I would like to thank R.W. Bro. Jeff Christie, District Deputy Grand Master of Ottawa District One, for allowing me to serve as District Historian for this Masonic Year. I would also like to express my appreciation to all the members of the Craft for their participation in the many virtual events held during Masonic Year 2020-21.

Finally, I would like to thank all the Lodge Secretaries who provided me with copies of their summonses, and in some cases, minutes and photos. This enabled me to compile a summary of individual Lodge events throughout the 2020-21 Masonic Year.

This year, I included the messages from the Worshipful Masters of each Lodge - taken from the monthly summonses. In reviewing the Masters Message each month I realized that there was considerable additional information about Lodge activities that wasn't captured from a list of events performed by the Lodge at the meetings. The Master's Message not only contained elaborated information about what the Lodge did during the meetings, but also activities that were undertaken outside the Lodge; in the community at large and within the Masonic Family. I thought this expanded upon what Freemasons do in their public and private avocations and how they try to live up to Masonic Principles that form the basis of the Fraternity.

I would also like to mention that this summary represents only "the tip of the iceberg" with respect to the number of events which took place in Ottawa District One this Masonic Year. For additional information I would refer the readers to the Ottawa Freemasons Facebook Page (https://www.facebook.com/groups/12593948443/) which has numerous posts by individual Brethren, and individual Lodge's, regarding the activities that were undertaken between July 2020 and June 2021.



Due to an unprecedented event, the outbreak of the Coronavirus/Covid-19, in Ontario during March 2020, the Grand Master, M.W. Bro. David Cameron issued a number of Directives to Lodges in Ontario. In these Directives, M.W. Bro. Cameron suspended meetings, or gatherings, of Masons for an indefinite period - at least until the virus is contained or eliminated. Additional updates were also issued by the Grand Secretary, M.W. Bro. D. Garry Dowling.

As a result, in-person Lodge meetings in District One, (and indeed the entire Province of Ontario), did not occur after March 16, 2020. Lodge Meetings did not recommence during this Masonic Year (July 2020 - June 2021). Some Lodge's did take advantage of electronic means and held "virtual" meetings via video applications such as Zoom. It must be noted that no ritual was performed during the virtual meetings. They were simply used as a means to keep the Brethren in touch with one another and to provide support.

GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS David J. Cameron July 2020

To the Officers and Members of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Brethren.

This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we will not be holding an annual communication for the first time in our history. Instead, the Board of General Purposes is holding a virtual meeting by videoconference to cover off those items which are legally essential.

Never-the-less, we felt it important to produce a document in lieu of the "Proceedings" for two reasons. Firstly, to inform the brethren of the activities of the Grand Master and the other officers and committees of your Grand Lodge, along with the statistics collected this year which may be of value in making plans and projections. And secondly, in order that the brethren of the future may know and appreciate the past.

It is for these brethren that I briefly recount the course of the pandemic. In late 2019, a novel coronavirus that had never been seen in humans before emerged. There was no vaccine available and no known cure. It was thought to have been contained overseas, so life here continued as usual, with regular lodge meetings and special gatherings to celebrate anniversaries, amalgamations and Robbie Burns nights. The first Grand Master's reception was held, in his home district.

On March 11, 2020 the World Health Organization declared a pandemic. On March 12 the Premier of Ontario announced the closure of schools. And on March 13, the Grand Master suspended all Masonic meetings and events. Citizens were asked to stay home except to buy groceries, medicines, go to medical appointments, or to do essential work such as working in hospitals or keeping the food-chains open. The strategy worked and the epidemic curve was flattened so that our medical system was not overwhelmed.

Things started to open up gradually after that, but since those most at risk of serious complications included the elderly, large gatherings in confined spaces which included seniors were not advised. At the time of writing, lodge meetings had not yet recommenced.

The big issue on everyone's mind before the pandemic hit was our decrease in membership. Lodges were struggling to keep up their charitable programs and pay for their aging buildings which were too large for their present needs. How COVID-19 and our enforced hiatus will affect these is yet to be seen. But if history has any bearing, there is hope.

After the Influenza pandemic of 1918-20 the Craft saw a period of great growth. This has traditionally been attributed to the desire of soldiers returning from the Great War to continue the fellowship they had experienced in the forces, but was there also an effect from forced isolation?

The report of the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan found in our Proceedings of 1920 says: "Although practically four months were lost as a result of the influenza epidemic, the year just past has been the most successful in the life of the Grand Lodge of Saskatchewan. The growth in almost all our Lodges has been exceptional, but, nevertheless, I believe, healthy. Men today are looking around for methods for exercising their keen sense of brotherhood, and the fact that our Lodges are having such remarkable growth is to my mind an evidence that they are turning to Freemasonry for the realisation of that desire."

The Grand Secretary of Indiana noted a large number of deaths due to influenza, but also that "Masonry, not only in Indiana, but throughout the entire country, had become enormously popular. Indiana Lodges had always been careful as to the quality of the material; but, he said, 'a note of warning may not be out of place that extraordinary care be observed when floods of petitions are pouring in."

It was reported that the Grand Master of Prince Edward Island had managed to visit every lodge on the island "although influenza raged and the roads were bad, and was happy to be able to report a marked improvement in the work." He said: "Much more importance than heretofore is being given in our Lodges to the matter of instruction. This is being accomplished by lectures, addresses, reading of papers, and by use of question-boxes. During my Masonic career I have never heretofore witnessed such a keen desire for knowledge and information as is being displayed by the Brethren at the present time, especially as exhibited in the search and inquiry after the real meaning and intent of the Masonic rites, ceremonies, and symbols."

Our own Past Grand Master, M.W. Bro. Frederick Harcourt, seems to have agreed with these sentiments. One hundred years ago at our annual communication in July 1920, he said:

"I occasionally debate with myself as to what should be the aims of Free Masonry in this 20th Century, having regard to its conditions and the unrest due chiefly to the War. We are taught that Masonry is a progressive science. In what direction?

...

We are advised by our ancient charges to acquire more knowledge of geometry and other sciences, a thing difficult of accomplishment for the ordinary member in this practical age of rush and competition, the wherewithal to support a family being the first consideration. Still we must

progress. We must not get into a rut. ... Generally diffused education on the right lines is a most valuable national asset. To quote an old saying, 'We must educate our Masters, otherwise there will be a narrow outlook and true progress will become impossible.'

. . .

At the risk of being accused of needless repetition I wish to say to you, brethren, that in my opinion our Order should not depart from its traditions. Its great charm is its mysticism, its exclusiveness as regards other organizations. Its portals are open to every reputable man. Its only advertisement should be the exemplary lives its members lead, its object to educate those members both as citizens and individuals so that the world may know the aims and ideals of Masonry."

We are presently living through a difficult time. The pandemic of COVID-19 forced us to suspend all Masonic meetings and events for a while. However, the brethren have turned their attention to education, and looking after each other; keeping in touch by phone, e-mail and videoconferencing; aiding the vulnerable including widows; reading, contemplating, and working on correspondence courses. We have shown where our current passions lie, and the historical thread of where they came from. As our thoughts turn to the future, we can follow those threads, as we envision our course.

NECROLOGY

As Masons we respect those who have gone before us and left us a shining example of the ideal of a Freemason. I recognize the many brethren who have passed to the Grand Lodge above during the past year. For the sake of brevity I will mention only a few.

V.W. Bro. Rui (Roy) M. Gomes

V.W. Bro. Rui (Roy) M. Gomes was born in Mozambique and attended Witwatersrand University, graduating as an engineer. After immigrating to Canada he started his own business. Always a pleasure to chat with, he was very active in Masonic Education in his own lodge, and in Toronto in general. He was appointed Assistant Grand Chaplain, a launching post for many into Grand Lodge service. Unfortunately he passed away this year while in office.

R.W. Bro. T. Richard Davies
R.W. Bro. T. Richard Davies served as Grand Treasurer from 1994 to 2010.
A member of the Board of General Purposes from 1979, he had been Vice President of the Board, a member of the Committee of Benevolence and Chairman of the Audit and Finance Committee. He was a recipient of the Meritorious Service Award. Having grown up in the Depression and worked his way up from junior bank clerk to Senior Vice President at the TD Bank, he was well suited to prudently manage our resources.

R.W. Bro. James T. Cassie was appointed Grand Director of Coromonies

R.W. Bro. James T. Cassie was appointed Grand Director of Ceremonies in 1986. R.W. Bro. Cassie served on the Board of General Purposes for many years and as Vice Chairman from 1994 - 2003. He was a recipient of the Meritorious Service Award. His commitment to the Masonic Foundation of Ontario was unwavering. He served as a Director twice from 1989 – 1999 and from 2001 – 2007 and as the Chairman of the Finance Committee from 2007 – 2014. To celebrate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Foundation in 1987, Jim served as Project Chairman of the "Help Nip Drugs in the Bud" campaign and surpassed the goal of raising one million dollars. He also served on the "HELP-2-HEAR" Millennial Project Campaign Committee in 1999 raising two million dollars over two years.

R.W. Bro. David E. Jacklin

R.W. Bro. David E. Jacklin was an honorary member of the Board of General Purposes for twenty years. Having served as the District Deputy Grand Master of Chatham District in 1998, he remained active in his community as well as in Freemasonry. For over forty years, he practiced as a Criminal Defence lawyer in the Chatham and surrounding area. R.W. Bro. Jacklin's charismatic spirit always lit up a room, and he enjoyed 'holding court' regularly at the Legion as well as the "Election Central" room at the Fairmont Royal York Hotel. His sense of humour was second to none. He was truly a unique soul - a trusted confidant, prudent advisor, gentle spirit, enjoyable friend and an excellent Mason.

R.W. Bro. George E. Hinds

R.W. Bro. George E. Hinds was a long-standing and well-respected member of the Board of General Purposes. He served as DDGM of Toronto District 3 in 1990, and was appointed to the Board in 2001. George served our Board of General Purposes in a variety of capacities. The most notable was his service regarding the numerous phases involved in the completion and constitutional recognition of The Most Worshipful Prince Hall Grand Lodge, Free & Accepted Masons, Province of Ontario and Jurisdiction. Appropriately, he was appointed to serve as their Grand Representative near our Grand Lodge. George was always impeccably dressed with impressive gold jewelry and his warm smile and demeanour made him a welcome addition to any meeting.

R.W. Bro. Wallace Edmond McLeod Past Grand Senior Warden - 1974 R.W. Bro. Wallace Edmond McLeod, a graduate of the University of Toronto and Harvard University, was Professor of Classics at U. of T.. Some of his non-Masonic research interests were ancient archery, Greek pre-history, and the poetry of Homer and Hesiod. He was appointed to the Board of General Purposes in 1972 and became Past Grand Senior Warden when elected in 1974. He subsequently became an honorary member of the Board from 1989-1992 and was a recipient of the Meritorious Service Award. He faithfully served our Grand Lodge as Grand Historian from 1980 until 2009. R.W. Bro. McLeod made a tremendous contribution to Masonic education and research both here in Ontario and

abroad. In 1982-1983 he served as Worshipful Master of Quatuor Coronati Lodge No. 2076, U.G.L.E., the world's premier research lodge. His annual Grand Historian reports to Grand Lodge were always interesting, touched with humour and so well delivered.

Bro. Antonino Buttafuoco

Bro. Antonino Buttafuoco was an Italian Mason. He was a doctor in Bergamo, Italy who worked on the front line treating coronavirus victims. He himself became infected and passed away on March 18. We remember him, and all the brethren who succumbed to this epidemic.

On September 5, 2019 Heredom Lodge U.D. was granted dispensation to meet. The Ceremony of Instituting a Lodge was held on November 23, 2019 at the Weston Masonic Temple in Toronto. Although it is only the third lodge in our Grand Jurisdiction to declare itself an Observant lodge, I know there are other lodges which are using a similar model to enhance the experience of candidates and members alike.

CONFERENCES

I participated on the planning committee for the Conference of Grand Masters of North America which was held in Louisville, Kentucky in February 2020. The valuable BeAFreemason.org program was introduced by the Scottish Rite, Northern and Southern Jurisdictions, and the Shrine International and offered to all North American Grand Lodges.

As President of the Conference of Grand Masters of Canada (the "All Canada Conference") I presided over the annual meeting. Due to COVID-19 this meeting was changed to a one-day videoconference which focussed on what the various Grand Lodges were doing in response and their plans for resuming labour.

AD HOC TASK FORCES

Two ad hoc task forces were created this year. A group of faith leaders chaired by the Grand Chaplain examined the three questions asked of candidates. They recommended several changes to the Ritual Committee in order to bring those questions more in line with our modern understanding of the G.A.O.T.U.. Another task force looked at the format of future Annual Communications. They were to report at the 2020 Annual Communication. And the Constitution and Jurisprudence Committee was tasked with clarifying the concepts of recognition, amity and who can use our lodge rooms. This will be brought to the floor at the 2021 Annual Communication.

RULINGS OF THE GRAND MASTER

The long-standing edict allowing the wearing of Craft regalia at meetings of our youth groups was continued. It is recommended that this policy be included in the Constitution.

With the invaluable assistance of the Grand Secretary, several policies were created for the internal use of the office as guidelines. These included Masonic podcasts, the use of unconsecrated rooms, gender reassignment, and virtual meetings.

Dispensation was given for a brother who was physically challenged and terminally ill to complete his degrees in a timely manner.

Due to the outbreak of COVID-19 all in-person Masonic meetings and events were cancelled for an indefinite period. The Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer of each lodge were given authority to pay the bills and conduct other necessary business of the lodge until the lodge reopens, subject of course to retroactive approval at the next regular meeting. Adjustments were made to the timing of elections and Installations. Allowance was made for missed Official Visits and the collection of data. (Researchers of the future, please make note that the data for this year may be incomplete.)

As it continued to be unsafe to hold large gatherings, an edict was made that the current Grand Lodge officers would have their terms extended by one year. Lodges were given several similar solutions regarding their officers. The Annual Communication was cancelled and a videoconference of the Board of General Purposes was convened to deal with the business that was necessary.

DISCIPLINE

The Worshipful Master of Lodge 'w' was removed from office under section 232 of the Book of Constitution. The Immediate Past Master was appointed to act as the Worshipful Master until another election could be held.

The Worshipful Master of Lodge 'x' was removed from office under section 232 of the Book of Constitution. A new election was directed to take place.

Lodge 'y' was placed under probation from December 2019 – March 2020. The lodge has not yet fulfilled the conditions imposed upon it and therefore remains under probation.

A lodge Secretary was suspended for failure to submit the Lodge semiannual return after repeated notifications.

A brother was moved from Masonic disability status to suspended status for the period of one year for failure to respond to repeated directives to submit a request to be relieved from Masonic disability.

In several other situations, lodges requested involvement by Grand Lodge in the resolution of internal lodge disputes. While reluctant to do so, Grand Lodge did on several occasions make rulings to end the stalemates caused by these disputes.

On a positive note, Lodge 'z', which had been under probation, did fulfill all the conditions placed upon it and as of February 03 2020 the probation was lifted.

He is a member of Royal Arch Masonic Chapters in Napanee and Picton, serving as Treasurer in both.


He is a member of the Kingston District Shrine Club and a Noble of the Mystic Shrine in Rameses Temple.



V. W. Bro. Doug Robar was born in Montreal (Westmount), Quebec and lived in Ottawa, and Trois-Rivières.







Some of our Brethren have been in touch with each other, and have helped out neighbours, family, and friends this past year. Brethren – good on you!! No matter how much the effort, even if it was just a kind word to someone who was down, this is what we as Masons should be doing.

I want to recognize the efforts of my Mother Lodge – Russell 479, and the fantastic charity work that we accomplished this year. Even without the ability to organize fundraising in any traditional method, or have proper meetings to strategize, and even collect monies, you, as members of Russell Lodge came through strong!!

Last spring, we raised \$2,100.00 by "passing the hat" – virtually/by email, and were able to assist the family of Mr. Scott Reaney, of Metcalfe, son of Bro. Gordon Reaney. Scott's daughter, Keira, has severe physical limitations, and we helped to raise money to purchase a very special bicycle which not only helped her develop motor skills, but let her be a kid in her own neighbourhood, and go visit Grandma and Grandpa.

This fall, Russell Lodge again "passed the hat" through emails, and collected \$1,000.00 which was donated to an organization called Trotts. Trotts is a horse riding charity for children and young adults that may have Cerebral Palsy, MS, mental or emotional disorders, and many other hindrances. As seen in the picture, myself, my wife (Dr. Natt), and W. Bro. John Barber and his Lady, Diane, presented a cheque to the Trotts Foundation. Lady Diane has been a volunteer here for about 13 years, and it is a fantastic local organization to help children in need.

We, as Russell Lodge members, also geared our efforts for a fourth year to support Naomi House in Winchester, Ontario. Naomi House is a shelter for abused women who have nowhere to go, and often show up with only the clothing on their backs. And

often, with children in tow. To go back to where they came from, often leads to dire circumstances, and even death.

The members of Russell Lodge were fortunate to team up with the members of North Dundas Lodge in Winchester for a second year in a row. Together, the two Lodges, coming from two different districts, but representing the goodness and benevolence of Freemasonry everywhere, presented the Administrator of Naomi House – Debra, with cheques and monies totalling \$1,600.00. Seen in the picture, are myself on the right of Debra, and W. Bro. Mike Valois, the Secretary of North Dundas, on the left.

Brethren, this money will go directly to the ladies in this shelter, so that they can provide essentials for themselves and children that they have. The money was given from both Lodges, with no claiming as to who gave what – that isn't important. What is important is that Masons worked together, and they made well of their labours. A great team effort!!

I also want to make note to you that we have a couple of members who are working quietly to assist Brethren abroad who are in need – real need. Without support, meals are few and far between. We have a couple of our members who have directed around \$3500 to Masons in Cuba, who are struggling under a hyper-inflation, and are not able to find enough work and money to feed their families.

We also have members, (and members of sister Lodges in Ottawa District 1), who are likewise sending goodly amounts of money to The Bahamas, where the District Chairman for Benevolence, English Constitution, and is also a PM in the Scottish Constitution, is seeing to the needs of Brethren displaced from Hurricane Dorian, and the effects of a strained economy that has no tourist supporting it. There really are families there that are struggling to pay the bills, and get food.

Our Masonic donations are getting directly into the hands of those in need. Nothing is being wasted in bureaucracy.

To the Brethren of North Dundas, I sincerely thank you for joining in with us.

To the Brethren of Russell Lodge, you continually make me proud to be a member of this great little country lodge. We roll up our sleeves, and "get 'er done".

I want to thank the efforts of three of our members for making this all possible – Rt. W. Bro. Ken Sharp, W. Bro. Ghislain Cormier, and W. Bro. John Barber. You three guys provide so much of the backbone of a lodge, and make my job easier.

Brethren, I will end here, and again, congratulate you all in not only achieving these acts of benevolence and charity, but by being good Masons in your families, your community, and in your professional lives.




Acacia Lodge Virtual Meeting, September 15, 2020

Lots has happened since you received your last summons in April of this year. So much so that it is hard to know where to begin. I'll try to keep my comments a brief as possible, but you can certainly feel free to contact me directly if you have any questions or require additional information.

Lodges remain closed. Pursuant to the latest communication from the Grand Lodge, all [in-person] masonic events remain cancelled until at least January 31, 2021."

Summonses" are back up and running. We are being encouraged to resume the issuance of summonses as a means by which to maintain connection with the brethren and keep you informed of new developments.

Zoom meetings are now a regular (and emergent!) thing for Edinburgh Lodge. Edinburgh Lodge has hosted a number of Zoom meetings since cessation of in-person activities back in the spring. Members will all have received notices of these meetings from me via email. These have been well attended and feedback has been positive. Now that we are well into what would normally have been a new masonic year, brethren have asked that these meetings occur more frequently and more regularly.

It has therefore been decided that Zoom meetings will be held regularly on the same nights that we would have held our regular and emergent meetings. You will be informed of these meetings via the summons. Zoom links will be issued via email a few days in advance of the meetings.

These meetings will typically include a few updates on lodge matters (as necessary), potentially some masonic education, an opportunity for each participant to provide a brief personal update, and then a period for open fraternization. **No ritual or degree**

work is permitted to be conducted during these meetings and any **masonic education must be limited to** that which could be offered outside of the lodge room.

For the present time, we are scheduling these meetings to commence at 1900 hrs. While brethren are encouraged to join the meetings on a timely basis, in order to minimize disruption, those unable to do so are nonetheless encouraged to join when they are able. With the exception of the Regular meeting to be held this coming Wednesday, November 4th (see note below), the dress for these meetings is casual. Brethren are free to leave the meetings at any time.

Government of the Lodge – Pursuant to the direction of the Grand Lodge, government of the lodge remains in the hands of the Worshipful Master, the Secretary and the Treasurer, substantially in the same way it does during our regular summer recesses. All decisions made by these brethren will be "minuted" in the monthly summonses and will be subject to ratification at the first regular meeting of the lodge following the lockdown.

I have, throughout the course of the pandemic, encouraged people to remain healthy both in body and in spirit. I sincerely hope even the most recalcitrant of brethren will consider taking advantage of the opportunity to join with their brethren from the comfort of your own home and reap the benefits that such connection has to offer. COVID-19 Update Especial Board Meeting July 15, 2020

July 16, 2020

Brethren,

As you are all aware, the COVID-19 lockdown prevented us from holding the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge this year.

In order to conduct the necessary business and to satisfy the legal requirements of the Corporation, an Especial Meeting of the Board of General Purposes was held virtually July 15, 2020 10:00 AM. EST.

This meeting was attended by the Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, all honorary, elected and appointed members of the Board of General Purposes, the Grand Wardens, Grand Registrar, Grand Chaplain, the Grand Director of Ceremonies and all District Deputy Grand Masters. The Deputy Grand Master presided over the meeting.

Under the extreme circumstances generated by the pandemic, the Board (consisting of the above named members) acted on behalf of the membership of the craft in conducting the business.

A quick summary of the business:

Brethren,

As the province starts to open up again from the pandemic, I have been thinking a lot about lodges reopening, so here are some thoughts. I was asked what category do I think lodge meetings fall into? My first response was that there really is no category that we fall neatly into. In some ways we are like churches and other places of worship, but Masonry is not a religion and our rites and ceremonies are nowhere near as important as that. So we're not in that category which is high on the list of places to reopen sooner. No, we're more like amateur sports events. We have a small group of people who come in close physical contact and a larger group who sit on the sides and watch. And yet there are important differences. One is that we generally meet inside. But more significantly, our demographic is older. A recent analysis of a small sample of lodges showed that 28% were over 80, 23% in their seventies, and 19% in their sixties. Without even counting those with chronic medical conditions, that puts 70% of our members in the high risk group. We're not in the same risk category as Little League baseball.

The push to re-open has been mostly driven by economics. People need to earn a living to feed their families. Nobody depends on Masonry to earn their living. Well, our COO and staff do, but they have been working from home to hold things together. Whether lodges meet does not impact people's financial well-being. But it does carry all the risks of transmission.

The Ontario government has announced Stage 3 of re-opening in much of the province. Indoor gatherings of up to 50 people are allowed. But that is just the headline. The framework document https://files.ontario.ca/mof-framework-reopening-province-stage-3-en-2020-07-13.pdf puts many conditions on that. This 20 page document contains the phrase "physical distancing" 33 times. It also lists wearing a mask, frequent hand washing, cleaning parameters, and working remotely as much as possible. And recording each attendee's name and contact information to support effective contact tracing in case there is an outbreak.

The framework document refers you to other docs for more guidance in safe opening. https://www.ontario.ca/page/develop-your-covid-19-workplace-safety-plan#hierarchy-of-controls is one that is for re-opening workplaces. An interesting exercise is to download this and use your word-processing program to replace "workplace" with "lodge", and "worker" with "member". Reading it then is an eye-opener! I suggest you try it.

It outlines a hierarchy of controls, from most effective to least effective. The most effective is to have everyone stay home.

It then goes on to list other measures, in decreasing effectiveness, from engineering controls like modifications to the building, to limiting attendance numbers and instituting cleaning protocols, and lastly, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). However, it goes on to say, that while wearing masks is recommended, they are not a substitute for physical distancing. They also note that gloves do not provide any more protection than hand washing or using hand sanitizer.

Res quondam resque futurus

Since lodge meetings are in no way a must activity, we ought to follow point 1 and do the most effective thing to prevent our members becoming infected by the virus.

We do, however, recognize the importance of the brethren maintaining a relationship with their lodges.

So I ask you to picture this: if we were to go through all the safety points (ignoring the most effective, that is, staying home) what would a lodge meeting look like? We cannot do any ritual that involves contact, so that excludes all degrees and installations. (We will not be watering down the Ritual.) So, we open. The brethren are spread out around the room all with masks on. Most of the senior members self-select to not come. Some brethren cannot get in because there is not enough room. We do the business. (This can be done virtually.) We have Masonic education. (This can be done virtually.) We close and go home. (No banquets allowed.) Someone thoroughly cleans the room, halls, bathrooms, doorknobs, etc..

There is no benefit to meeting in person this way, and our membership is put at risk, 70% at high risk. Is it worth it?

When we do re-open, it will be in phases. In order to PREPARE for the first phase, Lodge and Temple leaders should now be reviewing the government guidelines above (https://www.ontario.ca/page/develop-your-covid-19-workplace-safety-plan) along with a few extra points specific to Masonry which are identified below.

Lodge specific requirements for the First phase:

All local and provincial guidelines must be followed.

In the first phase of reopening the following restrictions will apply:

- No visitors from other lodges
- No physical contact including shaking hands
- No ritual will be performed (except that required to open and close the meeting)
- No Installations and Investitures will be allowed
- No degree work will be permitted (EA, FC or MM)
- No fourth degrees/festive boards (no preparation or serving of food or beverages of any kind)
- No singing (including the National Anthem)
- No Masonic Memorial Services permitted
- No official visits by the DDGM

In addition to the restrictions, everyone who attends a Lodge meeting must provide his name and contact information to be stored with the Lodge Secretary in case there is an outbreak and contacts need to be traced. Membership lists will only be shared with public health if a potential exposure occurs on site.

Remember that these points are the EXTRA things. You must also do the things in the government document.

No lodge will be required to open if they do not feel it is safe for their members.

Note that we are still in Lockdown mode and are not moving to the First Phase yet. And the way things are unfolding, it is looking less and less likely that we can safely open in September.

So, it is suggested that, while waiting to be able to re-open, lodges consider having virtual education sessions on their regular lodge night, followed by a social chat on-line. They could continue with separate virtual GP meetings as well to discuss the business or roll them into one. If this is technically too much for an individual lodge, perhaps districts could do it. And pay extra attention to keeping in contact with those elderly or ill brethren who continue to self-isolate.

Brethren, we were all taught to be cautious. Masonry has been through times when we were unable to meet in lodge before. And Freemasonry came back stronger than ever.

We will watch what happens, keep reading the government bulletins, and will keep in touch.

Brethren,

By staying home our province has flattened the curve and probably gotten through the first wave of COVID-19. But the virus is not gone. We must continue to be wary of the 3 Cs: closed spaces, crowded places and close contact. Re-opening too early in other places around the world has led to a resurgence of infections. Waiting to see the impact the opening of schools in September would seem to be wise. With the incubation period of this virus, we won't be able to assess that impact until it's almost October.

Some jurisdictions are going ahead and hoping nobody dies. Others, like Scotland, have simply called off meetings until January 2021 at the very earliest. Taking into account the conditions in our province and our neighbours, and our underlying philosophy of thinking of the health and safety of our brethren first, we will take a balanced approach.

The cancellation of all Masonic meetings and events in the Province has now been extended until AT LEAST October 31, 2020. We will continue to monitor and adjust as the situation evolves.

So, it is suggested that, while waiting to be able to re-open, lodges have virtual education sessions on their regular lodge night, followed by a social chat on-line. Grand Lodge will be setting up GoToMeeting accounts for each district. Your DDGM can then set up a schedule for each lodge to use it in turn. It makes the most sense to have it on your regular meeting night. In the few cases where two lodges in the district meet on the same night, they will have to negotiate an alternative. Or perhaps they could both meet together – an opportunity rarely experienced in former times! The COO will be sending the details to your DDGMs.

Stay healthy and remain concerned about the health of those around you.

COVID-19 Update August 27, 2020 Social Gatherings

August 26, 2020

Brethren,

You will by now have read the Grand Master's message regarding the continued cancellation of all Masonic meetings and events until at least October 31, 2020.

As the COVID-19 situation continues to keep us in lockdown mode, many requests are being received about the hosting of Lodge/District/Temple Corporation social and fundraising events and about the use of Lodge/Temple Corporation facilities.

Use of Lodge or Temple Corporation Facilities during the lockdown period:

We recognize that many Lodges and Districts host social gatherings in the summer months for the purpose of raising funds for the Lodge or District. However, all Lodge meetings and events, including Masonic social events have been cancelled until at least October 31, 2020. Therefore, in effect, all Masonic buildings will remain closed to any activities. With one or two exceptions, the usage of the premises or any part thereof is not permitted.

The only activity involving the use of Lodge premises that would be permitted would be if the Lodge or Temple Corporation had a pre-existing contract with a for-profit business (e.g. bank) or certain not-for-profit corporations operating an essential service (e.g. Day Care) provided the business was permitted to reopen in stage 3 of the provincial guidelines.

Several examples follow to illustrate the above policy.

- Example 1: a Lodge owns a two story building -Lodge room above, bank premises below. The bank had
 previously operated in the premises prior to the lockdown under a lease or rental contract. The bank
 would be permitted to reopen for business provided all provincial and local health guidelines were
 observed.
- Example 2: a daycare previously operated in the premises under a lease or rental contract. The daycare
 would be permitted to reopen for business provided provincial and local health guidelines were followed.
- Example 3: a Lodge permitted the use of its facilities to a local Alcoholics Anonymous group for their
 regular meetings prior to the lockdown under a prior lease or rental agreement. As Alcoholics
 Anonymous has been declared an essential service, this agreement could continue.

Permitting the use of or renting the Lodge premises for any other activities is NOT permitted. Examples of usage **NOT permitted** include but are not limited to:

· Temple Corporation, Lodge committee or other Masonic related usage of Lodge premises

- Club rentals or usage (Lions club, Kiwanis Club, etc.) for regular or special meetings;
- Appendant bodies (e.g. Shrine Club, Scottish Rite, York Rite) or other bodies with a masonic connection (e.g. Eastern Star, Daughters of the Nile) wishing to meet or to conduct a fundraiser using Lodge premises (Banquet Hall);
- Any outside group wishing to rent the Lodge premises to host an event or fundraiser where food is prepared and/or served on site;
- The Lodge or Temple Corporation operation of a 'breakfast club' or 'coffee club' or any other activity where food and beverages are prepared/served on site;
- The usage or rental of Lodge/Temple Corporation premises by community groups for purposes such as Yoga classes, fitness classes, coffee clubs;

Any usage of Lodge or Temple Corporation premises must be conditional upon the enforcement of all provincial and local health guidelines. The Lodge/Temple Corporation is subject to the many regulations involving that use (e.g. proper cleaning and disinfecting after each use).

Referencing the Ontario government document regarding guidance in the safe re-opening of workplaces is recommended for those in charge of any Lodge or Temple Corporation facility. The document can be found at:

COVID-19 Update September 03, 2020 Temple Corporations

September 03, 2020

Brethren,

As mentioned previously, all decisions that are being made by Grand Lodge regarding the COVID-19 situation are under constant review and subject to change as things change. We may not always get it correct on the first try. In addition, I must reiterate that we continue to hold the health and safety of all our Masonic membership as paramount.

Last week we issued a directive regarding the usage of Masonic facilities under the direction of Temple Corporations. Grand Lodge has always recognized that Temple Corporations being separate legal entities are not governed by our Constitution and policies. The message last week was not intended to alter that relationship, but was issued solely with the health and safety of our members in mind.

We have since received a number of suggestions and concerns, particularly related to the ability of the Temple Corporations to generate revenue from their operations. We have also monitored the developments as to the enforcement of local health regulations connected to the pandemic as they relate to the reopening of some businesses, restaurants, community spaces, etc.

Therefore we have made a change to the policy related to the rental of Masonic facilities by Temple Corporations under whose authority those spaces fall.

Effective immediately, Temple Corporations may continue to rent or lease their facilities (with the exception of Craft Lodge rooms) to outside groups provided that the Temple Corporation and the renter/lessee observe all local and provincial health regulations.

Those outside groups include any Masonic or non-Masonic bodies NOT bound by the Constitution and directives of Grand Lodge.

Note that the cancellation of all Masonic meetings and events in the Province continues to be extended until AT LEAST October 31 2020. Masonic meetings includes, but is not limited to, Regular and Emergent Lodge meetings, Lodge Committee Meetings, Lodge Committee of General Purposes meetings and Masonic Memorial Services.

COVID-19 Update October 09, 2020

October 09, 2020

Brethren.

The second wave of COVID-19 is unfortunately upon us. This has led to increased case counts throughout the Province and even to levels higher than they were last April. As a result, the Grand Master has extended the cancellation of in-person Masonic gatherings across the Province.

The cancellation of all in-person Masonic meetings and events in the Province has now been extended until AT LEAST January 31, 2021. We will continue to monitor and adjust as the situation evolves.

The Grand Master wishes to congratulate all Masonic brethren in Ontario for the way that they have supported each other and for the diligence they have shown to date in their obedience to all local and Provincial Health Guidelines and hopes that we can continue this in the months ahead.

Based on the continuation of the lockdown, a number of administrative issues are highlighted below.

Lodge Dues:

I wish to draw your attention once again to the Grand Master's remarks in the October 2020 Communique which included the following directive:

"The Worshipful Master, Secretary and Treasurer of each lodge have already been authorized to conduct the necessary business of the lodge until the lodge re-opens, subject to retroactive approval at the next regular meeting. I therefore decree that, until we return to labour, they may authorize the remittance of the dues of any member without requiring notice of motion or a vote. This will, like all their other decisions, be ratified at the next regular in-person meeting." Note that if lodge dues are remitted, they must be appropriately recorded in the books of the Secretary and Treasurer.

Processing of Demits

First, all demits must be processed in accordance with Sections 190-194 of the Constitution. Second, the effective date of a demit issued in good standing (no dues owing) is the date on which the demit was submitted in writing to the Lodge Secretary.

Third, to issue a demit in good standing, the member must be fully paid up as of the date of the request of the demit.

Therefore, during the lockdown, demits can be received by the Lodge Secretary who then must determine if dues are paid up to the date of the request.

If that is the case, the name will be read out at the next regular meeting of the lodge (whenever that will take place) and the demit in good standing will be issued following the meeting but effective the date the request was received by the Lodge. These demits in good standing are to be recorded on the first semi-annual return submitted after the demit was received in writing by the lodge Secretary.

Before a demit is issued, hopefully an investigation can be done by telephone to ascertain if remitting the brother's dues would solve the issue.

Processing Suspensions NPD

The COVID-19 update distributed on April 2, 2020 still applies on the topic of suspensions for NPD. "Suspensions NPD: The names of any brethren more than 12 months in arrears must still be read out at the next regular meeting of the lodge and the Worshipful Master will then declare them suspended. However, the brethren will be suspended as of the date of the end of the 12 month period."

Lodge dues are payable in advance. Brethren must be notified within 10 months of the date they were dues owing. Such notification would state that they would be suspended effective twelve months from the date dues were due, even though the name may not be read out in lodge until after that. This note, referencing Section 202, will identify to the brother concerned what date they will be 'effectively' suspended.

The names will still be read out at the first regular meeting after resumption of labours to complete the process as required by Section 200 (d). The letter following that meeting will simply confirm the effective date of the suspension. These suspensions are to be recorded on the first semi-annual return submitted after the effective date of the suspension.

The fact that these brethren are technically suspended (without the lodge meeting) is a bit of a moot point when no one is meeting at this time.

Again, before processing this, the Worshipful Master should try to ascertain if the brother is in need of financial assistance.

Masonic Memorial Services

Masonic Memorial Services remain under the lockdown of all Masonic activities. We deeply regret that we are not able to pay our respects to departed brethren at this time in the manner to which we are accustomed. However the risk associated with brethren gathering to perform a Masonic Memorial Service are still too great to permit this activity.

Remembrance Day Services and Parades:

Regrettably no dispensations will be issued this year for groups of Masons to participate in Remembrance Day Services or parades. While individual Masons may choose on their own to attend such events, no regalia is to be worn.

Further updates will be published as required.

Brethren,

With the vaccines coming we see light at the end of the tunnel, but as one public health doctor recently put it, it is a long tunnel. In the meantime, keep in touch – by phone, by mail or by videoconference – and stay safe.

Temporary Business Policies during Continuation of the COVID-19 Lockdown

Overview February 2021:

The longer the COVID-19 lockdown continues, the more we will be facing pressures to permit the conducting of certain lodge business via virtual meetings. In order to accommodate the necessity of making certain decisions while in lockdown and by means of our membership voting on business online, temporary business policies are needed to ensure certain Sections of the Constitution are not violated.

Thus, the following policies are to be considered temporary only during the lockdown. Once the lockdown is ended, we must revert back to the policies and procedures for conducting our business as laid out in the Constitution.

In creating these temporary policies the paramount concern is that EVERY MEMBER of the lodge still has the opportunity to cast a vote on any business items that arise.

In any of the following situations meticulous minutes and preservation of all correspondence with any of the lodge brethren must be kept on record for audit purposes.

This document refers to the following COVID-19 Temporary Polices:

Part A:

- Applications
- Demits
- Suspensions (NPD)
- Restorations after Demits and Suspensions (NPD)
- Expenses Exceeding By-Law Limits
- Use of Ritual During Virtual Meetings

Part B:

- Amalgamations
- Voluntary Surrender of Warrant
- By-Law Amendments

Temporary Business Policies during the Continuation of the COVID-19 Lockdown

Part A:

Temporary Polices for:

- 1. Applications
- 2. Demits
- 3. Suspensions (NPD)
- 4. Restorations after Demits and Suspensions (NPD)
- 5. Expenses Exceeding By-Law Limits
- 6. Use of Ritual During Virtual Meetings

1. Policy and Procedures for Applications:

Applications for Initiations and Affiliations:

Rushing to process applications when we cannot even attend meetings serves no purpose. Any new initiate becomes a Mason for life and thus there is no rush. While applications can be accepted by the Lodge Secretary, the further processing of applications for Initiation and Affiliation is not permitted during the lockdown.

Therefore, the current processes in place for the processing of applications for Initiation or Affiliation will not change during the lockdown period.

2. Policy and Procedures for Demits:

Demits:

The policy already in place for the processing of demits during the lockdown will remain in effect. That policy is stated as follows:

- all demits must be processed in accordance with Sections 190-194 of the Constitution.
- the effective date of a demit is the date on which the demit was submitted in writing to the Lodge Secretary.
- to issue a demit in good standing, the member must be fully paid up as of the date of the request of the demit (otherwise the demit is 'dues owing').
- Before a demit is issued, hopefully an investigation should be conducted by telephone to ascertain if benevolence may be required.

During the lockdown, demits can be received by the Lodge Secretary. If the member requesting a demit is up to date in his dues his name will be read out at the

next regular meeting of the lodge (whenever that will take place) and the demit in good standing will be issued following that meeting but effective the date the request was received by the Lodge. These demits in good standing are to be recorded on the first semi-annual return submitted after the demit was received in writing by the lodge Secretary.

During the COVID-19 lockdown, a request for demit can be withdrawn by the member provided that:

- A withdrawal request is submitted to the lodge Secretary in writing
- The request has not yet been read out at the next regular meeting of the lodge
- The demit has not already been reported on a semi-annual return

The current processes in place for the processing of demits during the lockdown period will not change.

3. Policy and Procedures for Suspensions (NPD):

Suspensions NPD:

The Constitution of Grand Lodge enforces automatic suspension of a member in default of his dues for a period of 12 months. Therefore, the suspension does not require an in-person vote.

However, the names of any brethren more than 12 months in arrears must still be read out at the next regular meeting of the lodge and the Worshipful Master will then declare them (officially) suspended. The brethren will be suspended as of the date of the end of the 12 month period and reported on the next applicable semi-annual return.

The current processes in place for the processing of Suspensions NPD during the lockdown period will not change.

4. Policy and Procedures for Restorations from Demits and Suspension (NPD):

Restorations after Demit (Dues Owing) and Suspension NPD:

There is no reason to change the restoration process during the lockdown and thus the constitution must be followed with respect to reinstatements. Points to note:

• During the lockdown, the committee of inquiry can conduct its business via phone or virtual conferencing rather than in person. However, a brother cannot be officially restored until the vote is taken in lodge.

- The restoration is effective the date the vote is passed in Lodge.
- In Sec 197 (a) or (b), Sec 198 (a) or (b) and Sec 203 (a) and 203 (b), it is the date the application for restoration is made to the lodge that is the determining factor regarding the application of the three year time period.
- Regulations regarding the three-year time period still apply.

Withholding the vote until labours resume should not be an issue as there are no meetings to attend in any event.

The current processes in place for the processing of Restorations after Demits and Suspensions (NPD) during the lockdown period will not change.

5. Policy and Procedures for Expenses Exceeding By-Law Limits:

Large Expenditures of money (over By-law limit):

Any expenditures above a limit imposed by the lodge by-laws **cannot** be approved by just the Worshipful Master, the Secretary and the Treasurer.

Therefore, the current processes in place for the expenditure of funds over any maximum stated in By-Laws during the lockdown period will change as follows.

The following procedure must be used to permit such expenses during the lockdown:

- a. A Notice of Motion for the proposed expense must be delivered to every member of the lodge via email or surface mail in a lodge summons.
- b. The Notice of Motion must outline the motion and would indicate that it would be discussed at a virtual meeting (which requires a prior summons) on a specific date. Minutes of that meeting must be recorded.
- c. After that virtual meeting, the minutes relating to the discussion on the motion and proper notification must be sent to all members (in the same manner as the Notice of Motion) with clear instructions on how each member can cast his vote either by email or surface mail.
- d. A specific timeframe for responding to the vote must be indicated. The timeframe must be long enough to allow adequate time to follow up and receive responses.
- e. The lodge secretary must record the vote cast and method used by each member.
- f. If the motion has been approved by the majority defined in the lodge by-laws the expense will be deemed to have been approved by the membership.

g. Members must be notified of the result of the vote (approved or not approved) in a summons sent to all members of the Lodge. If all members are so notified, any such approved motion does not require ratification at the first regular meeting on the lodge.

6. Policy and Procedures for use of Ritual during Virtual Meetings:

No changes will be made to the current policy of not permitting any ritual to be used during a virtual meeting. Degree rehearsals using the ritual are not permitted in a virtual meeting.

The current processes in place prohibiting any ritual to be performed in a virtual meeting during the lockdown period will not change.

- 1. Amalgamations

- 3. By-Law Amendments
- 1. Policy and Procedures for Amalgamations:

The first six steps of the Grand Lodge Policy and Procedures for Amalgamation may be modified temporarily during the COVID-19 lockdown ONLY as detailed below. Steps 7 through 11 of the Policy and Procedures remain in effect as stated in the Policy and Procedures document.

Amalgamations: Policy and Procedures

 To satisfy Section 159, each of the lodges considering amalgamation must adopt a resolution that amalgamation proceedings be initiated with the other lodge(s) named in the resolution. Proper notice of motion must have been given at a preceding meeting in each lodge before the resolution can be moved, seconded, discussed and voted on.

COVID-19 Process:

Page 5 of 10

- a. A Notice of Motion to initiate amalgamation proceedings must be delivered to every member of the lodge via email or surface mail in a lodge summons.
- b. The Notice of Motion must outline the motion and would indicate that it would be is discussed at a virtual meeting (which requires a prior summons) on a specific date.
- c. After that virtual meeting, proper notification would again be sent to all members (in the same manner as the Notice of Motion) with clear instructions on how each member can cast his ballot either by email or surface mail.
- d. A specific timeframe for responding to the vote must be indicated. The timeframe must be long enough to allow adequate time to follow up and receive responses.
- e. The lodge secretary must record the vote cast and method used by each member.
- 2) To satisfy Section 160, each lodge must appoint a committee of three members to represent the Lodge in defining the terms of reference of the amalgamation. Grand Lodge recommends approving the appointment of the Committee members as a vote in open lodge.

COVID-19 Process:

- a. A vote to accept the committee members must also be taken.
- b. Notification of the vote to accept the Committee members should be given in the same notification as the Notice of Motion above.
- c. Instructions on how each member can cast his ballot either by email or surface mail would be included in the notification of the vote sent in Step 1.
- 3) Notification must be sent to Grand Lodge containing the text of the Notice of Motion, a copy of the Summons containing the Notice of Motion, the text of the amalgamation motion voted on by the lodge, the date of the vote, the result of the vote, and the names and contact information of the three committee members selected. At this point the lodge should inform the District Deputy Grand Master of the pending amalgamation and keep him informed as progress is made.

COVID-19 Process: There is no change in this step (All the above information required to complete Steps 1 and 2 must still be submitted to Grand Lodge). This information may be sent via email.

4) As per Section 160, the Grand Master will then appoint a member from another Lodge to act as Chairman of the Joint Committee on amalgamation. Such Chairman will have the power to vote in case of a tie.

COVID-19 Process: No change

5) The Joint Committee will prepare the Report of the Joint Committee on Amalgamation in accordance with Section 161 (a). There are no rules for how the Lodge should 'approve' the report, but a vote of approval in open lodge is suggested.

COVID-19 Process:

- a. The Joint Committee shall meet virtually to draft the Terms of Reference Report.
- b. Once a draft is prepared it must be distributed to every member, either by email or surface mail with instructions on how to respond with questions or concerns.
- c. Another virtual meeting which requires a prior summons is then scheduled to discuss the draft report and answer all concerns.
- d. Then, after any edits have been made, the final draft must be distributed to every member again (via email or surface mail) with notification on how (via email or surface mail) and when to vote providing a deadline which allows time for adequate follow up and the receipt of responses.
- e. The lodge Secretary must record the vote cast and method used by each member.
- f. The last draft of the report shall be approved by a majority of the members voting.
- g. The Grand Master and Grand Secretary shall be sent all draft versions of the Terms of Reference for review.
- 6) Once the final Report of the Joint Committee on Amalgamation has been approved by the Joint Committee a copy of the Report of the Joint Committee must be sent to each member of each lodge at their last known address according to Section 161 (a). The mailing to each member must clearly articulate that unless 25% of the membership (as reported on the last semi-annual return of the lodge) notify the Secretary of the lodge, in writing of their objection to such amalgamation, within ten days from the date of mailing of said notice, the amalgamation shall be carried into effect as soon as the Grand Master approves of such amalgamation.

COVID-19 Process:

a. The final Terms of Reference Report must be sent to each member by email or surface mail with instructions on how to respond and vote (email or surface mail) on acceptance.

- b. The lodge secretary must record the vote cast and method used by each member.
- c. Follow up is strongly recommended to receive responses.

Note: Unless otherwise directed by the Grand Master, this temporary policy in effect during the COVID-19 lockdown does NOT permit the actual amalgamation to take place until labours resume.

2. Policy and Procedures for Voluntary Surrender of Warrant:

The policies and procedures for a Voluntary Surrender of Warrant are very similar to that of an amalgamation. Therefore the temporary policy changes for amalgamations will for the most part apply to Surrender discussions. Please consult the Grand Secretary for further details.

Note: Unless otherwise directed by the Grand Master, this temporary policy in effect during the COVID-19 lockdown does NOT permit the Voluntary Surrender of Warrant to take place until labours resume.

3. Policy and Procedures for By-Law Amendments

There is some urgency during the lockdown to enable amendments to lodge bylaws to be discussed, voted on and submitted to Grand Lodge for approval during the lockdown period.

By-Law Amendments: Policy and Procedures

305. (b) No amendment shall be made in the By-laws of a lodge, unless by "Notice of Motion" given at a regular meeting; the proposed amendment shall be duly entered in the minutes and inserted in the lodge summons for the next regular meeting, when the proposed amendment shall come up for discussion. If the amendment is regularly moved and seconded, and passed with the support of a majority of the members present, it shall, as soon as it receives the approval of the Grand Master, become law.

COVID-19 Process:

Step 1:

a. The Notice of Motion to amend the By-Laws must be delivered to every member of the lodge via a summons sent by email or surface mail.

- b. The proposed amendment shall be included in the summons indicating the date and time of the virtual meeting (which requires the prior summons) at which the motion will be discussed. Each member must be given clear instructions and a timeline indicating how he can submit questions or concerns if he is unable to attend the virtual meeting.
- All questions and concerns will be raised at the virtual meeting, discussed and results documented.
- d. The lodge Secretary must record all questions and concerns raised by each member and the resolution.
- e. If any changes are made to the proposed amendment the process must begin at Step 1 again. In such case it is recommended that the document containing the resolutions to all questions and concerns be delivered to every member with the Notice of Motion.

Step 2:

- a. The document containing the final resolutions to all questions and concerns must be distributed to every member of the lodge with clear instructions on how each member can vote on the proposed amendment either by email or surface mail.
- b. A specific timeframe for responding to the vote must be indicated. The timeframe must be long enough to allow adequate time to follow up on and receive responses. The lodge Secretary must record the vote cast and method used by each member.
- 306. In submitting by-laws or amendments thereof to the Grand Secretary for approval by the Grand Master, after they have been confirmed by the lodge, the following documentation signed by the Master and the Secretary under the seal of the lodge is required: (1983)
- (a) one certified copy of the lodge notice containing the notice of motion in which the proposed amendment is printed in full;
- (b) one certified copy of a complete set of the current by-laws of the lodge; (1983)
- (c) one certified copy of that portion of the minutes of the meeting at which notice of motion was given, setting out in full the proposed motion; and (1989)
- (d) a certificate in duplicate in accordance with prescribed Form 5 (page 183), that the amendments (setting them out in full) were legally carried by a majority of the members present and voting.

The above documentation must still be submitted to the Grand Secretary after being confirmed by the lodge. However, the lodge Secretary may submit the required documentation electronically via email without the lodge seal provided the email includes the statement "Please consider this email and its attachments approved and certified by the Worshipful Master and Secretary as if they were signed by each of them under the seal of the Lodge".
