To the Officers and Members of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

#### **WELCOME**

As we come to the end of two of the most enjoyable years of my life, I welcome each of you to the one hundred and sixty-ninth Annual Communication of your Grand Lodge. It has been another year of great pleasure for me to travel throughout the Province and beyond to have the opportunity to meet new friends and renew friendships with so many Masonic friends and their families. As we gather for this Annual Communication, it is time to reflect on what has been accomplished during the past Masonic year as we look forward with great anticipation to the coming year and a new Grand Master.

It is an honour and a privilege to welcome the leaders, distinguished guests and friends from other Grand Jurisdictions along with all the Brethren from the whole Family of Freemasonry. On behalf of our Grand Lodge, we especially welcome all that have journeyed from our Sister Grand jurisdictions – you honour us with your presence and strengthen the Fraternal bonds that exist between our Grand Lodges. Your attendance adds a great deal to our Communication and reinforces the universality of our great and beloved Craft. Welcome one and all!

We have been fortunate, to work with some of the greatest and proven leaders in Freemasonry. They have been a great source of advice and mentorship. Their loyalty to our beloved Craft has instilled enthusiasm in many and has proved to be an inspiration for all. I am convinced the world today needs Freemasonry, its philosophy and its fundamental principles for which we stand. I have no doubt that our world would be a better place if everyone practiced the philosophies of Freemasonry.

#### **NECROLOGY**

It is always a significant loss when a Brother, mentor or friend passes to the Grand Lodge Above. We all have too many of these in our lives, but we do need to remember them easily and regularly to keep their influence and devotion close to our hearts and actions.

As one grows older, the list of Our Departed Brethren in the front of our Preliminary Proceedings, becomes even more significant to those of us who will soldier on. When one has spent twenty-seven years as a Grand Lodge Officer, the names on this list are even more ringing. When I think of some of the names on this list in this year's record, I am reminded of the influence which many of them had on my Masonic experience such as R.W. Bros. Bert Barker, Ed Goldthorp, Brian Howard, Leyland Muss, Lanny Salmon, Ian Sinclair, V.W. Bros. Clarke Mayhew, Wayne Nicholson, Roy Reid, Bruce Taylor and Ashley Tidy. From my own District Deputy Grand Master Class of 1997 there was R.W. Bros. George McKay and Robert McKee and from my own District of Frontenac, we particularly remember R.W. Bro. Marvin Switzer, V.W. Bro. Bill Robertson and W. Bro. Tom Hughes.

Please take the time to review the list of our dear departed Brethren who have served your Grand Lodge when you get your Proceedings.

In the past Masonic year, we particularly remember the following influencers who have taken their final journey.

### R.W. Bro. Frederick 'Fred' Halpern Honorary Grand Senior Warden

One of the reasons I miss the in-person Board meetings that we used to have is because we don't get to see Councilor Halpern's favourite necktie advertising his favourite law firm of the Three Stooges called Dewey, Cheatum and Howe.

Those who knew Bro. Halpern, knew well his gentle, soft spoken word and warm smile when you talked with him. By how proudly he talked about his two boys – Noah and Michael, and his wife Elinor, you could tell he was a dedicated family man.

Fred was a 50-year Lewis who was sponsored into Palestine Lodge No. 559 by his Father Michael. He Affiliated with Grey and Dufferin Lodges, the latter serving as Worshipful Master in 1997. Brother Halpern served on the Grand Lodge Discipline Committee for two years before moving to the Chairman of the Constitution and Jurisprudence Committee for nineteen years from 2001 through 2019. For his legal contributions to his Lodges and Grand Lodge, Fred was recognized as a Grand Steward in 2000 and elevated to the rank of Honorary Past Grand Senior Warden in 2005.

His contributions to our fraternal ways didn't end in the Craft. He was also a member of the Scottish Rite Toronto Valley; Mount Sinai Chapter No. 212 of Royal Arch Masons and Rameses Shrine Temple in Toronto where he got his Hillbilly Degree later joining the unit in 2017. Although we didn't get to enjoy Fred's company as much in the last few years, he will always be remembered by your Grand Master as a Brother who broke the practice of not helping a Brother who proposed a Constitutional amendment "because it had never happened before." Back in 2004 when I was working on an amendment to introduce the Lewis Jewel into the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario, our Brother Halpern was Chairing the Constitution and Jurisprudence Committee. He was open to the plea that this amendment would strengthen the family bond of Freemasonry, break the Grand Lodge mold and share with me that the members of his Committee were going to reject my proposed amendment. So at the Chairman's suggestion, the proposal was withdrawn to avoid a three year wait to be re-submitted. His next suggestion was to approach a member of the Committee to determine how I could get the Committee's approval. Seeking out M.W. Bro. C. Edwin Drew seemed natural as with three potential Lewis' in his immediate family and two more in-law recipients in Kingston, he was eager to help me change the 'it' to an 'at' and the following year, the amendment was declared 'Regular' and many of us now enjoy the memory of our Fathers while sitting in Lodge with our Lewis Jewels over our hearts.

This may sound condemning of your Constitution and Jurisprudence Committee but let me assure you we have got better. With the assistance of the present Chairman, R.W. Bro. Brian Gilkinson and Past-Chairman, R.W. Bro. Murray Coulter, we have been able to move the Committee opinion of proposed amendments as 'Irregular' because in the opinion of the Committee, the proposal 'wasn't good for Freemasonry', to a position that 'Irregular' meant that it conflicted with something already in the Constitution, and not just an opinion of what might happen. I hope I explained that clearly, because it was a major development in extending the 'enfranchisement' to every Mason, and not just a single Committee, and for the genesis of that idea, we can thank R.W. Bro. Fred Halpern.

### R.W. Bro. Edward 'Ted' Sinclair Rutter District Deputy Grand Master

It was a sad day when I heard of the passing of our Brother and friend 'Mr. Prince Edward County' to the Grand Lodge Above but comforting to know he was at rest after several years of poor health in his ninety-seventh year.

R.W. Bro. Edward Sinclair Rutter was born on a farm in Bloomfield in 1926, one of six children. After growing up in 'the County', Ted joined the Naval Reserve in 1944 and served on the HMCS Georgian until the end of the war. Upon his return, he attended Guelph University to study agriculture and met the love of his life Pam and they married in 1950. They moved to Picton where he worked at a variety of positions until he purchased his homestead fruit farm where he managed Rutter Orchards with its associated canning fruit factory business until retirement.

He was Initiated into Prince Edward Lodge No. 18 in Picton in 1964 and was elected Worshipful Master of the same in 1972. Twenty years later, he would become a Life Member of his Mother Lodge. In 1985, he was elected as the District Deputy Grand Master of Prince Edward District.

Bro. Rutter would also join Scottish Rite Masonry where he would achieve his 32nd Degree. Ted was also a member of the Belleville and District Shrine Club.

While Ted ran Rutter Orchards and his fruit processing plant successfully for decades, his true passion was community service. He was a humanitarian to the core and was always looking for opportunities to help challenged communities in the area to find a better way of life. His many years of service to the community were reflected in many roles and accomplishments. He served as a longtime Chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Prince Edward County Board of Education; President and trustee of the Board of Governors of the Picton Hospital Board; Chairman and member of the Loyalist College Board of Governors; Chairman of the Belleville General Hospital Foundation which raised millions of dollars for local health needs; Chairman of the Prince Edward Fruit Growers Association; an active member of the Ontario TenderFruit Marketing Board; Chairman of the Unemployment Insurance Board of Referees; member of the Ontario Workman's Compensation Board; Chairman of the Belleville Police Services Board; where he would be recognized as Volunteer Citizen of the Year in 1989.

Until the last day of his life he followed all of his family's activities wanting to know the latest news and how and what they were doing. He will live on in the advice, values and character he has instilled in all of his family – his wife of seventy-three years, seven children, twenty-one grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren and many Masons he has mentored along the way.

Well done, good and faithful servant.

#### R.W. Bro. Iain Donovan Wates

#### **Honorary Member of the Board of General Purposes**

Everyone thinks the Grand Master is the hardest working and farthest travelling Mason in a Jurisdiction. I'm sure I won't burst too many beliefs that in the Grand Jurisdiction of Ontario, that title would have to go to our R.W. Bro. Iain Donovan Wates, or as I used to fondly refer to him as the 'Muskoka Workhorse.'

Although his last few years were a struggle with mobility, he made up for it in the number of hours that he spent at his computer preparing minutes, developing or assisting others with their presentation preparations and delivery, Chairing a Grand Lodge Committee, tracking interested applicants or delivery of Masonic education.

I first met Iain and his very dedicated and supportive wife Marsha, who we know as Sam, during the Help-2-Hear Masonic Foundation of Ontario Project of 2000. Muskoka Parry Sound District, as it was known then, was one of my Districts when the Province was divided up between the seven Project Co-Chairman. As you could imagine, I was in Muskoka Parry Sound District on a weekly basis helping the local volunteers with awareness of our million-dollar fundraising drive for the cochlear implant program

through Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto. It also won't be surprising that one of my most capable and dedicated go-to guys in that District was Iain Wates.

As soon as Iain finished his responsibilities as Muskoka Parry Sound District Secretary in 2006, he assumed presentation duties around the Province through Brother-to- Brother workshops as well as being Grand Steward. A short time after this, Grand Master Petrisor was hosting one of the many summit meetings held during this time at his cottage on Lake of Bays and the conversation turned to adding a Board Member from the Muskoka Parry Sound. I can't take any credit in the talent search as it was not my decision, but let's just say appointing V.W. Bro. Wates to the Board of General Purposes in 2009 was one of the wisest decisions ever made by a Grand Master as time would surely attest!

Iain was in his thirty-ninth year of Masonry after being Initiated, Passed and Raised and serving as Master in Muskoka Lodge while living in Port Carling. He was also a strong supporter of The Heritage Lodge. After his appointment to the Board of General Purposes, he was elected for five successive terms when he accepted the appointment as an Honorary Member just last year. During this time, he would also be elected to the MasoniChip Foundation in 2020.

Most every Mason will know that Bro. Wates Chaired the Brother-to-Brother, Masonic Education, Fraternal Correspondence, Communications, Craft Stewardship, Benevolence and served on the Management Committee. But not all would know of all the work he did behind the scenes with the development and delivery of the Lodge Secretary's, Treasurer's and Worshipful Master's Workshops. He was the go-to guy for tracking prospective members and compliance documents. He was supportive of both of our Masonic Foundations and a resource to the Scottish Rite Barrie and Muskoka Learning Centre. He was the Recording Secretary Grand Lodge Board and District Deputy Grand Master Virtual Mentoring meetings.

Iain also practiced his Masonry on the Milford Bay Community Centre Board, as a volunteer fireman with the Milford Bay Fire Department and as a mentor in upper management for forty-nine years with Waste Management.

R.W. Bro. Wates will be missed in ways that we haven't even thought of yet.

#### **PAST RANK**

There are a variety of reasons as to why a Worshipful Master may not be able to complete their twelve months in office beyond their control due to their health or someone in their family, a change in Lodge Installation dates, relocation due to a career opportunity or Amalgamation.

Pursuant to Section 73 of the Book of Constitution, we are recommending the rank of Past Master be conferred upon the following Brethren who were unable to serve twelve months as Worshipful Master:

- W. Bro. Murray Daniel Arnold, Maple Leaf Lodge No. 362

#### THE GRAND MASTER'S AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

The Grand Master's Award for Distinguished Service is to recognize exceptional Service rendered by members of the Grand Lodge. The Award was originally established by M.W. Bro. William R. Pellow in 1987 as a personal award of the Grand Master. We are most pleased to announce the following recipients who have each contributed in their own way to the betterment of their community, Lodge, District, and to Grand Lodge.

**R.W. Bro. Scott R. Drummond** – There is an old Masonic adage that once you become a Grand Lodge Officer, you remain a Grand Lodge Officer for life. This is so true of my long-time friend, R.W. Bro. Scott Drummond. Just last year, his Lodge recognized him for twenty-five years a Past District Deputy Grand Master in Peterborough District on the same night he was being Installed as Worshipful Master of Golden RuleCampbellford Hastings Lodge No. 126.

Scott was Initiated into Masonry on September 25, 1985, and within a year, he had been Raised as a Master Mason. He was a fast study and skipped a few chairs over the next five years before becoming Worshipful Master of Golden Rule Lodge No. 126. He served a two-year term the first time in the chair and then another six months in 1995 and again in 2023.

Having served as part of the executive in various capacities on the Peterborough Masonic Association, he was elected as Most Worshipful Brother Durward Ivan Greenwood's representative in Peterborough District in 1996.

In 1999, along with another young Mason from Frontenac District, Scott was appointed to the Grand Lodge Board of General Purposes for a two-year term. He was subsequently elected for three two-year terms before leaving the Board in 2007 to focus on his new business. Then in 2011, he was once again appointed to the Board and would be re-elected again in 2013, serving a total of 12 years as a member of the Board of General Purposes.

Scott served on numerous Grand Lodge Committees over the past twenty-five years and continues to serve as a Director on the MasoniChip Foundation. He served on the following Committees: Lodge of Instruction Team, Brother to Brother, MembershipResources, Masonic Education, Leadership Development, Audit and Finance, Leadership Development Training and the MasoniChip Ad hoc Committee prior to the creation of the Foundation.

He also served as Chairman of: Public Relations, DDGM Orientation, Lodge Finance Advisory, and Lodge Resources Committees.

He was the Chairman of the Joint Committee of Amalgamation for Madoc-Marmora-Tweed Lodges; an Affiliated member of The Heritage Lodge No. 730 and the Grand Representative for the Grand Lodge of West Virginia near our Grand Lodge.

But he didn't stop there as he has joined most every concordant body available. He is a Royal Arch Mason and an active member of Ionic Chapter No. 110 Royal Arch Masons in Campbellford. He is a Scottish Rite Mason and Life Member of the Peterborough Lodge of Perfection and the Peterborough Chapter of Rose Croix, where he would serve as Most Wise Sovereign, in 2019 and continues to serve as a Valley Trustee. In 1995 he received his 32nd degree and became a member of Moore SovereignConsistory in Hamilton. In 2022 he was Coroneted an Honorary Inspector General of Scottish Rite Masons.

In 2005 he joined Rameses Shriners and Trent Valley Shrine Club, where he would serve as a Club Director and then President in 2009. He continues to serve his Club as a financial reviewer and his Temple as an Ambassador at Large.

In 2016 he became a Knight Companion of the Red Cross of Constantine and is a member of Moore Conclave in Peterborough.

He has served continuously on the Board of Directors for the Campbellford Masonic Hall Inc. since 1989, including twelve years as the President of the Corporation. This seems so natural as he has lived less than

two blocks away from the Lodge for the last thirty-four years with his lovely wife Nancy, where he raised his two daughters.

Our Brother Drummond is also a pillar in the Campbellford community as a member of the Rotary Club where he has been named a Paul Harris Fellow; a member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 103; a member of the Campbellford Hospital Redevelopment Committee; a member of St. John's United Church where he has served as a Trustee and a Director of the Foundation.

On the professional side of his life, he has also been one who serves his community as well. Early in his career he served as an Ontario Provincial Police Constable and since 1985 has been the General Motors Dealer in Campbellford. Scott has recently opened a Car Star Dealership creating even more jobs in his community.

**R.W. Bro. Paul W. Hooper** – The year 1985 must have been a good year for making Masons as R.W. Bro. Paul Hooper, a Lewis, was also Initiated, Passed and Raised the same year as Bro. Drummond. If you have seen Bro. Hooper participating in Lodge, you will know that he is a fast learner – and it started that way. He was made a Master Mason in Dominion Lodge No. 598 before the Summer recess. Four years later he would be Worshipful Master for the first of three terms – the third time as Master of Trinity Lodge No. 521 just two years ago. He also Affiliated with Windsor Lodge No. 403 where he would be granted Life Membership.

I met Paul in 1997 when I was District Deputy Grand Master. He was also appointed to the Board of General Purposes but in 1996 by M.W. Bro. Durward I. Greenwood and had already caught the 'travelling man bug' as we would first meet in Kingston – some 650 kms. from his home where he was gainfully employed protecting the citizens of Windsor as a city police officer following his Father's footsteps as a Constable in Norwich, England where Paul was born and in Anderson after settling in Ontario where he would join Amherstburg Lodge. You could tell right away that he was a good Mason and it showed in his family. His charming wife Brenda was always by his side since high school, and they seemed like a great pair – she too making a career of helping others in her community as a nurse and pillar in the Order of the Eastern Star.

R.W. Bro. Hooper caught the eye of Grand Lodge during his term as Windsor District Deputy Grand Master in 1984. As an appointed and then elected Member of the Board of General Purposes, he would go on to serve and chair several Grand Lodge Committees such as Lodge Buildings Advisory, Blood Donors, Masonic Education and Fraternal Relations until retiring from the Board in 2006. In 2001 he was appointed as the Grand Representative for the Grand Lodge of Puerto Rico near our Grand Lodge. And in 2003, he further offered his services to our Grand Lodge by allowing his name to stand for Deputy Grand Master.

Paul is also one of those Past Grand Lodge Officers who would then return to a life of concordant service. He is a Scottish Rite member of the Windsor Valley Chapter of Rose Croix and has served as Thrice Puissant Grand Master of the Windsor Valley Scottish Rite Lodge of Perfection. In 1987 he received his 32nd degree and became a life member of Moore Sovereign Consistory in Hamilton. In 1999 he was Coroneted an Honorary Inspector General of Scottish Rite Masons.

On the York Rite Royal Arch Masonry side, Companion Hooper was First Principal of Windsor Chapter No. 71 in 1992 and would go on to be Grand Superintendent in 2008.

In the Sovereign Great Priory of Canada, Paul is a member of Windsor Preceptory No. 26 where he was the Presiding Preceptor in 2011 and Provincial Grand Prior in 2016.

In the Royal and Select Masters, he was the Thrice Illustrious Master of Essex Council No. 12 in 2010. He would then become Worshipful Commander Noah in 2010 in the International Lodge No. 4 of Royal Ark Mariners.

As a member of the Fort Malden Chapter No. 268, he would rise to Worthy Grand Patron of the Order of Eastern Star in 2013 where he and Brenda remains a very active member.

Paul will especially like the speaker at the Grand Master's Banquet tomorrow night as one of his jobs in Grade Five at Anderdon Public School was to raise the flag of our country every morning. It was a most memorable day for young Paul to raise the new Canadian flag for the first time at his school on February 15, 1965.

Paul has a long history of volunteerism beginning in his Anglican Church in Lasalle where he taught Sunday School, was head server to the Minister. He was never in the choir, but he sure can sing when he gets a full breath of air!

The Windsor Police Department beat out the Royal Canadian Mounted Police for his services in 1973 because he could stay at home and didn't have to move to Regina; he didn't have to promise to not marry for three years; but Brenda says it was because Windsor paid more. Paul would serve in many positions with the Windsor Police Department before retiring at the end of 2010 after 37 years of dedicated service.

Another thing these two Brethren have in common in addition to their police service, they both served on their respective Police Pipe Bands. I must tell you that I have never heard either of them play, but it is on their records. They also both have two girls, although Bro. Drummond didn't have two redheads like their Mother Brenda.

You had to be there to appreciate that last sentence.

The second Ceremony of Dedication was on Saturday, December 16, 2023, when the Harmony Masonic Centre was dedicated to Masonry in the village of Canfield. The day was a great example of repurposing an old church that was no longer being used as such, which turned out to be most fortunate for the Brethren of Harmony Lodge No. 57. After the many renovations completed by the Lodge, we are certain that they will be very happy in their new location for many generations to follow.

Given that we may be phasing out the program of Grand Representatives over the next several years, your Grand Master will be making no recommendations to the Grand Masters of their respective Grand Lodges of Brethren from our Grand Jurisdiction as Grand Representatives of their Grand Lodge near our Grand Lodge. The Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario is not the only Grand Jurisdiction who has seen over the last several years how little value the program has to our Grand Lodge and increasingly less and less participation of other Grand Lodges in the Grand Representative program. In 2004, your Grand Master was appointed as the Grand Representative to the Grand Lodge of Alaska. I dutifully went home with an extra copy of both the Grand Lodge Preliminary Proceedings and the Grand Master's Address. The next day I wrote a letter of introduction to include in the mailing and shipped the three documents off to the Grand Lodge of Alaska in Anchorage. I have yet to get any response. Nor have I got any response to the same mailing for the last twenty years. Several of our Grand Representatives tell me the same story. Over the last couple of years, we have been making inquiries about the value of the Grand Representative program with the many Grand Masters and Deputy Grand Masters we have met, and several of them know nothing about the program even.

We will be voting on the proposed amendment later today or tomorrow to eliminate our participation in the Grand Representative program, but I want to assure those Brethren who have previously been so appointed, that they will be grandfathered in and will remain as such until they pass to the Grand Lodge Above. The amendment would simply mean no further Grand Representatives would be appointed going forward.

#### AMALGAMATIONS AND SURRENDER OF WARRANTS

For a variety of reasons, not excluding the COVID-19 pandemic, it has become a sign of the times that Lodges are deciding to Amalgamate or surrender their Warrants after many years of service in unprecedented numbers. Your Grand Master is neither surprised nor saddened by this expected fact. Our fraternity, like so many of our community churches and other organizations, is still being re-calibrated after the post-World War explosion of community participation. While every attempt has been made to avoid a Lodge going into darkness or amalgamating, we must accept the decision of the membership and assist in every way possible to retain our membership rather than worry about the number of Lodges we have in this jurisdiction. As I have said many times, I prefer quality over quantity every time.

The complete list of those Lodges over which the Ceremony of Amalgamation was approved and presided over by the Grand Master and Deputy Grand Master can be found in the report of the Grand Secretary. In addition, several Lodges made the decision to release their members as free agents to join the Lodge of their choice by returning their Warrant to Grand Lodge. The complete list of Lodges choosing to Voluntarily Surrender their Warrant is also found in the report of the Grand Secretary. To the Brethren who chaired these Joint Committees for the Amalgamations and Surrender of Warrants, on behalf of your Grand Lodge, please accept our thanks and appreciation.

#### **RE-DISTRIBUTION OF DISTRICTS**

Not unrelated to the previous topic, your Grand Master began talking to the District Deputy Grand Masters five years ago about the need to gather in smaller groups based on geography to review their District alignments and boundaries. It is easy to see with more and more Lodges Amalgamating or closing their doors, that we won't need as many Districts with fewer and fewer Lodges to visit.

Prior to the pandemic, and because of all the Lodge Masonic Temple real estate activity with respect to the Toronto and York Masonic Districts, a group of Masons representative of this area were challenged to review the current District boundaries with an eye for making any necessary changes given the preceding changes and other extenuating circumstances such as the housing growth outside the city core to the North and East of the City of Toronto. Although this first attempt lost momentum during the pandemic, it was re-ignited under the Chairmanship of R.W. Bro. Leyland Muss. Then before our Bro. Muss could really get the wheels of the committee rolling again, he passed to the Grand Lodge Above. R.W. Bro. Bill Chatwell and V.W. Bro. Domenic Todaro have since picked up the standard and are moving it forward with the cooperation of the team they have assembled. They have very recently submitted their report which I am sure will be high on the agenda of our next Grand Master. With so many Lodges moving to new locations after the sale of their Lodge buildings, or other economic reasons, throughout the Grand Jurisdiction, it is hoped we can use some of the findings of this Committee as a guideline for the rest of the Province.

The Amalgamation process is well underway in the three Hamilton Districts where we expect to see two healthy and vibrant Districts in the very near future.

We thank all the District Deputy Grand Masters who have taken on this initiative in their respective areas. Some are moving in the right direction, and some have maybe taken a step backward. 'He who will

undoubtedly be Grand Master' in about twenty-four hours and I, are united in the opinion that change is inevitable in District boundaries and that continued refusal to cooperate will eventually be met with a corporate decision that may not be as suitable as a 'made at home solution.' So I would implore the next class of District Deputy Grand Masters to add this to their job jar. I would remind these Brethren that it will not be a quick process and that the majority of them will be back in this room passing along their cuffs to their successor before they know it. I would suggest a like-minded, well-respected Past District Deputy Grand Master might be appointed as your Ambassador to get the Lodges in your District into one room to decide how to face this reality. From there, they can reach out to those surrounding Districts to develop a joint plan. Grand Lodge will even assist you with this plan. The Grand Secretary is the first great resource to tap into and from there, the Grand Master would love nothing more than assigning an experienced Board or past-Board member as an independent third party to facilitate the process.

Lodge Buildings: Another giant thank you needs to go out to each and every Lodge in our Grand Jurisdiction for their cooperation in one hundred percent compliance with the Lodge Building Fire Safety and Lodge Insurance protocols of our Grand Lodge. We overcame the initial push-back to reach this goal of ensuring the safety of each person attending a Lodge function in our Temples across the Province. In addition to thanking all of the Brethren involved with their Temple inspections and insurance certifications we must again thank the Brethren that made this all happen. Whenever you try to thank a group of participants you run the risk of missing someone but a big thank you goes out to my professional public safety travelling companions of twenty-two years ago when this idea was hatched; to professional Firefighter and former Committee Chairman, R.W. Bro. Darren Byrne, who revised the old system, protocol and reporting requirements, to make them less onerous and less expensive for the Lodges to ensure fire safety compliance; to R.W. Bro. Richard Kaufman who marshalled the changes, including the Constitutional amendments, as the Communications Pillar Chairman; to R.W. Bro. Jeff Gatcke, who as Chairman of the Audit and Finance, has assumed the responsibility for verifying Lodge insurance policies; and to R.W. Bro. Peter Sialtsis and his Lodge Buildings Advisory Committee for all of the extra work involved in tracking, work shopping and repeated communications with every Lodge in our Grand Jurisdiction to get us across successfully the finish line.

Your Grand Master was especially happy every Lodge accepted the challenge to ensure the safety of their members and visitors. At one point in the roll-out of this revised Lodge Building Fire Safety and Lodge Insurance protocols the Deputy Grand Master and I were resigned that we would be driving around the Province filling the back of his farm truck with Lodge Warrants and suspending the same Lodge members from any Masonic activities. Thank you all Brethren for saving us from that drive!

We truly have come a long way in protecting the safety of our members since a 1954 survey of all the Masonic Temples in Toronto where "not one of our Temples passed with honours" as reported in the 1955 Grand Lodge Proceedings or the 1962 Annual Communication when R.W. Bro. George Evans reported as the Chairman of the Advisory Committee on Lodge Buildings that his Committee was "going to initiate a survey of all our Lodge Buildings throughout Ontario to ascertain the conditions in each Building as to their fire safety." His report went on to say, "we were appalled at the conditions which were disclosed" and that the Committee was planning on educating the Lodges on the hazards that existed. So again, we thank each Lodge and all their efforts to make a Lodge meeting a safe experience!

"A Day of Masonry": As we were coming out of the restrictions of the pandemic in the Spring of 2022, your Grand Master decided that our planning time and energy could be better spent with a day of Masonic education and Grand Lodge seminars, open forums of discussion, sharing and enjoying fellowship and food with our families and friends beyond a single District rather than having a big formal banquet to celebrate one person in each District across the Jurisdiction.

Given the success of the first year, it was decided to carry on with the same program and the same direction was given to the District Deputy Grand Master's Class of 2023.

A big thank you from your Grand Master and all of the Brethren who enjoyed the twelve Masonic educational experiences this past year goes out to the District Deputy Grand Masters and their respective organizing committees in Ottawa; Niagara; St. Lawrence and Frontenac; London; Bruce; Prince Edward; Toronto; Peterborough, Victoria and Ontario; Hamilton; Georgian; and Temiskaming. I count that as twenty-four participating Districts. Congratulations to each of those Districts. I am sure these successes will garner even more participation in the years ahead as word spreads!

We also need to thank R.W. Bro. Rick Cadotte and the Grand Lodge Seminars and Workshops Committee who worked with these Districts to assure they had all of the Grand Lodge support they requested. And of course we need to also thank each of the Grand Lodge Committee Chairmen and their teams who supplied presenters and panel participants for these events. One more thank you to our Deputy Grand Master for again covering for me by hosting a Q&A Townhall in London while the Grand Master was out of the country. And the final thank you to the Custodian of the Work and his Lodge of Instruction Team who split up one weekend so they could cover two events on the same Saturday!

The Grand Master's Legal Advisory Group: A few years ago, we came to the realization that the weight of making discipline, constitutional or jurisprudence recommendations to the Grand Master and Grand Lodge shouldn't have to rest with one Brother. It was decided that the burden of working in isolation was too much to ask of a volunteer, even if the field was in the wheelhouse of the Brother. So it was decided that there should be a true Legal Advisory Group that could work together and use each other as a sounding board to assure that the best thought-out advice was being presented to the Grand Master and Grand Lodge.

We asked if the two named Committee Chairman of Constitution and Jurisprudence, R.W. Bro. Brian Gilkinson, and Discipline Chairman R.W. Bro. Michael MacDonald, and another Honorary Member of the Board of General Purposes, R.W. Bro. Alec Zimmerman, and former Constitution and Jurisprudence Chairman, R.W. Bro. Murray Coulter, would work together and share this heavy burden of providing legal advice to the Grand Master and the Grand Lodge.

They jumped at the idea to work in cooperation as a team when dealing with discipline, constitutional or jurisprudence matters arising before the Grand Master and Grand Lodge. And I must tell you this has been one of the great successes of our Grand Lodge in the last few years.

We thank the aforenamed Brethren personally and on behalf of your Grand Lodge for their professional advice provided and showing us all what a talented team such as this can do.

#### DISCIPLINE

We wish to express our thanks to the Grand Secretary and Chairman, R.W. Bro. Michael MacDonald, and members of the Discipline Committee for the extensive amount of time and effort they have contributed to discipline matters again this year. The Committee dealt with many administrative matters and questions of law and procedure that arose in the numerous complaints forwarded to them. These matters have been addressed in detail in the report of the Discipline Committee. However, a number of these matters required action by the Grand Master and under Section 85 of the Constitution, the Grand Master must report those actions to Grand Lodge and offer his opinion respecting any further action to be taken. Section 85 provides as follows: "The Grand Master may... suspend any brother... He shall report in writing

to Grand Lodge the action taken by him, his reasons therefore and his opinion respecting any further action in the matter which should be taken by Grand Lodge."

These actions taken by the Grand Master relate to numbered items in the Report of the Discipline Committee, which numbers are used for reference.

Item 5. Bro. E: In September 2024 we received complaints from members of the public concerning a Brother who had been convicted of several serious criminal offences. Based on the seriousness of the criminal offences of which the Brother had been accused the Grand Master suspended the Brother pending a Masonic trial. That trial is now pending in the Lodge.

Further to Section 85 of the Constitution, the Grand Master's opinion is that the Brother's suspension should be continued indefinitely pending the conclusion of all Masonic trial proceedings in his case.

Item 7. Bro. G: In November 2023 we received a complaint of inappropriate touching of a young woman at a public Masonic event. On further inquiry we learned of a long history of such misconduct. The local District Deputy Grand Master advised of a mitigating psychological factor concerning the Brother, who was encouraged to complete a particular online counselling session with an appropriate professional. The Brother concerned was summoned to a meeting with the Grand Master; he provided a certificate of completion of the session; he gave his undertaking that he had insight into the inappropriate behaviour; and he gave his undertaking that he would never again engage in such conduct. There have been no further complaints of misconduct and no Masonic charges are pending.

The harmony of the Brother's Lodge was still, however, disturbed by the Brother's presence in Lodge, putting the future of the Lodge at risk due to anticipated demits. The Grand Master therefore suspended the Brother from that Lodge only, leaving him free to attend elsewhere where he was also a member. Further to Section 85 of the Constitution, the Grand Master's opinion is that the Brother's suspension from that one Lodge only should be continued indefinitely.

I wanted to point out the work of the Discipline Committee, in particular the flexibility they have shown in their previous standard operating procedures to improve the impartiality of Reviewing Committees and Trial Commissions. The Discipline Committee continues to work towards further improving the rules and process related to Masonic Offences. We look forward to their future deliberations.

#### **APPRECIATIONS**

#### **Deputy Grand Master**

One of the pleasures of being around the Board of General Purposes as your Grand Master has for the last twenty-five years, is to watch the leadership development of your colleagues. This is especially true of our Deputy Grand Master, R.W. Bro. Jamie Ireland. I still remember well when the Deputy first shared with me that he was interested in becoming Grand Master in the future. It was on a quick trip to Glengarry Highland Lodge in Maxville on a rainy afternoon when we were running late as part of the Eastern Ontario Tour. After running even later with a stop for me to buy a pair of patent leather shoes to cover for the pair left at home and a second stop to get food for some in R.W. Bro. Drummond's Suburban, I found myself at the steering wheel and Bro. Ireland was riding shotgun. I'm sure R.W. Bro. As we were both headed down the same Masonic route at that time, it was great to compare notes, strategies and timelines. How fortuitous that we would be sharing the stage at the same time.

Ireland, he has officiated at all but one of the Lodge Darkness Ceremonies over the past two years, while the Grand Master had the pleasure of conducting all of the happier Lodge Amalgamations throughout the Province. For this imbalance I personally thank R.W. Bro. Ireland for his cooperation and look forward to attending the next Amalgamation to support him.

As the President of the Board and Chairman of the Management Committee he has championed the various Masonic programs to advance Freemasonry. Under his chairmanship, the concept of the Management Committee has proven to be a big plus to the Grand Master and our Grand Lodge. Grand Lodge programs were guided and administered by the combined efforts of wise and experienced Brethren, rather than a solitary decision by a Grand Master, or a long-delayed decision by a very large Board, who normally meet for meaningful discussions but once a year.

Our Deputy Grand Master has a unique ability to get work done through others while maintaining a smile on his face and those of his colleagues. We look forward with great anticipation to the next two years.

We are most pleased to report to the general membership that your Board of General Purposes continues to work tirelessly to strengthen and improve Masonry in Ontario being driven by the 2021 adopted five-year Grand Lodge Strategic Plan – The Next Regular Step.

Our objective as a Board is to not only attract good men of character and intentions, but to also strengthen our Fraternity by providing our membership with a nurturing environment to assist their growth as men and Masons at home, at work and in their communities. The primary objective of your Board of General Purposes continues to be the building of a stronger and more responsive Craft for the membership.

I have no doubt we are heading in the right direction based on the feedback we continue to receive from the work of your Board of General Purposes and we applaud these Brethren and indeed all of the members who serve on their respective committees.

We thank all the members of the Board of General Purposes for their dedication and contributions to the operations of our Grand Lodge and especially to R.W. Bro. Michael Steele, who has decided to retire and therefore has not been nominated for the 2024 Board. The wealth of experience that Michael brings to the Board from his training as a Certified Financial Planner, Chartered Financial Consultant and Chartered

Life Underwriter and his thirty-seven years of professional experience in building wealth and his Lodge and community volunteer experience will be sorely missed as Chairman of the Lodge Finance Advisory Committee.

For those Past Grand Masters who have been regularly called upon over the past few years, we thank each of you for the wise counsel you have freely given to me. We look forward to your continued support of our new Grand Master as well.

### **Grand Lodge Officers 2024-25**

### M.W. Bro. Jamie R. Ireland, The Grand Master

The Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Canada in the Province of Ontario.



M.W. Bro. Jamie Ireland was born, raised and educated in the farming community outside of Strathroy ON.

As a young lad, he soon developed a love of the land and moved in with his grandparents to assist them with the many related duties... on the family farm.

After attending high school in Strathroy, he enrolled at Ridgetown Agricultural College (now part of Guelph University) and graduated in 1985 with a diploma in Field Crops and Livestock.

In addition to his own farming career, M.W. Bro. Ireland began working with the Township of Metcalfe (now Adelaide – Metcalfe), as an Equipment Operator.

In 2016 M.W. Bro. Ireland left his position after 29 years and returned to farming full time.

In 1988, he married his high school sweetheart, Kelly and together they raised four boys: Matthew, Jesse, Benjamin and Lucas.

M.W. Bro. Ireland was Initiated into Ionic Lodge No. 328 in a small rural community called Napier in 1996.

Upon his Initiation, he was able to sit in Lodge with his late grandfather who was also able to be with him in his journey to become a Master Mason.

Leader of the DDGM Orientation Committee. In 2015, M.W. Bro. Ireland was elected to serve his Lodge as the Lodge Secretary, a position he held until 2023.

M.W. Bro. Ireland was Initiated into Mocha Temple and the Strathocha Shrine Club in 2006 and in 2017 he became a member of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite.

At the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge in 2015, M.W. Bro. Ireland was appointed to the Board of General Purposes and in 2017 M.W. Bro. Ireland was elected to the Board of General Purposes. In 2018, he was elected by the Members of the Board to sit on the Management Committee where he was Chairman of the Community Outreach Pillar. In 2019, he was re-elected to the Board of General Purposes and was the Chairman of the Craft Stewardship Pillar which was renamed the Masonic Education Pillar in 2021. In 2020 he was elected to the MasoniChip Foundation of Ontario as a Director. And in July of 2022, M.W. Bro. Jamie R. Ireland was elected to the Office of Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

In 2024 the three degrees of the York Rite were conferred on M.W. Bro. Ireland as well as he was made an Honourary Past First Principal.

In December of 2023, God blessed the family with beautiful twin Grand babies, Akira Marie and Marley Rae, they are growing like crazy and keeping their parents, Lucas and Gracie very busy.

In 2024, he was elected Vice President of the All Canada Conference of Canadian Grand Masters.

In 2024, at the 169th Annual Communications of the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario, M.W. Bro. Jamie R. Ireland was Elected and Installed as the 85th Grand Master of our Grand Lodge.

### M.W. Bro. Paul Edward Todd, Past Grand Master

Paul E. Todd was born in Belleville, Ontario, on August 1, 1945. He grew up in Trenton, Ontario and attended Trenton High School. In Ottawa, he began working as an apprentice Mechanic obtaining his Class A license. He also joined the Ontario Provincial Police Auxiliary Unit, retiring with the rank of Corporal. He worked part-time for Ontario Ambulance in Carleton Place, Ontario, leaving this position after 10 years of service.

Paul Todd joined the Township of Nepean Fire Department in 1971, which is now part of the Ottawa Fire Services. The Governor General awarded him the Federal Fire Service Medal for Exemplary Service, and the Ontario Fire Marshal awarded him the Ontario Fire Marshal Long Service Medal. He retired in 2002 after thirty-one years of Service.

Paul Todd was the Rector's Warden of St. James Anglican Church, Carleton Place, for two terms and for 12 years a member of the Church Choir. Paul is married to Gloria, and they have three children. V.W. Bro Shawn Todd, (Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies and a member of St. John's Lodge No.63, Carleton Place), and his wife Michele live in Westboro. Shannon Moore and her husband Danny live in McLaren's Landing. Alanna Renaud with her husband Budd lives in Carleton Place. He also is a proud grandfather to seven beautiful grandchildren, Olivia, Alisha, Tristan, Camryn, Shelbie, Rowan, and M.J..

#### **Masonic Career**

M.W. Bro. Paul Todd joined Masonry on April 13, 1983, in St. John's No. 63, Carleton Place, becoming its Worshipful Master in 1994-1995. He affiliated with Luxor Daylight Lodge No. 741, Ottawa District No. 2, and was the Worshipful Master in 2003. Ottawa District No. 1 elected R.W. Bro. Paul E. Todd to be the District Deputy Grand Master for 1999-2000. All the Masonic Education presentations he gave during his Official Visits were collected by R.W. Bro. Michael Jenkyns and published with the title Lifting the Veil.

He was the President of the Carleton Place Temple Corporation for five years, and District Chairman of Blood Donors and Masonic Education for Ottawa District No. 1. M.W. Bro. Todd was a member of the Provincial Emergency Service Degree Team.

M.W. Bro. Todd was appointed to the Board of General Purposes in 2001, 2003 and 2005. Then he ran for election to the Board of General Purposes and was successful in 2007, and again in 2009. In 2008 he was elected to the Management Committee and in 2009 he was re-elected for a three-year term.

While serving on the Board of General Purposes, M.W. Bro. Todd was a member of the Masonic Education Committee, where he was the Team Leader responsible for the Masonic Education Newsletter, the Chairman of the Committee of Long-Range Planning, and the Committee for the Condition of Masonry.

M.W. Bro. Todd retired from the Board of General Purposes in July of 2011 due to health issues. To keep active and contribute to the Craft he joined the Lodge of Instruction Team with M.W. Bro. Don Mumby and travelled as a presenter for two years.

To support the visibility of Freemasonry in the community, M.W. Bro. Todd was the Local Chairman of the Grand Lodge Committee for the International Plowing Match in Carleton Place, and a member of both the Navan and Crosby International Plowing Match Committees.

As a member of the Grand Lodge 150th Anniversary committee, M.W. Bro. Todd was an actor in the commemorative play presented at several Especial Communications.

M.W. Bro. Todd has served as the Grand Lodge Representative to Lodge Amalgamation Committees in Ottawa, Cornwall, Kingston and Bath.

He is a founding Director of the MasoniCHiP Foundation of Ontario. He was Co-Chair of the Local Committee on Arrangements for the Especial Communication of Grand Lodge in Ottawa and has Chaired four Grand Master Receptions Committees for the Ottawa Districts.

M.W. Bro. Todd was appointed a Director of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario for six years. He accepted roles as with responsibility for the web page, and for approval of Masonic Foundation District projects.

In 2017 he became a member of the Royal Order of Scotland.

He was elected Deputy Grand Master in July of 2015 and Grand Master in 2017.

M.W. Bro. Todd is the representative of the Grand Lodge of New York near the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

In Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry he is a Past Thrice Puissant Grand Master of the Ottawa Lodge of Perfection, a member of the Murray Chapter of the Rose Croix, and a member of the Ottawa Consistory. He was coroneted a 33-degree Honorary Inspector General in Vancouver on September 11, 2008.

As a member of Tunis Temple, Land O' Lakes Shrine Club, he participates in the Tunis Temple Oriental Band, where he is the Hajji. He was appointed to the Divan of Tunis Temple in 2012 as Marshall.

As a member of Royal Arch Masonry, M.W. Bro. Todd was advanced as a Mark Master Mason on October 4, 2016, in Ottawa Chapter No. 222. He then was received and acknowledged as Most Excellent Master on

December 18, 2016, and exalted to Holy Royal Arch on February 23, 2017. He was appointed as Past First Principal of Ottawa Chapter No. 222 during the April 2017 Grand Chapter Convocation at St. Catharines by Grand First Principal Alan Donovan. M.W. Bro. Todd was appointed Grand Senior Sojourner at the Grand Chapter Convocation held in April 2022 at St. Catharines by Grand First Principal George Napper. M.W. Bro. Todd affiliated with Maple-Granite Chapter No. 63 Carleton Place, March 4, 2022.

#### **As Grand Master**

As the 78th Grand Master, M.W. Bro. Todd presented 9 Wm. Mercer Wilson medals to deserving Masons. And six Meritorious Service Medals were awarded.

During his term there were 10 Lodges that determined that it was in their best interest to amalgamate. And there were 6 Lodges that decided to close by extinguishing the lights.

There is a motorcycle riding club that used a Square and Compasses logo on the patch identifying their members. M.W. Bro. Todd took action to protect the trademark of the Square and Compasses that is owned by the Grand Lodge of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

Jurisprudence required M.W. Bro. Todd to approve the start of two Masonic Trials based on complaints against two Masons. He also had to suspend a Lodge for non-payment of semi-annual dues and no communication from the Lodge to explain the negligence.

M.W. Bro. Todd attended a Cornerstone Ceremony for the Windsor City Hall. This event resulted in extensive and positive publicity for our Fraternity.

During his term as Grand Master, he held an Especial Communication of Grand Lodge in North Bay.

M.W. Bro. Todd continued the active participation of Grand Masters from our jurisdiction at the North American Conference of Grand Masters, and the All Canada Conference of Grand Masters. He also attended the World Conference of Regular Grand Lodges in Panama.

There were also trips to the annual communications of the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island, and the Grand Lodge of British Columbia and Yukon. At the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island M.W. Bro. Todd was welcomed and reminded of the close bond between the two Grand Lodges. Our Grand Lodge supported the effort of Masons to form the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island and that support continues to be appreciated.

There was a personal connection to be enjoyed when M.W. Bro. Todd travelled to the annual communication of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia and Yukon. M.W. Bro. Douglas Franklin was installed as Grand Master, and he entered our Fraternity in Ottawa where he served as a Worshipful Master, and as a DDGM for Ottawa District 1. The two current Grand Masters have known each other for many years, and were both Worshipful Masters of their respective Lodges in Ottawa District 1 for the 1993 – 1994 Masonic year.

Of particular note is the travel by M.W. Bro. Paul Todd, and M.W. Bro. Terence Shand, to London England to participate in the celebrations of the 300th Anniversary of the formation of the premier Grand Lodge. This very well-organized event began with an opening dinner at the Grand Connaught Room with five hundred guests with the United Grand Lodge of England Deputy Grand Master. This was followed by attendance at the reception of the Grand Master H.R.H. the Duke of Kent in Freemason Hall where each Grand Master had a few moments of introduction, to a reception that evening at the Lord Mayor of London Mansion and concluding the next day at Royal Albert Hall where close to four thousand Masons witnessed an outstanding play "Bringing Light to the World" and concluding with the pomp and ceremony of dedication of the new Soane Ark which contained the Great Lights, and a replica of the Wren Maul.

As Grand Master he feels very blessed that he had the opportunity to represent the Masons of this Grand Jurisdiction in a once in a lifetime event. He continued the celebration of the tercentenary of Freemasonry at various events in our jurisdiction including the Greater Toronto Area 300th Anniversary Gala Ball.

A year later, on June 2, 2018, M.W. Bro. Todd was invited to travel to Brussels to the annual communication of the Regular Freemasonry Grand Lodge of Belgium with M.W. Bro. Terence Shand, our Grand Secretary. M.W. Bro. Shand received the Medal of Honor of the Regular Grand Lodge of Belgium for services rendered from M.W. Bro. Daniel Bauwens, Grand Master. M.W. Bro. Shand was very active in helping the Regular Grand Lodge of Belgium form and be recognized in regular Freemasonry.

The charity that M.W. Bro. Paul Todd encouraged Masons to support during his term was the Autism Disorder Research Project. The selection of this charity was prompted by his special grandson, Tristan. To be sure the selection of this charity would be appropriate and useful, M.W. Bro. Todd put together a small sub-committee from Ottawa area Masons. The sub-committee was led by past President of the Masonic Foundation of Ontario R.W. Bro Samuel Kalinowsky PDDGM Ottawa 2, R.W. Bro. Brian Adam PDDGM Ottawa 1 and V.W. Bro Shawn Todd, Past Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies. Their consideration of the work being done at Canadian Universities concluded that Queen's University in Kingston, McMaster University in Hamilton and Western University in London were doing deserving research into Autism Spectrum. The committee informed each University that they might be eligible for a research grant if they would submit a written outline of how their research would use the grant monies.

At the end of his two-year term M.W. Bro. Todd was able to announce that a very substantial amount of donations was raised from the proceeds of Grand Master Receptions, decisions by Lodges and by Masons who gave money through the Masonic Foundation of Ontario to the Autism Research Project. The funds were shared equally among the three University Research Groups.

There were many Grand Master's Receptions over his term. The fundraising opportunities were secondary to the other goals of the events. M.W. Bro. Todd used the Receptions across the Province to make sure he, as the figurehead of Grand Lodge, was visible and available to brethren in all areas of the Province. To him it was particularly important to be present in Districts across northern Ontario. M.W.

Bro. Todd enjoyed hearing first-hand of the issues facing lodges and then introducing Grand Lodge Officers working on solutions or able to find answers. This effort was a direct result of advice he was given by several mentors including M.W. Bro. Donald Mumby, and his personal experience in travelling across the Province as Deputy Grand Master.

During his term as Grand Master M.W. Bro. Todd enjoyed the opportunity to approve the Institution of two new Lodges in the jurisdiction. Templum Lucis Lodge No. 747 in Stratford is a 'strict observance' lodge with an active program for members and guests. Goodfellows Lodge No. 748 in Parry Sound demonstrated the determination of some Masons in that area to build a new Lodge with a focus on charity and fellowship.

M.W. Bro. Paul E. Todd said in his final remarks as Grand Master how much he appreciated that a non-high school graduate and a working man could become the Grand Master. In his many addresses to Masons at various events and receptions, M.W. Bro. Paul E. Todd would conclude his remarks with the sincere comment: "If we are not willing to learn and change, no one can help us. If we are determined to learn and change, no one can stop us."

In his last year of High School, Donald received an Air Cadet Flying Scholarship and earned both his Private and Glider Pilot's licences.

He was accepted into the Canadian Forces Officer Training Programme and trained as a MARS (Marine Surface) officer at Royal Roads Military College and at the Naval Officer Training Centre in Esquimalt, B.C. He received his Naval Commission on August 29, 1979. Following tours of duty in HMCS

Saskatchewan, and HMCS Mackenzie, Donald returned to Newfoundland where he joined the Canadian Coast Guard.

A career move to Ottawa led to progressively more responsible positions with Transport Canada, Fisheries and Oceans, Agriculture and Agri-food Canada, and Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat. He retired from Public Service in April, 2013.

Donald's attraction to freemasonry began with his Grandfather but did not take root until his retirement. He was initiated in Acacia Lodge on 19 November 2013, passed on 18 March 2014, raised on 22 April 2014, and served as Master for the masonic year 2019-2020. He is a Companion of the Royal Arch Masons of Canada and a member of Kitchener Chapter No. 210 in Richmond, Ontario.

Donald and his partner Qi Jiang (Cindy) live in the West end of Ottawa, are members of the Nepean Sailing Club, and spend their summers sailing their C&C27, Kool Kat.

However, that just further illustrates the need for a contingency plan to have applications for Benevolence addressed quickly.

2) I don't get cc'd on emails that go to benevolence@ottawadistrict1masons.ca. This was an issue back in December 2024 as I was asked by the Lodge about the delay in addressing the application, and the reason was I didn't know about it. I would ask that I (or whoever is the new Chairman for Benevolence in the District) be automatically cc'd on these emails, and perhaps this item could be added to the list of "To Do's" for the incoming District Secretary (not that they need a longer list of things to do!).

Other than that, I continue to be happy that mine is a relatively short report every year.

I would like to congratulate you on a successful year, and if it's the desire of the incoming District Deputy, I would be happy to continue in this role.

documentation circulated prior to this meeting:


- That Article 1, Section 1, item b, be stricken.

- That Article 6, Section 2, that the distribution of the District Trestle Board be in nominal quantities be removed, and the District Secretary serve as a signing authority on any District bank account,
- That Article 7 be re-vamped with new committee names and modern responsibilities,
- That Article 8, Section 2 be added to cause the District Secretary to complete the financial records of the prior Fiscal Year before the last day of July,
- That Section 2 have its reference to a meeting held at Grand Lodge be removed,
- That Article 9 have its reference to a replacement cost for a copy of the District Bylaws be removed as PDFs are both free and plentiful.
- That Appendix A Scale of Expenditures DDGM, item 2 be amended to utilize Google Maps for distance calculations,
- That Appendix A Scale of Expenditures DDGM, include an allotment of \$1,800 limited to the acquisition of a hospitality suite and for no other purpose, and
- That Appendix A Scale of Expenditures DDGM, switch the term telephone charges to cellular charges, and that photocopying be amended to be both photocopying and Printing.

There were several occasions where I was able to facilitate communication to enable unused regalia, such as a silver master's collar, to go from a lodge that had just turned to gold to a lodge that was in need that still required silver.

The co-operation of anyone that I reached out to made the job of regalia chair seamless and smooth.

Thank you, the brethren of Ottawa District 1. Your assistance this masonic year was very much appreciated.



Throughout the 2024-2025 Masonic year, the majority of the activities for the District website have involved updating the site and back-end resources for the current year, including:



#### Ottawa District 1 Year End Report Prince Hall Masons Liaison

April 28, 2025

R.W. Bro. Sam Roberts, DDGM, W. Bro. Don Learning, Dist. Sec., Brethren of Ottawa District 1,

This is the year-end report as the Prince Hall Masons Liaison. It was a pleasure to serve, and I thank R.W. Bro. Roberts for having confidence in me for this task.

The year started out last fall with some communications with Prince Hall Brethren. They were invited to three different meetings/events,

but were unable to attend due to conflicts with their own schedule. Likewise, I was invited to a 50 Year Celebration of their lodge, but could not attend due to conflict in my own schedule.

Communication with the Prince Hall Secretary and Master seemed to be intermittent. I am aware that W. Bro. Learning added them to his Distribution List for events and meetings. They had ample opportunity to reach out and attend.

It was my belief that they didn't make many overtures with us because of a weak membership, and that they were in a rebuilding phase. I have since been able to confirm this status just two weeks ago.

An event happened on April 2, 2025 that ended up opening up better relations with the Prince Hall Brethren. One of their members, a Past District Grand Master, Bro. Ellsworth Murray, was in hospital. He was in an emergency room, dying. His wife, Cheryl, didn't know what to do, as she was all alone in this struggle. Mrs. Cheryl Murray knew that her husband was a Freemason, but didn't know who to contact. She ended up phoning the Ottawa Masonic Center, and spoke to Mrs. Marleen Clauson. Marleen contacted W. Bro. Don Learning who, with the direction of R.W. Bro. Roberts, then put out an email asking if anyone knew Bro. Murray, and could assist.

I had availability of time, and was in the vicinity. I responded to Mrs. Cheryl Murray and went to sit with her and Bro. Ellsworth. I stayed with them until he passed, and then drove her home. I provided some assistance to her the next day to help with the legal process that a family member must go through when someone passes. I gave her contact numbers that would help, and I reached out to King Solomon's Lodge, Prince Hall Masons, to inform them of the passing of one of their own.

A couple weeks later, Mrs. Murray phoned me asking for more assistance, as she was getting bogged down with the legal system. She gave me the phone number of the current District Grand Master, Bro. Leslie O'Brian. I then contacted Bro. O'Brian, and we had good discussions in regards to the Murray situation. I was also informed, through conversation, of the situation of King Solomon's Lodge. This is how I came to know of their 're-building status'.

Through communication that I have with the current Master of Lodge Claudius R. Walker, 1808, Nassau, Bahamas, Bro. Stephen Gay, an idea came up. I have since conferred this idea to Bro. Leslie O'Brian, the District Grand Master, and he has been very receptive and appreciative of it. The idea involves making contact with some Bahamian Prince Hall Brethren who are currently living in Ottawa. It is hoped that these Brethren might take an interest in visiting a Prince Hall Lodge, and even assisting this Lodge in holding meetings, and in re-establishing stability.

Getting the names and making contact with these Brethren is a work in progress at this point. However, one great outcome of this work is that Freemasonry is working together to help build and sustain. This work is being done across the jurisdictional lines of three Grand Lodge Jurisdictions. It is being done in harmony. And it is proof that if positive motives are in our hearts, that the Light of Freemasonry can shine brighter.

I want to express my thanks to R.W. Bro. Sam Roberts for asking me to be the Prince Hall Liaison, for his enthusiastic support of these rebuilding initiatives, and for giving me personal support through the trying time of Bro. Murray's passing, as I was dealing with a family member of my own who was in a hospice.

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm at the Ottawa Masonic Centre, 2140 Walkley Road, Ottawa ON.

#### MINUTES OF THE DISTRICT MEETING

- 1. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm at the Ottawa Masonic Centre, 2140 Walkley Road, Ottawa ON.
- 2. Invocation was given by W. Bro. Jace Bart, District Chaplain. W. Bro. Baart delivered an inspiring invocation followed closely by the tasteful "a man goes to heaven" groaner joke. CLOSED
- 3. Attendance

Including R.W. Bro. Sam Roberts – D.D.G.M. Ottawa District No.1 as per the enclosed sign in sheets was sixty (60) Brethren. Regrets were registered by: R.W. Bro. Brian Adams – Carleton No.465 and V. W. Bro. Ivan Harris – Hazeldean No.517, V. W. Bro. Gord Echlin – Mississippi No.147, V.W. Bro. Larry Harvey – Lodge of Fidelity No.231; W. Bro. James Kent – Lodge of Fidelity No.231 and W. Bro. Don Learning – Secretary, Ottawa District No.1. CLOSED

- 4. Welcoming Remarks R.W. Bro. Sam Roberts, DDGM, Ottawa 1
  - a. R.W. Bro. Roberts acknowledged the Grand Lodge officers, present and past.
  - b. R.W. Bro. Roberts welcomed the brethren and thanked them for their support during this past year. To the applause of the brethren present he further stated that it was his distinct honour and privilege to serve the brethren of Ottawa District 1 on a personal journey of Masonic discovery.
  - c. R.W. Bro. Roberts reported that thus far he has travelled 8000 km to 62 events in multiple lodges, towns and cities.

- 5. Approval Minutes of previous District Meeting

- 6. District Chairmen End-year Reports
  - a. **GL Programs W. Bro. Dan Gray**. W. Bro. Dan Gray thanked R.W. Bro. Roberts D.D.G.M. before reading out his final report stating that this year's focus was on the Grand Lodge Cornerstone programme. W. Bro. - 8. GL Hospitality Suite Booking and Funding R.W. Bro. Kosta Hatzis
  - On a motion by R.W. Bro. Hatzis, seconded by V. W. Bro. Ian Hooker, the notice of motion as read at the District Meeting of January 28th was approved unanimously viz.

  - After presenting the necessary updates to the Bylaws of Ottawa District 1 by

     John Guinn the updates were approved unanimously. CARRIED
  - b. Full text of W. Bro. Bryce's Bylaws update
    - i. That Article 1, Section 1, item b, be stricken.
    - ii. That Article 4, Section 4, be re-organized into items, secret balloting be removed, and that scrutineers be at the discretion of the D.D.G.M.
    - iii. That Article 4, Section 1, indicate the D.D.G.M. be elected by electronic ballot.

    - v. That Article 4, Section 5 include a limitation on Financial Examiners serving more than two consecutive terms unless at the discretion of the D.D.G.M.

- b. W. Bro. Garcia stated that the Day of Masonry, May 17th has already sold seventy (70) tickets and has fifteen (15) presenters for a total of eighty-five (85) attendees so far. Tickets from Eventbrite are on sale until one week prior to the Day. CLOSED
- 11. Hospitality Suite at Grand Lodge 2025

  - a. R. W. Bro. Roberts called for nominations for the positions of District Financial Examiners for the ensuing Masonic year.
  - b. R.W. Bro. Saikaley and R.W. Bro. Don Healey both were honoured to accept the nomination.
  - c. On a motion by W. Bro. Halcro, seconded by V.W. Bro. Sandy Stewart the nominees were accepted. CARRIED
- 15. R. W. Bro. Roberts called for nominations for the office of District Deputy Grand Master Ottawa District No.1 to be voted upon for the ensuing Masonic year or 2025/2026.

- b. R.W. Bro. Roberts, hearing no additional nominations, asked three (3) more times for any additional nominations. Hearing none, he ordered the nominations closed.

Don Learning and their respective ladies for all their dedication and hard work to make the 2024/2025 Masonic year such a success for Ottawa District 1. CARRIED

### Beechwood Cemetery - Masonic Burial Plot

#### A History of The Ottawa Masonic Burial Plot in Ottawa, Ontario at Beechwood Cemetery

The Masonic lodge system was first developed to, among other things, help, socially, and in benevolence toward its members and families. In 1855 in Ontario, when our Grand Lodge was formed, there was no public safety net within our communities in which anyone could rely. This was one of the prime motivators for those who joined the fraternity. Charity was, and is, an important concept taught to everyone who is initiated into the Order.

Up until the early 1960s Canadians, for the most part, had no official help from public sources. Taking notice of Saskatchewan's health care reforms, brought about by Tommy Douglas's provincial government, the federal government under John Diefenbaker put together a national health care plan that was finally instituted by the next government leader, Lester Pearson.

Freemasons believe in charity, and the greatest form of charity, one mason toward another, is to aid in the final disposition of a brother's mortal remains when he has gone to the Grand Lodge Above.


In modern times it is hard to imagine the hardship placed on families in those times when tasked with the preparation and transportation of the dead for a journey even to the next town prior to the widespread use of the automobile. The lack of understanding of disease transmission even led to an Ottawa Ordinance to only allow cemeteries to allow burials outside the boundaries of the city. This added even further complexity to the problem. Even a cemetery, previously in Sandy Hill, was moved primarily; the bodies ended up at Beechwood Cemetery, which was just outside the municipal boundary at the time. It stood to reason that local masons would step in to help avoid the forced impoverishment and distress of relatives when entrusted with a brother's care.

The Ottawa Masonic Board of Relief was constituted with the enactment of its bylaws on December 3, 1875. It helped masons and their families through many concerns, also including taking care of an indigent mason's burial when entrusted to their care. In January 1876 the Board bought the land in the then new Beechwood Cemetery, which had been previously established in 1873, known as the "Masonic Burial Plot", costing \$350. The first burial seems to have happened in grave number 1, two years later. It is likely Beechwood was selected since most local masonic lodges met in down-town Ottawa and the cemetery had its office on Sparks Street, in the heart of the city. Interestingly, while never a mason, Tommy Douglas also rests in another part of Beechwood Cemetery.

The idea of establishing a District-wide Masonic Burial Plot was not original to Ottawa, however our example pre-dates the pattern of similar likenesses found in Toronto and Sarnia. The initiative seems to have originated in the United States in the latter half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The earliest I have found of this masonic practice was a monument found in New York State unveiled in 1872.

The Masonic Burial plot at Beechwood is in section 37, lot number 83. It is 20 feet (6.1m) East to West and 50 feet (15.2m) North to South. It has been used exclusively for indigent masons since its start. Name markers are not part of the service provided by the Board to protect the privacy of a brother who may have distressingly died in poverty. There have been newspaper reports, probably placed by family members, reporting specific burials and one family has had a marker placed in the grass and in one other case, at the expense of her family, the wife of a departed brother, after predeceasing her, had her ashes deposited next to him. These are exceptions to our long-held practice of not publicly identifying those within the gravesite or joining other family members. While the Plot has space for 24 full casket burials, only cremated remains are interred, thereby making room for 750, all placed in an Easterly orientation. There are fewer than 100 in total laid to rest at the plot as of the end of 2022. Most of them prior to the 1940s. There have been a few, however, laid to rest there into the 20-teens.





On Thursday, May 31, 1888, at the conclusion of a Grand Lodge Communication, held at the Byward Market Building in Ottawa the Deputy Grand Master led a large delegation of masons and their families to Beechwood Cemetery to unveil a monument on the plot land.

The report discovered in the **Ottawa Citizen** of Friday, June 1 states:

"The scheme of a Beechwood burial plot was conceived by the late Right Worshipful Bro. Kerr, who, in conjunction Bro. E. D. Parlow, Chairman of the Burial Plot Committee, and Bro. S. W. H. Baldwin, Secretary Treasurer, were largely instrumental in carrying the scheme to a successful issue, being ably assisted by the following brethren, also members of the committee, viz:

Some dozen of the deceased brotherhood have already been buried in the plot. The extra cost of the plot and monument is in the vicinity of \$2000 (almost \$63000 in 2023 dollars). It is one of the most tasteful and imposing structures in the cemetery and is composed of two heavy granite bases surmounted by stonework bearing the words "Masonic Burial Plot" and various emblems of the Order, upon which rests the altar, with a volume of the sacred law open thereon, surrounded by four polished red granite columns, which support the upper part, upon also are inscribed various emblems. The whole is surmounted by a polished granite globe symbolic of the university of masonry."

Reports of the unveiling of the 13 feet (4m) tall by 4 feet (1.2m) wide, monument at the Masonic Burial Plot, as well as the consecration of new lodge facilities and an "At Home" held on the same day, can also be found in the **1888 Grand Lodge Proceedings:**

In addition to the ceremonies of Consecration and Dedication reported

herewith, a large number of brethren assembled in the afternoon of the same day and went out to Beechwood Cemetery where the beautiful monument on the Masonic Burial Plot was unveiled, and an excellent address was given to the brethren and the public present by R. W. Bro. Walkem. In the evening of the same day an "At Home" was held in the Masonic Hall, attended by fully a thousand friends of the brethren. The day's proceedings wound up with a banquet in honour of Grand Lodge.

Probably the most important Masonic event of the year, so far as the Capital is concerned, was the consecration and dedication of the new Masonic Hall, on May 31st. A special communication of Grand Lodge was held, and in the presence of over two hundred city and visiting brethren, R. W. Bro. R. T. Walkem, D. G. M., performed the solemn duties devolving upon him in a most impressive manner. The new Temple, for such it may well be designated, was built by Bro. E. Wallace, and has been leased from him by the city Lodges for the term of ten years. It contains a large Lodge room, handsomely furnished, with commodious anterooms, refreshment room, lavatories, etc., in fact possesses every convenience, and is certainly a hall of which the Ottawa District have every reason to be proud. Later in the day, R. W. Bro. Walkem, attended by a large number of brethren, proceeded to Beechwood cemetery, and there in the presence of several hundred spectators the acting Grand Master unveiled the beautiful monument recently erected on the Masonic burial plot.

In the evening an "At Home" was held in the new hall, at which about a thousand Masons and their lady friends were present. Subsequently a banquet was tendered by the R. W. the acting Grand Master, at the Grand Union Hotel, (This appears to be the same building found at the corner of Sparks St. and Elgin today.) and at which nearly one hundred and fifty brethren sat down. The affair was a great success and was a fitting termination of a memorable day's work. At the different assemblages R. W. Bro. Walkem delivered earnest practical addresses which will long be remembered by those who heard them. This was Bro. Walkem's first official visit to Ottawa, and by his genial disposition, his knowledge of Craft lore, and the ability with which he fulfilled all the important duties devolved upon him, he entirely won the hearts of all the brethren.

Other details of note include the purchase of perpetual care for the site in 1921. Also, very interestingly, after the unveiling, and at least until the 1930s, where there is a sporadic journalistic record, that every year, on June 24<sup>th</sup> (St. John Baptiste Day – who is the patron saint of Freemasonry) the local brethren would have a remembrance service at the plot in memory of our past brethren.

June 24<sup>th</sup>, 2023, dispensation was received and Lodge of Fidelity 231 hosted a 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary Remembrance Service at the Masonic Plot. The Cemetery has further booked the Sunday closest to June 24<sup>th</sup> moving forward for this tradition to continue.

# Lessons from My Father: A Journey of Integrity, Humility, and Resilience Through Masonic Values

Presented to St. John's Lodge on October 9, 2024

#### The Power of Choice in Masonic Leadership

The young man who laughed at the woman's fall made another choice, one of mockery rather than empathy. And finally, he made yet another choice, when he stopped laughing, stepped forward, and took responsibility for holding the door.

Brethren, life is a journey defined by choices. Every step we take, and every decision we make, shapes who we are and what we stand for. As Masons, we understand that our choices are not just about ourselves; they are a reflection of the values we hold dear and a testament to the principles we uphold.

#### **Building Character Through Choices**

The Power of Unity: The Ember and the Fire

Presented to Doric Lodge on October 17, 2024

Brethren, as I look around, I'm reminded of the unique bond we share as Masons. A bond that brings us together from different Lodges, communities, and even countries. Tonight, I want to talk about something that lies at the heart of who we are: the strength we find in unity and the light we bring into the world, both individually and as a Fraternity.

Let me begin with a simple story that highlights the strength we draw from staying connected and the vital role each of us plays in building something greater together. A Brother, who has walked many years on the path of Freemasonry, was once invited to a social event at the home of a Mason in his district. During the course of the evening, one of the brethren remarked, "You know, you don't have to attend Lodge to be a good Mason." This seasoned brother listened, but rather than respond with words, he walked over to the fireplace, took the tongs, and carefully lifted a glowing ember from the fire. He placed it alone on the hearth, away from the other embers and flames.

He said to the brethren, we all know what happens next. Deprived of the heat from the other embers, it began to cool, its glow faded, and it grew cold and dark. However, if you were to take that same ember and place it back within the fire, it would regain its warmth, its brightness, and its power to contribute to the collective heat. Brethren, this simple act speaks volumes. When we, as Masons, separate ourselves from the fraternity, our light diminishes. Presented to Sidney Albert Luke Lodge November 13, 2024

This evening I'd like to talk about something very close to my heart: the success and stability of a Masonic Lodge. I want to draw an analogy that I believe speaks to all of us but resonates especially with my own experiences serving in the Navy as an engineer. Running a Masonic Lodge has much in common with running a Navy ship. Both require discipline, leadership, and a team of dedicated individuals who understand that each role, no matter how big or small, is essential to maintaining a steady course and achieving the mission.

The Captain oversees all operations, the Officer of the Watch supervises daily activities, engineers ensure the machinery and propulsion systems run smoothly, and every crew member looks after their assigned roles and responsibilities. As an engineer, I know that for a ship to succeed, every person, department, and section must work harmoniously. If even one person fails to fulfil their role, it can lead to confusion and even jeopardize the success and safety of everyone aboard.

In our Lodge, each Brother holds an equally important role. Whether you are Master of the Lodge, a Junior Warden, or an Entered Apprentice, just beginning your masonic journey, you have a duty to be diligent, respectful, and engaged. When we treat our positions in the Lodge with the same respect and seriousness that we held dear in the Navy, we create an environment that is structured, supportive, and effective. Brethren, a Lodge that operates with such respect and organization is a Lodge that thrives.

If you find yourself on the sidelines, ask yourself how you might step up. Think about what you can bring to the Lodge and how you can make a difference. Perhaps you can mentor a new member, volunteer for a role, or simply commit to attending more regularly. Whatever it is, your contribution matters.

#### The Man in the Glass and the Journey of a Mason

Presented to Civil Service Lodge on February 11, 2025

#### Brethren,

Our Lodge is a place of tradition, wisdom, and brotherhood, a refuge from the distractions of the outside world, where we can reflect on the deeper truths of life. I want to share some thoughts on a subject that speaks to the heart of what we strive to be as Masons: self-examination and personal integrity.

As Masons, we are constantly reminded of our duty to improve ourselves, to build our own spiritual and moral temples, and to uphold the virtues that define our Craft. Our symbols and rituals teach us that life is a journey of self-discovery and refinement. But how do we truly measure our progress? Is it by the titles we earn, the positions we hold, or the recognition we receive from others?

I would argue that the true measure of a Mason is something much deeper, something far more personal. It is found in the quiet moments when we are alone with our thoughts, when we stand before the mirror and face the one person from whom we can never hide, ourselves.

Tonight, I want to share with you a poem that has resonated with many over the years. It was first published in 1934 by Peter Dale Wimbrow Sr., and its message is as relevant today as it was nearly a century ago. It is called *The Man in the Glass*.

#### The Man in the Glass

When you get what you want in your struggle for self And the world makes you king for a day Just go to the mirror and look at yourself And see what that man has to say.

There is something profound about these opening lines. We all seek success in life, whether in our careers, our personal ambitions, or even within Freemasonry itself. We work hard, we take on responsibilities, and we strive to leave our mark on the world. But at the end of the day, when all the applause fades and the distractions of daily life are stripped away, there is only one person whose judgment truly matters: the man in the glass.

For it is not your father, or mother, or wife Whose judgment upon you must pass The fellow whose verdict counts most in your life Is the one staring back from the glass.

One of the great lessons of Freemasonry is that external validation means little if we are not at peace within ourselves. The world may praise us, our peers may admire us, and society may call us successful, but if we have compromised our integrity along the way, what have we truly gained?

Masonry teaches us that success is not measured by wealth, power, or prestige, but by the content of our character. A Mason should never act simply to gain the approval of others, but rather because it is right. Our obligation is not to impress, but to uphold the principles of Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth in all our undertakings.

He is the fellow to please, never mind all the rest For he is with you, clear to the end And you have passed your most difficult and dangerous test If the man in the glass is your friend.

Think about that for a moment. The most difficult and dangerous test is not the challenges the world throws at us, but the challenge of staying true to ourselves. Every day, we are faced with choices, some small and some significant. Do we act with integrity even when no one is watching? Do we stay true to our values when it would be easier to take shortcuts? Do we extend kindness and understanding when it would be easier to judge?

As Masons, we are called to take the harder but higher road. We are called to be men of our word. We are called to act justly, not only when it is convenient, but when it is difficult. We are called to be men of honor, even when doing so brings no recognition or reward.

You may fool the whole world down the pathway of years And get pats on the back as you pass But your final reward will be heartache and tears If you have cheated the man in the glass.

Brethren, we live in an age where appearances often matter more than substance. In a world of social media, public accolades, and constant comparisons, it is easy to become more concerned with how we are perceived than with who we truly are. But Freemasonry has always stood apart from this. Our Craft does not measure a man by his wealth, his reputation, or his social status. It measures him by his character, his virtue, and his dedication to self-improvement.

We are taught that the tools of Masonry are meant to shape our own character. The plumb reminds us to walk uprightly, the square instructs us to act fairly, and the compasses guide us to control our desires and keep our actions within due bounds. But these tools only work if we use them, not just in Lodge, but in our everyday lives.

#### The Temple Within

Every Mason is engaged in building a temple, not one made of stone, but one built within. Our own internal temple is constructed one decision at a time, through our actions, our words, and our interactions with others. The question we must ask ourselves is:

Am I building with integrity? Am I staying true to the principles I have sworn to uphold?

There is no Master Mason's apron, no rank, and no title that can disguise a man's true nature. The greatest men in history have not been those with the highest status, but those who stood firm in their convictions and led by example.

This is why self-examination is important. Our ritual tells us to look within, to subdue our passions, and to refine our rough ashlars into perfect stones. But self-examination is not always easy. It requires honesty, courage, and humility.

It is easy to judge others. It is far harder to judge ourselves. As Masons, we should welcome self-reflection because it is through this process that we grow. It is through this process that we ensure that, when we stand before the mirror, the man staring back is truly our friend.

#### **Final Reflections**

Brethren, I leave you with this thought. When our time on this Earth comes to an end, and we lay down our working tools, what will our legacy be? Will we be remembered for our titles, or for the way we treated others? Will we be known for our accomplishments, or for our kindness, humility, and unwavering commitment to truth?

Masonry teaches us that the real rewards of life are not material, but moral. The most important honor a man can have is the peace of knowing he has lived rightly. Brethren, I challenge each of us to take a moment before we sleep to stand before our own reflection and ask:

Is the man in the glass my friend?

If the answer is yes, then we can rest with the quiet confidence that we have walked uprightly, lived justly, and honoured our Masonic obligations.

If the answer is uncertain, then let that reflection not be a source of despair, but a call to action. Each new day grants us the working tools to chisel away our imperfections, to stand a little straighter, and to live a little truer to the principles we hold dear. For in the end, no title, wealth, or praise will define us. Only the legacy of our character, the sincerity of our actions, and the integrity of the man we see in the glass will remain.

#### The Thin Blue Line and the Fraternity of Freemasonry

Presented to Mississippi Lodge on February 20, 2025

### Brethren,

Tonight, I stand before you, reflecting on two profound callings in my life, my career as a police officer and my journey into Freemasonry. At first glance, they may seem like separate paths, but when we look deeper, we see that both are built on the same fundamental principles.

In policing, we often speak of the thin blue line, a symbol of the men and women who stand between order and chaos, between good and evil. It represents a commitment to duty, to one another, and to the people we serve. Freemasonry, too, has a line that binds us, a sacred bond of brotherhood, built upon the principles of **Brotherly Love**, **Relief**, **and Truth**.

While one uniform is worn in service to the law and the other in service to virtue, both require loyalty, sacrifice, and trust. Both demand that we look out for one another, that we hold ourselves to a higher standard, and that we never turn our backs on those who stand beside us.

#### **Brotherhood and Trust in the Line of Duty**

In my years as a police officer, I stood shoulder to shoulder with my brothers and sisters in uniform. The reality of the job was clear: when we put on that badge, we placed our trust, our very lives in each other's hands. It was not an abstract idea or a noble phrase. It was a necessity.

When responding to calls, when entering unknown danger, when making split-second decisions, I knew that the officers beside me would be there no matter the cost. That trust

was forged through shared experiences, through hardship, and through the unwavering commitment to each other's safety.

And yet, as powerful as that trust was, it was a trust bound by duty. It was my job to trust my colleagues with my life, and it was theirs to trust me with theirs.

But tonight, I stand before you to say that there is a trust even greater than this.

#### The Trust of a Mason

Brethren, we often speak of the lessons of Freemasonry, lessons of moral character, integrity, and virtue. But beyond the ritual, beyond the words spoken within these walls, there is something even more profound. It is the trust that exists within this fraternity, not just in times of crisis but in all aspects of life.

In my policing career, I trusted my colleagues with my life because that was my job. But as a Mason, I trust a brother with something far more precious. I trust my child to a brother Mason.

Think about that for a moment.

There is no higher measure of faith in a man than entrusting him with the care and protection of your child. And yet, in this sacred brotherhood, that level of trust is not just expected, it is inherent. It is built into the very fabric of who we are as Masons.

This trust does not come from standing in the line of duty together. It does not come from facing danger side by side. It comes from something even stronger. It comes from knowing that every Mason in this room has taken the same obligations, has committed himself to the same virtues, and has pledged to live by the same sacred principles that have guided our fraternity for centuries.

#### Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth

The thin blue line is a symbol of unity among officers, but in Freemasonry, we have a line that is even older, even stronger. It is the line that connects us through Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth.

**Brotherly Love** is what binds us as a fraternity. It is what ensures that we care for one another not out of duty, but out of genuine affection and respect. It is what allows me to say, without hesitation, that I would trust any Mason in this room with the well-being of my child.

**Relief** is what defines our actions beyond these walls. Just as police officers run toward danger to protect others, we as Masons are called upon to offer support and aid wherever it is needed. Whether it is a brother in distress or a community in need, we do not turn away. We do not hesitate. We step forward, guided by the principles of our Craft.

And finally, **Truth** is the foundation of everything we stand for. In law enforcement, truth is what we seek, even when it is difficult, even when it is uncomfortable. In Freemasonry, truth is the guiding principle of our lives. It is the unwavering commitment to honesty, to justice, and to righteousness. It is what ensures that every Mason is a man of his word, a man whose trust is unquestionable.

#### A Final Reflection

Brethren, as I reflect on my journey in both policing and Freemasonry, I am struck by one undeniable truth. The thin blue line may separate chaos from order, but the line that binds us as Masons is even greater. It is not a line of separation. It is a line of unity, of shared purpose, and of enduring trust.

There are men I trusted with my life, and I will forever honor them. But in this sacred brotherhood, I trust my brothers not just with my life, but with my legacy, my family, and my deepest values.

That is the power of Freemasonry. That is the trust that exists within these walls. That is why we do what we do.

Brethren, as we leave this lodge tonight, let us carry that trust forward, not as a mere obligation, but as a sacred duty. Let us live our principles with unwavering conviction, not only in the company of Masons but in every aspect of our lives. Let us be the steady hands in uncertain times, the voices of reason in moments of discord, and the light that others seek in times of darkness.

Our families, our communities, and even those who do not yet understand what it means to be a Mason are looking for men of honour, men of integrity, and men of action. Let them find that in us. Let them see in us the embodiment of Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth. Let them know that when they place their trust in a Mason, they place it in a man who will never waver, never falter, and never turn away from his duty.

Brethren, we are bound by something greater than tradition, greater than ceremony. We are bound by an unshakable trust, one that demands we live with honour, lead with conviction and stand unwavering in the face of challenge. Let us prove ourselves worthy, not just in words, but in action, today, tomorrow, and for all time.

### The Importance of Trust in Leadership

Presented to Edinburgh Defenders Lodge on March 5th, 2025

#### Brethren.

As we gather in the Lodge, bound by the principles of Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth, I wish to speak on a matter that is at the heart of leadership, trust. Without trust, no leader can inspire, no organization can thrive, and no community can stand the test of time. It is trust that binds the leader to those who follow, and it is the currency with which all great leaders transact.

Leadership is not a position; it is an influence. And that influence, if not rooted in trust, will soon fade. Many individuals in leadership roles today struggle with whom they can trust, creating uncertainty and instability in decision-making. If in the highest levels of leadership there is doubt about trust, then surely the need to reaffirm this virtue is paramount.

Without trust, even the most competent leader will struggle to inspire loyalty, action, and progress. However, trust is not a one-sided agreement; it must be reciprocated by those being led. If the leader has demonstrated the foundation of trust through credibility, respect, and fairness, then the followers must also place their trust in the leader's vision and direction.

#### The Foundation of Trust

The Great Workplaces model emphasizes that the foundation of a great organization is built on three pillars: credibility, respect, and fairness. These principles are not only vital in the corporate world but also in our Masonic Lodges, in our families, and in every leadership role we undertake.

1. **Credibility** - A leader must be truthful, competent, and consistent. It is not enough to have a vision; one must be able to communicate it honestly and demonstrate the ability to bring

it to fruition. Likewise, followers must recognize and trust in this credibility, allowing themselves to be guided by it.

- 2. **Respect** A true leader values those he leads.He listens, supports growth, and ensures every Brother feels valued. Respect fosters loyalty, and loyalty fortifies trust. However, for a leader to lead effectively, those being led must respect and trust in the leader's guidance and decisions.
- 3. **Fairness** Favoritism, bias, and discrimination erode trust faster than any external crisis. A just leader ensures that all are treated with equity, that rewards are earned, and that everyone has a voice. But fairness also requires that followers trust that their leader is acting in their best interest and that decisions are made for the collective good.

When a leader lacks these qualities, trust is compromised, and when trust is compromised, unity crumbles. However, when these principles are evident in leadership, those being led must embrace and trust in their leader's direction. Let us remember that our fraternity stands strong because we uphold these Masonic virtues in all our dealings.

### **Trust in Action: Leadership Stories**

Consider two leaders, one who demanded immediate change and another who first sought to understand before acting.

In one instance, a new Leader took over an organization and quickly imposed his ideas, promising support that never materialized. He lost the trust of those he led, and though they followed his commands, they did so with reluctance and skepticism. Without trust, his vision was never fully realized.

In another case, a leader took over a struggling organization and, rather than rushing into changes, first took the time to understand the challenges and processes in place. He made small but meaningful improvements, gained the trust of his team, and then introduced larger changes. With trust established, the organization flourished. But it was not just the leader's trustworthiness that made the difference, it was the willingness of those being led to place their trust in their leader. Trust works both ways and when it is reciprocated, great things can be achieved.

Trust is not built in a moment; it is earned through consistency, transparency, and integrity. Once earned, it must be reinforced by both the leader and the followers, working in unison toward a common goal.

#### The Masonic Leader and Trust

As Masons, we are all leaders in some capacity. Whether within our Lodge, our profession, or our community, we influence others. We must ask ourselves:

- Do we keep our word?
- Do we lead with humility?
- Do we act with integrity when no one is watching?
- Do we place trust in those who have demonstrated they are trustworthy?

In Masonry, we learn that the compasses teach us to draw a boundary around our desires and actions, ensuring that we act with honour. The square reminds us to be fair and just. These tools are not just symbols; they are lessons in how to build trust in our leadership. But leadership is a partnership, and just as we expect trust in our principles, we must be willing to trust in those who lead us when they have proven themselves worthy of it.

A lot of research on trust has been conducted and highlights two key factors in building trust, the safety score and the certainty score.

- 1. **The Safety Score** measures how much risk someone is willing to take based on their confidence in the leader. A leader who is honest, transparent, and supportive increases this safety score, allowing followers to feel secure in taking bold steps forward.
- 2. **The Certainty Score** evaluates how predictable and reliable a leader is. A leader who is consistent in his actions and fair in his decisions increases this certainty, reinforcing trust.

These are not abstract concepts; they are the principles by which we govern ourselves as Masons. A leader who has demonstrated a strong safety and certainty score is deserving of the trust of those he leads. Without this mutual trust, progress is hindered.

#### The Hand We Hold

Trust is not about a single act; it is about a relationship. It is like a father and child crossing a bridge. When the father asks his daughter to hold his hand, she replies, "No, Dad. You hold my hand." She understands that if she holds his hand, she may let go in fear. But if he holds hers, he will never let go, no matter what happens.

As leaders, we must be that father. We must be the ones who hold the hands of those who trust us, who guide them through the uncertainties of life, and who never let go. But at the same time, those who follow must trust that the hand reaching out to them is strong and unwavering. Trust is not a one-sided contract; it is a mutual commitment.

#### **Conclusion: The Challenge Before Us**

Brethren, trust is not a mere word, it is an obligation. It is a covenant between leader and follower, Brother and Brother. It is what makes us strong, what makes us united, and what allows us to uphold the principles of our Craft in a world that often lacks integrity.

If you wish to lead, then commit yourself to trust. Be honest in your words, just in your actions, and steadfast in your principles. Likewise, if you follow, be willing to place trust in those who have earned it. The strength of our fraternity and indeed the strength of our world depends on those who are willing to lead with trust and those who are willing to follow with trust.

Let us go forth from this meeting not just as Masons, but as beacons of trust in a world that too often falters in its commitments. Leadership is not about holding a title, it is about

holding the confidence of those who follow. The bonds of trust we forge today will determine the strength of our future. Trust is not given lightly, nor is it kept without effort, but when it stands unbroken, it becomes the foundation upon which all great endeavours are built. In the end, it is not power, wealth, or knowledge that defines true leadership, it is trust, earned and upheld, that shapes legacies and inspires generations to come.

### "Stop at Nothing" - A Masonic Reflection on Determination and Complacency

Presented to Prince of Wales Lodge on March 28, 2025

#### Brethren,

It is an honour to stand before you in a lodge filled with our brethren, bound together by the enduring principles of Freemasonry, Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth. Tonight, I wish to speak on a phrase that, at first glance, may seem contradictory: "Stop at Nothing."

A phrase with two meanings. On one hand, it describes a person of unwavering determination, a brother who will let no obstacle deter him from fulfilling his obligations, whether in the Lodge, in his home, or within the broader community. He will stop at nothing to support, to plan, and to uplift those around him.

On the other hand, it can just as easily describe one who falters before even beginning; a man who stops at nothing, meaning he stops before he has even taken the first step. A Brother who sees challenges not as opportunities, but as reasons to do nothing.

This is the great divide between action and inaction, between leadership and apathy, between those who push forward and those who stand idle.

#### The Masonic Call to Action

As Masons, we are charged with improving ourselves and, in turn, the world around us. Our teachings are clear: we are builders, not by trade, but by principle. We build character. We build relationships. We build communities.

Consider the rough ashlar and the perfect ashlar, symbols that remind us that our work is never complete. We labor to smooth our own imperfections, and we do so with

perseverance. A Mason who truly embodies "Stop at Nothing" will see challenges not as barriers, but as tests of his resolve.

When a brother falls into hardship, does he say, "This is too great a burden," or does he stop at nothing to extend his hand in aid?

When a Lodge struggles to thrive, does he lament its decline, or does he stop at nothing to breathe new life into it?

When injustice or suffering exists in the world, does he look away, or does he stop at nothing to be a force for good?

Our teachings compel us to act, to lead, to serve. We must be men of vision, stepping forward with confidence. If a Lodge is in decline, then let us stop at nothing to rejuvenate it. If a brother is struggling, then let us stop at nothing to lift him up. If society is faltering, then let us stop at nothing to uphold truth, morality, and justice.

### The Danger of Complacency

Brethren, we must also acknowledge the other side of this phrase. There are those who stop before they begin. Who hesitate, who make excuses, who convince themselves that their effort is unnecessary, unwelcome, or insufficient. This, my brethren, is the slow erosion of what makes us Masons.

We have seen Lodges that fade, not from lack of history or purpose, but from lack of action. We have seen men with great potential never rise beyond the first step because they believed the work was too difficult.

We have seen communities suffer because good men stood by and did nothing. Freemasonry is built upon action. Our ancient brethren were builders in the truest sense, men who shaped stone and raised great edifices. Yet, if the stonemason never lifted his chisel, never placed his mortar, never laid his bricks, what would stand in his wake? Nothing.

And so it is with us. We must remind ourselves that stopping at nothing is a choice. We can either press forward with courage and commitment, or we can choose to stand still, to watch, to let opportunities slip through our fingers.

It is easy to say, "Someone else will do it." But who, if not us? It is easy to say, "Another day." But when, if not now?

Every great accomplishment in history, every temple built, every nation founded, every advancement that has bettered humanity, was achieved because someone stopped at nothing to make it happen.

And the opposite is also true. Every Lodge that failed, every society that decayed, every noble cause that faded into irrelevance, these were lost not through force or conflict, but through inaction, through waiting too long, through stopping before the first step was ever taken.

### Leadership Beyond the Lodge

True Masonic leadership is not found solely within these walls; it extends beyond, into our homes, our professions, and our communities. A Mason who stops at nothing in his family ensures that he is a steadfast father, husband, and mentor. He does not merely exist in the household; he is a pillar of support and wisdom. He does not ignore his duties; he embraces them. He does not let work or distractions pull him away from those who depend on him; rather, he stops at nothing to be present, to guide, to love.

A Mason who stops at nothing in his profession strives not only for success but for integrity. He does not cut corners or take the easy path; he walks the path of honor, even when it is difficult. He upholds the highest ethical standards, ensuring that his word is his bond, and his work is his legacy.

A Mason who stops at nothing in his community is not merely a spectator. He does not ask, "What can be done?", he does it. He does not wait for others to lead; he leads by example. He does not pass by suffering without offering comfort; he does not ignore injustice without speaking truth; he does not sit idly when his hands can work, his mind can plan, and his heart can give.

Brethren, the world outside the Lodge needs Masons who stop at nothing for justice, for kindness, for the betterment of mankind.

#### A Final Reflection: Which Man Are You?

And so, I leave you with this question:

When faced with a challenge, do you stop at nothing to overcome it... or do you stop at nothing, and do nothing at all?

Do you lead, or do you wait? Do you build, or do you watch? Do you stand for what is right, or do you sit in silence?

Each of us, when we entered Freemasonry, took an obligation, not just to ourselves, but to our brethren, our families, and to the world around us. That obligation was not a momentary pledge, nor was it confined to the walls of this Lodge. It is a lifelong commitment to be better men, to act with integrity, to lead with courage, and to serve with unwavering dedication.

Brethren, when we leave this meeting tonight, let us carry that obligation with us. Let us stop at nothing to exemplify the virtues we uphold. Let us stop at nothing to be the light in

times of darkness, the strength in times of doubt, and the steady hand when others falter. Let us stop at nothing to build, not only a stronger Lodge but a stronger world.

For one day, when our working tools are laid down and our earthly labors are complete, what will define us will not be the words we spoke, but the actions we took. The measure of a Mason is not found in his intentions, but in his deeds.

So, I ask you, my brethren, what will you stop at nothing to achieve?

#### The Masonic First Responder: Always There, Because That Is What We Do

Presented to Russell Lodge on April 21, 2025

My Brethren,

Tonight, I rise not only as a Freemason but as a witness to the quiet heroism that defines our Craft. We often hear lofty words in our ceremonies and read poetic lines from our rituals, but occasionally, we are given the privilege of seeing those words come alive through action. What I want to share with you is more than a story. It is a reflection of who we are and who we strive to be.

A call came out. Not an emergency tone blaring from a radio, but a quiet message passed along Masonic channels. A brother was dying. He was not from our lodge. He was not from our district. In fact, he was not even from our jurisdiction. And yet, he made one final request: that a Mason be present to support him on his journey to the Grand Lodge Above. This Brother, whose name was unknown to us, had laid down his working tools for the final time. His journey was nearing its end. Though his immediate family stood by his side, no one from his own Lodge could be reached to answer his last request.

And so, as the shadows lengthened and his strength faded, all he had left was a quiet hope that the Brotherhood he had once sat among, the Craft he had pledged himself to decades ago, would not forget him. Would not abandon him. Would be there when it mattered most. And someone was.

A Brother from our District heard the call. At that very moment, he too was walking his own path of sorrow, his own family member lay dying. Yet when that call came, not shouted but whispered, he answered.

He stepped away from his own heartbreak and stepped into a hospital room where a Brother lay slipping into eternity.

That Brother had fallen into a coma. He would not wake again. But he would not be alone. Because our Brother sat beside him. Held his hand. And in that still room, he gave what every Mason hopes for at the end:

The comfort of knowing he was not forgotten.

The peace of knowing he was with a Brother.

The silent reassurance that the Craft keeps its word, even unto death. Why? Because that is what we do.

This story echoes another moment etched into my heart. When I assumed the office of District Deputy Grand Master, I was met with a similar moment of truth. A Brother had passed away, again, unknown to us, a stranger by all worldly definitions. He belonged to a different lodge, a different place, a different past. But he was a Mason. That was all that mattered.

And so, the Brethren of Ottawa District One moved with urgency and dignity. They dropped what they were doing. They changed plans, cancelled meetings, rearranged work and family commitments, and they came. They came to give that Brother a proper Masonic Memorial Service. They came to uphold the promise we make, the sacred trust we share. Because that is what we do.

Brethren, these stories are not dramatic. There are no flashing lights, no applause, no news headlines. But they are heroic. And they mirror the noble calling of another set of men and women we all know well: our first responders.

Think for a moment about what defines a first responder. Is it the uniform? The title? No. It is the unwavering commitment to answer the call when others turn away. It is the decision to run toward the need, not from it. It is the instinct to place duty before comfort and service before self.

Does that not sound familiar, my Brethren?

We, too, are first responders of a different kind. Not to physical emergencies, perhaps, but to moral ones. Not to fire or flood, but to loneliness, to despair, to that aching question: "Will anyone be there for me when I need them most?"

And we answer. Silently. Steadily. Faithfully.

In a world increasingly fragmented, where relationships are transactional and community is conditional, Freemasonry dares to offer something different. Something ancient. Something beautiful. A brotherhood rooted not in convenience but in commitment. A

fraternity built on the foundation that when one man suffers, all feel it; when one man calls, we all answer.

There is a reason why our teachings emphasize relief as one of our core tenets. Relief is not simply charity; it is presence. It is a handheld in silence. It is a Brother arriving at your door not because he was asked, but because he knew he was needed. Relief is what happens when men of character live out the obligations they swore to uphold.

The stories I have shared tonight are not anomalies. They are examples. They are proof that Masonry is alive and well, not only in the halls and lodge rooms or printed minutes but in the hearts of men who live their obligations.

Each of us, when we took that solemn obligation, pledged to be there for our Brethren. Not just in the Lodge room, not just in good times, but always. And tonight, I ask you to reflect: Are we living that promise?

Because the world is watching to see if our words mean anything. It is watching to see if good men still exist. It is watching to see if there remains a band of Brothers who will cross district lines, jurisdictional boundaries, and personal hardship to be what we claim to be: Masons.

Look around you. This Lodge, this fraternity, is made up of men who hold the power to influence their communities, not through might, but through moral leadership. We have no sirens, no badges, no titles that will make people stop in their tracks. What we do have is far more powerful: the trust of each other and the commitment to walk beside our Brethren in light and darkness alike.

My Brethren, let me be clear: the world needs Freemasonry. It needs men who will keep their word. It needs men who will rise from their own sorrow to comfort another. It needs men who do the right thing, even when no one is watching, even when no one will say thank you.

The world needs us. Not for our regalia, or our rituals, or our buildings, but for our brotherhood. Our real brotherhood. The kind that sits with a dying man because he is family. The kind that answers the call, not for glory, but because it is right.

So tonight, I challenge each of you: Be that kind of Mason. Let us not be satisfied with words alone. Let us act. Let us serve. Let us respond.

In the years ahead, may we look back on our time together and say, not that we were members of a lodge, but that we were Brothers in the truest sense. That we were first responders to the silent emergencies of the soul. That we were there when it mattered.

Let this be our legacy: that when a call goes out in the dead of night, when a Brother is alone and afraid, when the final hour draws near, we show up.

And in those moments, when no one else is watching, when no one else would even know, we earn a title not given lightly, but proven by action:

The Masonic First Responder. Always there, always ready. Because THAT is what we do. Not with lights and sirens, but with presence, with commitment, and with love. We respond, not for recognition, but because a Brother is in need. And that is enough.

So, I leave you with this, my Brethren:

When the call comes, quiet and unannounced, will you answer?

Because we must. Because that is who we are. More importantly, that is who the world so desperately needs us to be.

Let us be ready.

Let us be willing.

Let us be Masons.

### Addendum - Ottawa District One By-Laws 2024-25

### Ottawa District 1 By-laws

#### **Preface**

Beneath our lofty ideals there has to be an organization system that supports, guides and trains members, enacts rules to control their interaction with one another and raises funds to pay accounts.

Our highest governing body is the Grand Lodge Ancient Free and Accepted Masons (A.F. & A.M.) of Canada, in the Province of Ontario and within the governance of that jurisdiction, specific regulations are enacted by each constituent lodge to control the actions of members and set out the duties of officers and responsibilities of certain committees. These regulations and subsequent proposed amendments thereto must be in harmony with the Constitution of our Grand Lodge, and duly approved by that Grand body, before they become authorized for enforcement.

Ottawa District 1 was formed as a result of the mutually agreed division of the Ottawa District, which was done to decrease the number of constituent lodges from thirty to a more manageable number of fifteen for each of the newly formed districts. Thus, from one Ottawa District, there emerged two separate and distinct districts known as Masonic Districts Ottawa 1 and Ottawa 2; each containing fifteen constituent lodges. The name, number, meeting location and year of Institution of each constituent lodge of Ottawa District 1 is as follows:

#### **Preamble**

For the purpose of securing order and regularity, and with the view of promoting harmony and decorum, the brethren of the constituent lodges of Ottawa District 1 on the register of the Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario, enact and agree to these By-laws.

Ottawa District 1 By-laws

ARTICLE I - IDENTIFICATION

Section 1 - Name

This district shall be known by the name of Ottawa District 1 on the register of the Grand Lodge A.F.&A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario and embraces the constituent lodges with meeting locations as indicated in the aforementioned listing.

ARTICLE II - DUTY TO GRAND LODGE

This district acknowledges the supremacy of the Grand Lodge of A.F.&A.M. of Canada in the Province of Ontario.

**ARTICLE III - MEETINGS** 

Section 1 - Regular Meetings

Regular district meetings chaired by the District Deputy Grand Master or the Immediate Past DDGM, in his absence, shall normally be held as follows:

a) Within the district; as noted in the District Trestle Board in a place specified by the DDGM

Section 2 - Emergent Meetings

Emergent meetings may be held at the call of Grand Lodge or DDGM for just and lawful reason(s) and upon proper and reasonable notification.

Section 3 - Attendance

Attendance at district meetings is open to all brethren, in good standing, of district constituent lodges and others by invitation or permission of the DDGM. All attendees must sign the register.

Section 4 - Voting

Voting shall proceed as follows:

a) Voting on motions shall be by a show of hands, or at the discretion of the DDGM in the case of an

objection to a show of hands...

- b) Those entitled to vote are Masters, Past Masters and Wardens.
- c)
- d) Scrutineers shall be appointed by the DDGM at his discretion, and they shall report their findings to

him.

ARTICLE IV - ELECTIONS & APPOINTMENTS Section 1 - District Deputy Grand Master

The DDGM shall be elected by electronic ballot and installed at the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge.

Section 2 - District Secretary

This is a position of Past Master rank and appointed by the DDGM. The tour of duty is for the same tenure as the DDGM.

Section 3 - District Chaplain

A chaplain for the district shall be appointed by the DDGM, to act during the DDGM's term of office.

Section 4 - District Historian

A historian for the district shall be appointed by the DDGM, to act during the DDGM's term of office.

Section 5 - District Financial Examiners

Two financial examiners from the district lodge membership, shall be appointed by the DDGM to act during his term of office. Financial Examiners cannot serve more than two consecutive terms unless at the discretion of the DDGM.

ARTICLE V - DISTRICT COMMITTEES

Section 1 - General

The district depends on its committees to perform many necessary and advantageous functions. This helps to ensure that the work of the district is spread among the constituent lodge members and the district membership is not required to become involved in detailed discussion and planning. Committees, however, do not have the authority to take action on matters or expend district resources without prior approval of the district membership or DDGM. Each committee will submit semi-annual and annual reports to the DDGM.

Section 2 - Standing Committees

They shall be appointed and assigned duties by the DDGM at his discretion and may consist of but not be limited to the following:

**DUTIES OF DISTRICT OFFICERS** 

Section 1 - District Deputy Grand Master

The powers and duties of the DDGM are outlined in the Constitution of our Grand Lodge. Appendix 'A' to these By-laws outlines the permissible scale of expenditures specified in the Constitution, and further, those approved by Ottawa District l.

Section 2 - District Secretary

His duties, under direction of the DDGM, are as follows:

- a) to maintain the minutes, properly recorded, of all district meetings.
- b) to prepare such correspondence as may be necessary and specified by the DDGM.
- c) to examine the records of the district constituent lodges and report his findings to the DDGM.
- d) to prepare a trestle board for distribution to district lodges to advise them of local district meetings.
- e) to collect monies from the district constituent lodges, on a per capita basis in September and April

and deposit them in the established bank account.

f) to pay all authorized district bills and reimburse the DDGM and his committee chairmen for

approved expenditures.

g) to prepare an audited financial statement covering the past years' accounts and present it at the

annual district meeting in August.

- h) to carry out such other duties as may be detailed by the DDGM.
- i) Serve as a signing authority on any District bank accounts.

Section 3 - District Chaplain

The following duties are inherent to this position:

- a) to arrange, in concert with the DDGM, for one District Divine Service.
- b) to deliver the opening prayer at district meetings, as appropriate.

Section 4 - District Historian

The duties of the historian are:

a) to record and report, in particular, the outstanding events of the district and individual lodges so that

Grand Lodge may be aware of these special occurrences and that the brethren of the future may

know and appreciate the past.

b) to submit reports of outstanding events for inclusion in the Grand Lodge Newsletter and/or Ontario

Mason Magazine.

c) to call upon the constituent lodge historians for advice regarding special happenings which should

be highlighted.

Section 5 - District Financial Examiners

Their duties shall be to audit the District Secretary's financial statement and books covering the past year's accounts

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES OF THE DISTRICT COMMITTEES Section 1 - Long Range Planning Committee

The duties shall include the following:

a) to identify and discuss such subjects (except ritual) which may affect Freemasonry in the Lodge,

District and/or Jurisdiction.

- b) to encourage individual lodges to appoint a long range planning Committee.
- c) to maintain a liaison with the lodges in the district so as to keep informed of issues affecting the

future of Masonry within the district.

d) to maintain a liaison with the Grand Lodge Long Range Planning Committee so as to be informed of

matters under consideration.

e) to make recommendations for the long term benefit of the district.

Section 2 - Benevolence

The duties are:

- a) to ensure that individual lodges are aware of the availability of Masonic Benevolence and Charity.
- b) to attend a meeting of the Ottawa Masonic Board of Relief, when invited.
- c) to convene a meeting of individual lodge chairman/representatives for the purpose of ensuring that

each lodge has the most current knowledge available on this subject.

- d) to assist lodges in the preparation of applications for benevolence or charity.
- e) to encourage lodges to keep in contact with their members who are not able to attend lodge so that

they may be aware of a brother or brother's widow who may be in a situation of distress.

Section 3 - Officer Mentoring

The duties of this committee are:

- a) to implement and monitor the mentor program of Grand Lodge.
- b) to ensure that each lodge has appointed a mentor program chairman.
- c) to be available for presentations, talks, question and answer sessions to lodges upon request.
- d) to convene an annual meeting, early in the Masonic year for the purpose of introducing newly

appointed lodge mentor program chairman and updating reappointed chairman of changes in the mentor program

Section 4 - Education, Etiquette and Protocol

The duties of the Chairman are to provide Masonic Education throughout the district.

Section 5 - District Masonic Instruction Committee

The duties of the Chairman are:

- a) to assist individual lodges in the performance of authorized work and all other rituals and ceremony, and to promote a high standard of Masonic work and ritual in the district.
- b) to encourage individual lodges to appoint a director of the Work.
- c) to convene when requested, lodges of instruction.
- d) to be available to assist at lodge practices, presentations, question and answer sessions as requested

Section 6 - Information Management

The duties of this committee are in liaison with Grand Lodge, provide assistance to the district lodges that are about to or are already utilizing computers in the management of their records.

This committee shall create, oversee and maintain:

- a) The District website.
- b) The District email addresses for the DDGM and District Secretary,
- c) The structure and content of the District information repository.
- d) The District Information Management Policy and supporting procedures

Section 7 - Grand Lodge Programs

The duties of this committee are to:

- a) Implement and monitor the Friend to Friend Program,
- b) Implement and monitor the Brother to Brother Program,
- c) Support and encourage lodges in implementing the Cornerstone Program,
- d) Support any other Grand Lodge Programs as instructed by the DDGM.

Section 8 - By-laws

The duty of this committee is to review suggested amendments and to advise the DDGM as to whether or not they are in good order and proper for presentation to the District for consideration in accordance with Article X of these By-Laws

Section 9 - Regalia Coordinator

The duty of this committee is to maintain care and custody of the district regalia.

Section 10 - District Charity

The duty of this committee is to support and encourage participation in the District Charity selected by the DDGM..

Section 11 - District Communications

The duty of this committee is to: a) ???.

Section 12 - Masonic Foundation

The duties of this representative are:

a) to act as the liaison officer between the Regional Representative/Foundation Director responsible for

District activities and the individual lodges within the District.

- b) to maintain a current listing of Lodge Representatives within the District.
- c) to answer, or obtain answers to questions on the Masonic Foundation raised by members of the

Craft or others in the community, identify problem areas and provide any assistance required by

Lodge Representatives.

d) to maintain regular contact with each lodge in the District to ensure its members are aware of the

foundation's activities and to provide new information of interest to the members.

e) to ensure that the DDGM is aware of Foundation related and other charitable activities happening

within the District.

f) to participate with the DDGM in the presentation of Foundation cheques within the District.

ARTICLE VIII - FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION

Section 1 - Fiscal Year

The district fiscal year shall begin at Grand Lodge and end at Grand Lodge Communication the following year.

Section 2 - Completion of Financial Records

The District Secretary is to complete the financial records for the District for the aforementioned Fiscal Year and provide them to the District Financial Examiners prior to the last day of July to allow for a fulsome review prior to the first District Meeting of the new Fiscal Year.

ARTICLE IX - CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

All discussion at the district meetings is under the superintendence of the DDGM but the following Agenda and Rules of Order should normally be observed along with good parliamentary procedures in actioning motions and conducting the general business in the district.

Section 2 - Agenda

At all district meeting held in the Ottawa area, the following shall normally be the Order of Business, but the DDGM may alter it at his discretion:

- a) Reading the minutes of the last Regular and subsequent Emergent meetings.
- b) Reading of correspondence.
- c) Receiving reports from Committees and Auditors.
- d) General
- i) Old Business.
- ii) New business.

Section 3 - Rules of Order

ARTICLE X -

- a) Brethren shall observe the first call of the DDGM's gavel.
- b) Every brother, when speaking, shall stand up in his place and address himself to the DDGM and no

brother shall speak more than twice on the same question, unless in qualification or explanation, or

as the mover in reply, without permission of the DDGM.

c) Unless with the consent of the DDGM, no Motion or Notice of Motion shall be received unless

previously submitted in writing.

- d) All resolutions, not otherwise provided for in the Constitution or these By-laws, shall be decided by
- a majority of votes; each authorized member present and voting having one vote and the DDGM a

deciding vote, if required.

e) Motions shall be made and seconded, amended if necessary, and duly processed in accordance with

Parliamentary procedures used in the actioning of motions and their amendments.

f) All authorized members present, unless excused by the DDGM, shall cast their vote or ballot when

the question is put to the floor.

g) Points of order decided by the DDGM shall not be debatable

AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

No alteration shall be made to these By-laws unless a Notice of Motion has been duly given at a Regular meeting or an Emergent meeting called therefore, entered in the minutes of the district. District lodges should be duly informed of the notice of motion. Each proposed alteration shall be made in the form of a motion duly seconded, considered and approved by a two-thirds majority of the authorized members present and voting when it shall take effect after having been approved by the Grand Master.

Any sundry required updates to the By-law document, whereas such updates may comprise items such as dates, names of past DDGMs or other details subject to change year over year be henceforth made as required, without need of further motion for amendment, and that the document be reviewed for grammatical and typographical errors at each revision and such corrections be made as a matter of course.

**ARTICLE XI - DISTRIBUTION** 

Every lodge which is, or on becoming, a member of this district and the DDGM and his Committee shall receive a copy of the District By-laws.

Appendix A - Scale of Expenditures - DDGM

The following list of expenditures further qualifies those authorized in the Constitution, and may be used as a guideline in Ottawa District 1:

- 1) Procurement of the dress regalia of his office and a club bag for the DDGM; and, procurement of the dress regalia of his office and a club bag for the District Secretary, following his Grand Lodge appointment.
- 2) Payment of traveling expenses to the extent of at least one official visit in his year of office to each lodge in the district, at a rate to be determined by the District advisory committee, (return distance from his residence to the location being visited as determined by a routing calculation via Google Maps.)
- 3) An allotment of up to \$1,800 to the newly elected DDGM to offset the cost of the renting of a hospitality suite at the Grand Lodge location. This allotment is for rent only and is not for supplying refreshments or to be leveraged for an event in the district post Grand Lodge.
- 4) Such other expenses necessary to the discharge of the duties of his office, including but not restricted to:
- a) Letterhead paper and envelopes.
- b) Postage.
- c) Photocopying or printing of documents.
- d) Cellular charges relating to the duties of his office.
- e) District Divine Service.
- f) Bank Service Charges.
- g) District Business Meetings.
- h) District Secretary afforded a mileage allowance based on the Federal Treasury Board Ontario rate when traveling separately from the DDGM to the official visits of each lodge based on a routing calculation via Google Maps.
