications will be sent out as more information becomes available.

Thus, at this time no changes are being made regarding Grand Lodge elections or elections for the position of District Deputy Grand Master. Any changes will be communicated when available.

Temporary Policies

As a result of the shutdown of all Lodge meetings and Events certain temporary policies have had to be implemented. In response to your many questions, these policy changes, as of this date, are as follows:

Dispensations

Dispensation not required to cancel meetings until further notice.

DDGM Official Visits:

DDGM Official visits have been cancelled and will NOT be rescheduled. Lodges and DDGMs will complete the L-forms to the best of their ability and submit in accordance with the original timings.

Paying the Bills:

The Grand Master has already authorized the Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer to pay the lodge bills during suspension of labours.

Rescheduled Elections and Installations:

Many Lodge elections and Installations will be postponed.

All existing Lodge officers are to remain in their positions until an election can be held.

Assuming that this year's Elections and Installations will be able to be conducted sometime in the next few months, the Elections and Installations for the following masonic year will revert to the original dates identified in the Lodge bylaws.

In 2020-2021, if a new Worshipful Master does not serve 12 months, the Grand Master will authorize past rank upon request.

Once labours have resumed, Elections may be held at an emergent meeting, followed by the Installation at the next regular meeting.

Resumption of Lodge meetings:

Once labours have resumed meetings can resume with the proper issue of a summons. If the meeting is scheduled within the first nine days of labour resuming Section 269 will apply. That is, providing no member in attendance objects, the lodge may conduct ordinary business but no degree work, balloting or material business.

Amalgamations/Surrenders:

Amalgamations and Surrenders may proceed if the Terms of Reference have been approved by the membership. The ceremony may be rescheduled.

Pending Lodge Surrenders – contact the Grand Secretary.

Lodge Anniversaries - Silver to Gold Ceremonies:

If the Silver to Gold Ceremony has been cancelled or postponed due to Covid-19, permission has been granted for the brethren to wear gold braided regalia as of the next regularly scheduled meeting, provided that date is after the Date of Institution of the Lodge.

Suspensions NPD:

The names of any brethren more than 12 months in arrears must still be read out at the next regular meeting of the lodge and the Worshipful Master will then declare them suspended. The brethren will be suspended as of the date of the end of the 12 month period.

Note that the updating of the above changes as well as the need for additional changes may be required and will be communicated as needed.

Covid-19 Update April 08 2020

Brethren.

As we all continue to observe our isolation and social distancing practices we trust that you and your families remain healthy.

Your Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, COO and Grand Secretary are meeting regularly to discuss issues and concerns that arise as the situation unfolds.

We know that many questions arise, especially the longer the absence from labour continues and we are doing our best to stay ahead of the situation. Many issues that arise relate to the Constitution and to existing policies and procedures. Making changes is not always an easy task. Many circumstances may point to a simple solution but under the covers there are hidden ramifications, short and long term.

We hope that you will be patient as we try and find the best possible solutions in the shortest time and then communicate these solutions to you.

Temporary Policies new this week (Apr 08)

This week, there are several items to draw your attention to.

Requests for Grand Lodge Appointments:

Effective immediately all requests for Grand Lodge Appointments have been put on hold. You are asked NOT to submit any further requests until directed to do so. Once we return to our labours requests can be submitted in due form and will be processed once received.

Semi-Annual Returns January – June 2020:

The semi-annual returns and payment for the period January 01- June 30 2020 shall be delivered to Grand Lodge as usual on or before July 08 2020 as per the Constitution.

Requests for Dispensation:

You are asked to NOT submit any requests for dispensation until directed to do so. Requests may be submitted in due form once we return to our labours.

Invitations to attend:

Invitations for the Grand Master / Deputy Grand Master to attend have been put on hold. You are asked NOT to submit any further requests until directed to do so. Requests may be submitted in due form once we return to our labours.

Lodge Insurance Coverage:

If our Lodge premises are vacant for several months, what are the insurance implications? We have checked with our Grand Lodge Insurance Broker (FCA Insurance Brokers) and he has informed us that all insurance policies have a clause about checking on a building during the regular heating season – failure to do so generally results in no coverage for the damage done as a result of a burst frozen pipe (unless some proper precautions were taken). As we are past the "regular" heating season this does not apply.

For the temple corporations around the province, that are insured under the FCA Cornerstone Program, there is no occupancy requirement – other than the one noted above about frozen pipes in the winter. 'Vacant' has a very specific meaning with respect to insurance – it is when a building has been vacated by the occupant or owner an – there is no intention to return. Based on the current situation none of the buildings would be considered to be vacant.

If you are NOT insured under the Grand Lodge FCA Cornerstone program, we suggest that you check with your insurer as each policy may be different.

Virtual Meetings:

Additional questions are being received related to holding virtual 'meetings'. The issue of virtual 'get togethers' was discussed in the April 02 message. No changes have been made in that policy. Please ensure that any virtual 'get togethers' you plan conform to those directives.

College of Freemasonry Courses:

Have you ever wanted to take the College of Freemasonry courses and now finally you have the time? Due to the present circumstances of isolation and social distancing, the College of Freemasonry is offering the College Courses free of charge until we resume our labours. The enrollment form is on the Grand Lodge website. Why not spend at least part of your day making your daily advancement in masonic knowledge?

Masonic Community related efforts:

Brethren, we have had a number of requests related to getting our members involved in community type activities. Examples include setting up a food bank drop off at a lodge hall, helping out a Blood Donor clinic, offering rides to those still working and in need of transportation.

Regrettably these activities in one way or the other do not follow the Provincial health guidelines. For example instead of hosting a Food Bank drop off it would be much better to encourage your brethren to go directly to the food bank – the food bank employees have already taken the precautions and have the training needed to deal with the circumstances. This same logic applies to offering rides to others. There is as much risk riding in our cars as there would be in taking an Uber or taxi ride. We could however offer to pick up and deliver individually to someone shut in who does not have transportation.

Thus, while we support the sentiments behind these suggestions we really cannot support them. We can however, as we already have done, encouraged all our brethren to contribute individually where and how they can.

The overriding, all important factor is that our provincial health organizations and our government says we need to STAY HOME.

Note that the updating of the above changes as well as the need for additional changes may be required and will be communicated as needed.

COVID-19 Update May 13, 2020 re: Annual Communication 2020

Brethren,

It is becoming increasingly unlikely that we will be able to hold our Annual Communication scheduled for July 15-16, 2020 at the Fairmont Royal York Hotel. While the decision to cancel it and whether we will incur charges from the hotel hinge on government announcements, we suspect that resumption of 'normal' activity will be gradual and gatherings of large numbers of individuals in confined spaces will not likely be possible in July.

Even if we can hold a meeting in July, we do not feel that there will be adequate opportunity for you to meet the candidates or debate any constitutional amendments.

Therefore, regardless of whether we hold an annual communication or not:

Grand Lodge Officers: Elected and Appointed:

All Grand Lodge Officers, both elected and appointed, will remain in their positions for an extra year. This includes the elected positions of District Deputy Grand Masters, Grand Wardens, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Registrar and members of the Board of General Purposes. It also includes the appointed Grand Lodge officers such as the Grand Director of Ceremonies, Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies, Grand Sword Bearer, Grand Stewards, etc..

As a result, there will be no elections for District Deputy Grand Masters in July 2020. There will be no elections for any other Grand Lodge officers in July 2020. Only Grand Lodge appointments required to fill vacancies will be considered. Anyone not wishing to remain for the extra year may tender his resignation to the Grand Secretary.

Constitutional Amendments:

All amendments submitted by the deadline will be held over for one year. New amendments can still be submitted up to Jan. 1, 2021.

If we are unable to hold the annual communication in July, we will be arranging for a virtual meeting of only those officers of Grand Lodge necessary to complete the legal requirements of our corporation.

Further details will be communicated to you by the Grand Secretary as they are confirmed.

COVID-19 Update May 13 2020 Annual Communication 2020 - Changes

May 13, 2020

Brethren,

This message is to identify and clarify a number of items related to the current status of the July 2020 Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Please ensure that you have read the current update from the Grand Master, distributed with this document.

District Deputy Grand Masters:

As stated by the Grand Master, all current District Deputy Grand Masters will serve until July 2021. Therefore it will NOT be necessary to elect a successor at a District meeting this year (2020). Based on Section 108 of the Book of Constitution, the District Deputy Grand Master will NOT be required to produce an audited financial statement of the receipts and expenses pertaining to the duties of his office until his successor is installed in July 2021.

Note however that all reports due for the current year must be submitted on time, including your P-Sum report.

Grand Lodge Officers (Resignations):

Any Honorary or Appointed Grand Lodge Officers who have indicated to the Grand Master that they wish to resign their positions in July 2020 will step down as of July 15 2020 and a replacement will be named by the Grand Master. Any Elected Grand Lodge Officers who have indicated that they wish to resign their positions in July 2020 will step down as of July 15 2020 and according to Sec. 92 (d) vacancies in all other elective offices shall be filled by election at the next annual meeting of Grand Lodge.

Lodge Officers: Election and Installation:

Because of the unknown date for resumption of labours and the timing of individual lodge elections and installations, it is not possible to make a blanket statement about Lodge officers remaining in their current positions for another year. Each lodge must evaluate its own situation and ascertain the wishes of the current Lodge officers. The options available are:

 Current Lodge officers could remain in their positions until the next election as specified in the Lodge bylaws

Page 1 of 2

- New elections could be held for a shortened year and then another election held at the time specified in the bylaws
- New elections could be held conditional upon the officers agreeing to serve a partial year and the next full year

In any of the above options, dispensation is required to change the date of the election and installation. As per the update of April 08 2020, requests may be submitted in due form once we return to our labours.

If elections were held at the meeting before the hiatus, the lodge may install those elected officers when we resume or opt for one of the above options.

Finally, in all three situations described above, the Book of Constitution must be followed with respect to the proper notification of elections and Installation in the Lodge Summons.

Nominations for Grand Lodge Office 2020:

All nominations for Grand Lodge Office in July 2020 that were submitted prior to the deadline of April 01 2020 will be automatically held over until April 01 2021. Any withdrawals will be accepted any time between now and April 15 2021.

New nominations for office in July 2021 will be permitted prior to April 01 2021.

Proposed Constitutional Amendments 2020:

As indicated in the Grand Master's message, all constitutional amendments proposed for July 2020 have been held over until July 2021. There is no need for them to be resubmitted.

Further details regarding the Annual Communication will be communicated to you as they are confirmed.

COVID-19 Update May 21 2020 Updates

May 21, 2020

Brethren,

This week's message contains some details that have been resolved since our announcement of May 13, 2020. Thanks to those who submitted questions.

A. District Projects (District Deputy Grand Masters):

With respect to District Projects that have been set up with the Masonic Foundation of Ontario for 2019-2020, normal policies and procedures will be followed. Project may be terminated and paid out upon request at the end this Masonic year (July) or projects may be continued during the 2020-2021 Masonic year. New projects may be set up at any time by following the normal procedures.

B. Lodge Officers: Election and Installation:

In our message of May 13 2020, we indicated that Lodges whose elections and installations have been deferred due to COVID-19 have three options based on a request for dispensation to change the date of the elections and/or installation.

The options available are:

- Current Lodge officers could remain in their positions until the next election as specified in the Lodge bylaws
- New elections could be held for a shortened year and then another election held at the time specified in the bylaws
- New elections could be held conditional upon the officers agreeing to serve a partial year and the next full year

Some additional clarification on the above options:

- If elections were held at the meeting before the hiatus, the lodge may install those elected officers at the
 first regular meeting after resumption of labours.
- Elections may be held on an emergent meeting after resumption of labours with the Installation scheduled for the next regular meeting (with proper notification in the summons).

If any of the elected officers chooses NOT to remain in position:

- the normal process for election and installation/investiture of a replacement officer of the lodge may be followed or
- the Worshipful Master may appoint a brother to sit in the chair and perform the duties of the office until
 the next regularly scheduled lodge installation as defined in the lodge bylaws (such brother shall not be
 installed or invested).

With all of the above, proper notification in the Lodge Summons and dispensation are required.

Elections/Installations and Past Master Rank:

Under option 2, the granting of Past Master Rank to a Worshipful Master serving less than 12 months will be considered by the Grand Master, upon request by the Lodge.

Finally, in all three situations described above, the Book of Constitution must be followed with respect to the proper notification of elections and Installation in the Lodge Summons.

C . District Secretaries:

In the announcement of May 13, the Grand Master stated that all elected and appointed Grand Lodge officers will remain in position until July 2021. Questions were raised regarding the position of the District Secretary. Based on feedback received it appears that the majority of the District Secretaries will continue to serve a second year (until July 2021).

- Should the District Secretary for some reason be unable to serve a second term, the District Deputy Grand Master will appoint a new District Secretary to serve until July 2021.
- The requests for Grand Lodge appointments for the District Secretaries of 2019-2020 have already been submitted. Therefore the Grand Master will defer consideration of those appointments until July 2021. If a District Secretary has served a shortened year and is not continuing until July 2021, an appointment for his shortened term will be considered by the Grand Master.
- Should a new District Secretary serve from July 2020-2021, a request for his appointment will have to be submitted at the proper time in 2021 for consideration by the Grand Master.

Further details regarding the Annual Communication will be communicated to you as they are confirmed.
